The Republic County Governing Board met in regular session on Monday, January 07, 2013 at 8:30 a.m., with Commissioners Linda Holl, Marvin Bergstrom and Frank Rytych present. County Clerk Vickie Hall was also present to record the minutes of the meeting. Kathleen Marsicek monitored the meeting.

Weed Director Mike Nondorf received permission to travel to his district meeting in Salina and told the Board that the new computer program has been installed on his department's computer.

Pastor Kathy Aiello offered the morning prayer.

The Board signed the 2013 Contract between Republic County and Pawnee Mental Health Services. The County has appropriated \$24,500.00 to Pawnee Mental Health.

Dan Eshleman, GSI Glass Services, Inc., Salina, Kansas presented his proposal for the replacement of the Courthouse windows. The Board asked for additional prices and no decision has been made to date.

County Treasurer Cindy Coons noted that there are 61 parcels on the delinquent tax list and indicated that the property taxes are 3 years behind, not counting the current year. Cindy also reminded the Board of the RCD meeting to be held Wednesday, January 9<sup>th</sup>.

Chairman Rytych made a motion to approve the minutes of December 17, 2012. Second by Bergstrom, motion passed 3-0. It should be noted that the commissioners did not meet the week of December 24 and the week of December 31, 2012.

Highway Administrator Scott Finkbiner visited with the Board about road and bridge matters. The Board approved the proposal for the geotechnical services of Kaw Valley Engineering, Inc. (KVE) on KDOT Project No. 79 C-0329-01 for the bridge N.5-16.4 west of Belleville. They will schedule the drilling at each of the proposed piers and abutments, provide laboratory testing services and prepare the report on the 23<sup>rd</sup> Street Bridge.

It was a consensus of the Board to do a resolution in the near future to end the Inter-Local Cooperative Agreement for E-Waste with the Solomon Valley E-Waste Coalition. Republic County does not want to participate in 2014.

At 9:55 a.m., Commissioner Holl made a motion to go into a 20-minute executive session to discuss non-elected personnel with Highway Administrator Scott Finkbiner. Second by Bergstrom, motion passed 3-0. The group extended the executive for an additional 15 minutes. Regular session resumed at 10:30 a.m., with no action taken by the Board.

A Waterline Agreement was approved between Republic County and John Eickman. Permission was granted to operate an underground waterline on certain public road right-of-way at the intersection of 190<sup>th</sup> and Birch, 1-1-3 going on Birch then crossing into 12-1-3 and crossing 190<sup>th</sup> East into 6-1-2.

The Board signed 3 copies of the proposal for Geotechnical Services off System submitted by Kirkhman Michael Engineering Co. for the Off System Bridge #N.5-16.4 west of Belleville, KDOT Project No. 79-C0329-01 where the contractor is going to do core samples.

Mr. Finkbiner informed the Board that he planned to make personnel changes at the Road and Bridge Department in 2013. Nathan Craig will be the new "team leader" for the bridge crew. Justin Novak will be moved to the road supervisor on the west side of the County. Kevin Kopsa was moved from the supervisor or bridge foreman to equipment operator in charge of culvert installation and ditches.

Tom Bennett of The Wilson Group, Greenwood, Missouri gave a presentation and proposal on the Courthouse window project. He was asked for additional prices and no decision has been made to date. Don Bechard, George W. Hays, sat in on Mr. Bennett's presentation.

The Board held a Grievance Hearing for Brad Swanson. Those in attendance were Brad's wife, Kelly Swanson, Jeff Sothers and Brian Freeman. After much discussion the Board informed Mr. Swanson that their original decision would be upheld and he would not be reinstated.

At 11:54 a.m., Commissioner Bergstrom made a motion to go into a 5 minute executive session to discuss non-elected personnel. Second by Holl, motion passed 3-0. An additional 2 minutes were added and regular session resumed at 12:01 p.m. with no action taken by the Board.

Commissioner Holl made a motion to adjourn. Second by Rytych, motion passed 3-0.

The next regular meeting will be held on Monday, January 14, 2013, Courthouse, Belleville. The swearing in ceremony for newly elected officials will be held at 8:30 a.m. in the courtroom.

The Republic County Governing Board Met in regular session on Monday, January 14, 2013 at 9:30 am following the swearing in of newly elected officials in the District Courtroom followed by a reception in the commissioner board room. Commissioners present Linda Holl and Marvin Bergstrom. County Clerk Kathleen Marsicek was also present to record the minutes of the meeting. Debbie Hadachek monitored the meeting.

Pastor Mark Imel offered Morning Prayer.

Arlene Clayton visited with the board about the lack of recycling among some of the Belleville residents.

Kay Shoemaker, RCD, presented the board with her bi-annual report for signature along with reports of two mortgage loans being paid off. One being Jan and Mark Geiber, Mainstreet Liquor and the other Richard Schintler, Mr. Schintler paid his loan off early.

Absent Commissioner Chairman Frank Rytych called and made a motion per phone to nominate Linda Holl as the 2013 Chairperson of Commissioners, Marvin 2<sup>nd</sup> motion carried 3-0.

Sheriff Ron Blad presented a concern about all the cell towers that are now in the county and wonder if a resolution could be made. Chairman Holl explained that unless we had zoning control in those areas a resolution was not a solution.

Beth Reed discussed that the contract for the copier in her office will run out in April and the company stated they will not be carrying repairs for it after that time. It was decided to let the contract run out and order supplies as needed as long as the copier was in good working order.

Highway Administrator Scott Finkbiner visited with Board about hourly wages of two employees just to confirm they were correct. He also asked if the Board would approve boot allowance for rubber steel toed boots for winter. The contracts for the employees say the county will pay up to \$150 for one (1) pair of boots per year if needed and they must purchase them in Republic County.

Discussion was held on the dollar value of inventory coverage in the warehouse; Mr. Finkbiner feels there needs to be an increase in the value so he will get an update inventory to present to the board.

The road and bridge department will be starting work on the bridge on Union between 220 and 230.

Administrator Finkbiner stated there are 11 bridges that they will be scouring to get back in compliance with road and bridge recommendations. Scott asked how to dispose of creosote posts that are unusable and board suggested he contact the County Attorney Marlea James.

At 10:24 a.m., Chairman Holl made a motion to go in to 5 minute executive session to discuss non-elected personnel with Highway Administrator Finkbiner. Second by Bergstrom, motion passed 2-0. The group took an extra 3 minutes. Regular session resumed 10:32 a.m., with no action taken by the board.

Administrator Finkbiner asked if he could request some quotes for metal cutter and the board agreed.

Deb Hadachek, after reviewing the minutes from December 17 commissioners meeting asked why a certain department was not given raises. Chairman Holl explained it was for budgetary reasons in that department.

Don Danielson asked the Board to reconsider the cleaning up of a road 1 mile north of Stoney point that they had declined before. He stated the electric company was going to be putting up new poles on that road. The Commissioners agreed to meet with Highway Administrator Finkbiner when the weather warms up and revisit the road in question and they would let Mr. Danielson know their decision.

Kevin Calkins presented an updated bid for the window project which Glass Services will charge \$35 per window more for putting grids in. If Glass services receive the bid, they will bring a copy of original window design before they start work. The new bid would now become \$158,657 instead of 156,312. Kevin also stated a revised bid for Wilson Group would be \$185,807 instead of \$197,502. We are now comparing like windows from both companies. No action was taken this week since commissioner Rytych was absent. The funds for these windows will have to be reviewed with the clerks' office as the budgeted amount for the windows for 2013 will not cover either bid however there are general outlay funds that can offset the difference.

Kathy Calkins reminded the Commissioners the money spent needs be in the best interest of the taxpayers and if the county can keep utility records comparing the before and after the windows are replaced or repaired the taxpayers will have facts.

Eugene Wilson from AT&T came before the Board stating our county's contract for phone service will be renewable June 13 and he would like a chance to review our services and billing for the last year to see if he can save Republic County any money on our phone services. He requested the board sign a consulting agreement to allow him to get this information. Chairman Holl informed Mr. Wilson, she would like to wait to make that decision when all the commissioners could review the information and they would send Mr. Wilson their decision.

County Attorney Marlea James presented the Board members with her response to the salary that was proposed.

The Republic County Governing Board met in regular session on Monday, January 21, 2013 at 8:30 am. Commissioners present Linda Holl, Frank Rytych and Marvin Bergstrom. County Clerk Kathleen Marsicek was also present to record the minutes of the meeting. Debbie Hadachek and Kathy Calkins monitored the meeting.

Pastor Roger Walls offered Morning Prayer.

Treasurer Coons and County Attorney James presented the Board with a list of delinquent taxpayers that should be contacted about becoming current with property taxes or be placed on a sheriff sale. The actual amount of taxes owed is \$157,648.34 before penalty and \$189,751.69 after penalty. The Board requested Coons and James to send one last letter to each taxpayer giving 60 days to become current before further action is taken.

Treasurer Coons requested permission to travel Feb 6-8 to County Treasurer training. Permission granted.

Health dept administrator Marcia Hansen presented an amendment to the agreement between Republic County Health Department and Kansas Department of Health and Environment agreeing to perform all tasks required in the 2012-2013 Public Health Emergency Preparedness local Health Department Work Plan for signature for their files.

The Health Department is in the process of purchasing a Biomedical refrigerator to store vaccines as required by the State Health Department, price could be up to \$3500.00 and needs to be installed and running by March 1, 2013.

Administrator Hansen expressed a big thank you to the county for providing the defensive driving course held with the Road and Bridge department in December. Her department felt it was very beneficial.

Hansen expressed her concern with the negative press she has received about her department not receiving any merit raises for 2013 because of budget shortfalls. Her department is very hard working and will work on the issues presented. Services provided by her department during 2012 include administering 361 Flu shots, actually ran out of vaccine and had to reorder more vaccine and has 30 more scheduled before the end of the month, 3612 immunizations to children, participated in a Bio-Terrorism exercise in October that was well received.

New County Clerk Marsicek asked permission to travel to two training sessions, 1) Homestead and Senior Food Tax on January 16, 2013, 2) New Clerks training in Topeka February 7-8, 2013. Permission granted.

Custodian Calkins along with representatives from Glass Services stated they could have a mock window sample to the courthouse for review before the final decision on the window project. Once the Board has approved the sample, Glass Services, if the company chosen, will send a project contract for signature and materials will be ordered with the understanding there will be invoices presented monthly as work is started. The Board will send a picture of the mock window to the Historical Society to assure them that the looks of the new windows will be as close as possible to the original windows in the courthouse to preserve the historical look. Chairman Holl confirmed the construction company would have to be bonded to work on this project and they will provide that.

Highway administrator Scott Finkbiner presented a quote from S&P Farm Supply for Plasma Cutter for \$3419.92.

Commissioner Holl made the motion to purchase from S&P, Bergstrom 2<sup>nd</sup>, passed 3-0.

Finkbiner has received prices from NCK Feed and Seed of Scandia and Town and Country in Belleville for the rubberized steel toed boots and if the Highway personnel want to purchase the boots it was approved to do so through Town and Country for \$77.50.

Finkbiner asked the board about sending out bid requests for tires and fuel for 2013. The Board expressed that <u>all</u> companies with Republic County that sell those products be contacted for bids. Scott will also be sending out bids for asphalt for summer projects.

Finkbiner reported he had received the list of all Republic County employees from the clerks' office so he can move forward with the random testing program.

He also informed the Board that Justin Novak accepted the position as Road Grader Supervisor of the western Republic County and his performance will be reviewed in 6 months since there was concern about him living in the eastern part of the county instead of the western.

The Board signed the memorandum agreements between City of Scandia, City of Cuba regarding the collection and solid waste fees.

Leah Krotz, director of Belleville City Library, presented her 2012 library report regarding usage of the facility to include book checkout, Audiovisual materials and misc services they provide. There has been a steady increase of use of these services and she encourages all to stop by and check them out. Krotz then introduced Judy Uphoff to discuss what services she helps provide to the county and the concern that the program that currently reimburses her of her services will be ending in a couple of months. Uphoff helps anyone that requests assistance filling programs on the computer and in paperwork regarding government programs such as Food Stamps, Unemployment, Medicare part D, and other medical programs. She is trained to assist persons to review their policies to make sure needed services are covered at a premium that the person can afford. Deb Hadachek mentioned that Judy visit with the Ministerial Alliance and Republic County Resource Council since together those groups are looking at a new program to train persons to Bridge out of Poverty and become self supporting.

Sheriff Blad presented the Board with a bid for 2013 Chevrolet pickup 5.3 Liter from Melton Motors for \$28,408.11 and Highway Patrol Partners for \$25,496.99 for 4.8 liter, the Board felt the Melton Motor vehicle met our needs better to replace a patrol car that is not running correctly. Commissioner Rytych made motion to accept the bid from Melton Motor, Chairman Holl 2<sup>nd</sup>, all agreed 3-0.

John Forshee, director of River Valley District K-State Research and Extension called to explain the extension department would be putting in their own phone service and would be returning the phones they currently use on our system. It will benefit them so they could transfer calls between their offices for better service.

Commission Bergstrom motioned to accept the minutes presented from the January 14 commissioner meeting, Chairman Holl 2<sup>nd</sup>, passed 3-0.

Commissioner Rytych motioned for adjournment, Chairman Holl 2<sup>nd</sup>, agreed 3-0.

The Republic County Governing Board met in regular session on Monday, January 28, 2013 at 8:30 am. Commissioners present Linda Holl, Frank Rytych and Marvin Bergstrom. County Clerk Kathleen Marsicek was also present to record the minutes of the meeting.

Pastor Emily Meckley, UMC Belleville offered Morning Prayer.

Weed director Mike Nondorf presented his annual report for signatures. He stated the road and bridge department would be interested in his old pickup when the new truck arrives. He asked what value should be transferred and the Board stated to use the Kelly Blue book value.

Register of Deeds, Peggy Frint, presented her year-end report showing 1249 documents were processed through her office including 197 mortgages. Total fees collected \$104,016.69. Frint then requested permission to travel to Register of Deeds training in Newton on February 5-8. Permission granted and she will drive her own vehicle.

County treasurer Cindy Coons asked permission to drive her car to the treasurer training to be held in Topeka. Permission granted.

County clerk, Kathleen Marsicek, stated it had been brought to her attention that some counties send UNAPPROVED minutes to newspapers and radio stations the same week as the commissioners meetings are held but with a disclaimer that they are unapproved, in the past Republic County had sent a brief account of the minutes to the news media but there was not a disclaimer attached. The Board agreed to send full set of minutes to the media with the disclaimer "UNAPPROVED MINUTES" instead of the brief account as in the past.

District Court clerk, Kris Kling visited with the Board about improvements of equipment needed in the courtroom to meet state regulations. Her department has already purchased a new recorder valued at \$5000 and stated new computer monitor/TV is optional but she would highly recommend the purchase since it will tie closely to other county courtrooms and would help illuminate the need for transported prisoners to another city it could all be done with web networking and Polycom. The Board wants Kling to get acquire bid information on the computer and TV before they make any decisions purchase this equipment out of general funds and they will give her a decision in a couple of weeks.

The District court also has purchased a new copier and will keep the old copier since the vendor will not offer any trade-in value. Kris will visit with Republic county departments as to the need of a copier and if not she will advertise it for sale.

RCDC Treasurer Kay Shoemaker, presented two friendly reminder letters for the Board to sign requesting loan payments.

Mandy Fincham from NCRP appeared before the Board in Public Hearing for Fire District #3-Narka Rural Fire Department. Narka Fire Department is applying for a grant to help build a new fire station located in Narka. She has received most of the information need to complete the application from county personnel but the Narka Fire Department still has not receive the required number of surveys to be compliant with the application. Closing date for the application is February 15 for the 1<sup>st</sup> round of approval. There could be up to \$22,000 in total fees possible, however if the county will agree to keep the requested application and authorization on file NCRP possibly would pay the fees. The county clerk will gather the information missing so county's part will be complete. Mandy will let the Board know when or if the application has been fully received.

Highway administrator, Scott Finkbiner, discussed the new county inventory list of property that he feels should be on the insurance. He stated that currently the county has \$25,000 in non-mobile equipment and feels it should be at least \$45,000. Finkbiner reviewed the building coverage on shop with our insurance agent and feels it to should be increased. Finkbiner and the county clerk will review all insurance valuations for building, vehicles and inventory prior to paying the insurance premium.

Finkbiner stated he had received a bid sheet from Shaun's tire on the recap tires but no others at this time.

Finkbiner presented contracts for refuse use from the cities of Agenda and Munden.

Bid sheets will be mailed to all the fuel vendors in Republic county to supply the entire county of its fuel needs for 2013. Commission Bergstrom stated that some vendors may not want to lock in a whole year but rather bid quarterly and for Finkbiner to take that into consideration.

Administrator Finkbiner said Rolling Hills would like to use the old mixing strip on US 36 to store poles while they are replacing the many needed power poles of Republic County. The Board agreed to allow this at no charge.

Finkbiner asked continued permission for county employees to use county equipment with understanding any damage occurring will be the responsibly of the employee. The Board recommended Finkbiner keep a list of equipment checked out and back in and any damage if occurred.

Finkbiner has sent out bid sheets for asphalt to Hall Brothers and High Plains and will report back and bids received.

At 10:30 am, the Board along with the county clerk and road administrator drove to the intersection of 140 road and Valley to meet with Don Danielson, Troy Carlgren and Leroy Jeardoe to re-evaluate a request for the county to make road improvements by clearing trees and moving dirt from the ditches to the road to raise it for easier accessibility. The owners on both sides of the road agree to remove the current fences if the county will agree to the project. Upon return to the board office Chairman Holl made a motion that the road and bridge department work with the land owners to clear the trees and move the dirt but only as far east as the box culvert on the north side of the road. Commission Bergstrom 2<sup>nd</sup>, agreed 3-0.

Emergency preparedness director Raymond Raney asked permission to travel to training seminar, granted.

Raney stated he has an employee whom has been ill for two days but has not completed their 180 day probationary time to collect sick leave but wondered if the board would allow them to use the accrued sick leave. The Board reviewed the handbook and it states that until the 180 days have passed no vacation or sick leave may be used, however, they will review this policy for possible updating since no one knows when they will be ill during the first 180 days of employment.

Commissioner Bergstrom motioned the minutes from January 21st be approved, Holl 2nd. Agreed 3-0.

Treasurer Coons asked the Board if it would be possible for her office to be painted this summer since Republic County will be hosting the fall Kansas meeting and it had been 11 years since it had been painted. The Board requested she get with the custodian and work out details.

Commissioner Rytych move meeting adjourn, Chairman Holl 2<sup>nd</sup>, carried 3-0.

Commissioners Rytych and Holl will attend the Hospital board meeting at noon.

The Republic County Governing Board met in regular session on Monday, February 4, 2013 at 8:30 am. Commissioners present Linda Holl, Frank Rytych and Marvin Bergstrom. County Clerk Kathleen Marsicek was also present to record the minutes of the meeting.

Presbyterian Lay Pastor Kathleen Marsicek, offered Morning Prayer.

Commissioner Bergstrom motioned the minutes from January 28th be approved, Holl 2<sup>nd</sup>. Agreed 3-0.

Raymond Raney, Emergency preparedness, discussed with the Board the possibility of purchasing 250 weather alerts through a grant from the state (the state paying 75% of total cost) and selling to Republic County residents for a small fee to offset 25% total cost. Each family would pay approximately \$6.75. The price per unit was based on the bid from a manufacturer, Midland Radio Corporation, out of Kansas City, MO. This company is giving the state a special rate for this program. The Board requested that Raney research the cost of purchasing the weather alerts locally before they make any decision.

County Appraiser, Barry Porter, presented a revised procedure involving the Neighborhood Revitalization Program requesting a subparagraph being removed stated "NR application not filed within the applicable time period set out above will be subject to a \$50 late filing fee in addition to the \$100 application fee. Applications may not be files more than 60 days after the start date of a project."

This would mean there would no longer be a late fee but anyone wanting to apply for NRP would need to file the application form within 30 days of the issuance of the building permit to qualify. Porter requested, all applications go through the appraisers' office and no longer through the clerks' office. The clerk would still fill out the portion of the application regarding the current property tax but all the open applications would be held and updated in the appraisers' office.

Chairman Holl motioned to approve the changes to the program application instructions and that the files will now be maintained in the appraisers department. Bergstrom 2<sup>nd</sup>, agreed.

Appraiser Porter voiced a concern about county residents building or tearing down old buildings on their property and not applying for proper permits. He suggested a small fee (\$10) be assessed on all buildings built and if the resident is putting up a large building that might qualify for the Neighborhood Revitalization program that they apply. It would be to the residents benefit to receive the discount property evaluation.

Kay Shoemaker, treasurer for RCDC reminded the Board there will be a meeting Wednesday evening to review one application that has been received.

Peggy Frint, Register of Deeds, reported she is having computer trouble and asked permission to purchase either one or two new computers for her department. The funds are available in her technology fund account. Commissioner Bergstrom made the motion to for Frint to purchase two computers, Holl 2<sup>nd</sup> and agreed 3-0.

Republic county resident, Debbie Hadachek, stated during the open forum that she did not agree with the salary that was offered to the new county clerk. She felt that the Republic county taxpayers elected the new clerk with the understanding the clerk would be receiving the same pay as the current clerk was receiving. Hadachek explained the position was an elected position not an appointed position. The new clerk has work experience although not in the county clerks' office. She also reminded the Board that when they each were elected to their positions as commissioners they did not take a pay cut until they had acquired the necessary knowledge to their positions. The Board explained they had visited with other county commissioners on this subject and felt they made a fair salary offer until the new clerk's

knowledge of the position deems the pay increase but they would thank Hadachek for her opinion on the matter.

Sherry Koster, Environmental Planning Group, and Marcia Hansen, County Health Nurse, presented the July to December report. Republic County brought in \$24,696.40 during this time and after expenses there was gain of \$1462.13 so no reserve funds were needed. The invoice for this time period will be mailed this week and will be due in Smith Center in April. She invited the Board to attend the next LEPG meeting that will be held in Beloit, February 25 following a luncheon at the Plum Creek room at noon. There should be cost share funds available sometime in April or May that would be effective 2014.

County Clerk, Marsicek asked permission to travel to Salina on February 13 with deputy clerk Loring to a seminar on Healthcare Reform. Permission granted.

EMS employees, Jerid Dusek and Blain Van Meter, presented requested to travel to training sessions in Desoto. Permission granted.

Board signed the agreement between Republic County and the City of Belleville regarding the solid waste fees and collection.

Highway administrator, Scott Finkbiner stated the insurance company needs to come out and re-evaluate all the buildings that are insured to assure the county they are properly insured. He stated his secretary is finalizing the information regarding the random drug testing for all Republic County employees since she now has all the necessary information on all employees.

Commissioner Bergstrom asked Finkbiner what his plans were regarding all the missing 911 road signs. Scott said his road crews are instructed to keep track of where signs are missing and he will present a list to Raymond Raney.

Finkbiner is still awaiting the tire and asphalt bids but should have a report soon.

10:18 am Chairman Holl moved the Board and Finkbiner go into executive session to discuss non-elected personnel. Bergstrom 2<sup>nd</sup>. Agreed.

10:28 am Board reconvened having taken to action.

Finkbiner stated the county would visit with Raymond Kuhlmann and set up a starting date to but the tubes in the road.

Chairman Holl expressed second thoughts about Resolution 2012-30, in which the salary of the new Republic County Clerk was decreased from the past clerks salary just because the new clerk had never worked in the courthouse or clerk department. Holl feels the Board originally was acting with the best interest of the county when they wrote the resolution. Holl explained her stand by stating when the other two commissioners started their jobs as commissioners (elected positions with stated wages of \$12000), she had many years of experience on the Board and they had none but they were offered the same amount of wages as her. Holl asked the new clerk to research if the Kansas Congress newly elected get paid the same as the outgoing persons in those departments and to report back at the next commissioners meeting. Bergstrom feels strongly the correct action was taken in the resolution and Rytych would like to give this matter more thought before any action is taken.

Luke Mahin, Neal Lewis and Mike Hadachek came before the Board to present their proposal of the land exchange for the economic Development area on Frontage road. After discussion of the 5 options,

proposal #5 was agreed to be the requested proposal for Campbell and Johnson to stake out on the said land.

Luke stated he had contacted Tim Gottschalk to work with the Economic Development group to draw up the contract regarding the ROZ Fundraising program with Republic County and would like the county to be the contact. Funds for the program need to be processed through the county instead of the Economic Development. Mahin said there are already three companies ready to donate to this fundraiser to help offset this program once it is implemented.

Kevin Calkins, county custodian along with Kathy Calkins delivered the sample window produced by Glass Services of Salina, KS for the Boards' approval before windows could be ordered and replacement work begun. Commissioner Bergstrom moved to accept the sample window as the approved windows for the courthouse, Rytych 2<sup>nd</sup> and agreed. Calkins will contact Glass Services and the other bidding companies regarding the decision. Kathy will contact Glass Services regarding the contract and additional statements needed regarding bonding and any additional charges. She will also contact the Historical society of the decision.

Kevin stated the repairs to the elevator last week are complete and the total invoices are not available yet but ThyssenKrupp share will be \$7200.00.

Commissioner Rytych move meeting adjourn, Chairman Holl 2<sup>nd</sup>, carried 3-0.

The Republic County Governing Board met in regular session on Monday, February 11, 2013 at 8:30 am. Commissioners present Linda Holl, Frank Rytych and Marvin Bergstrom. County Clerk Kathleen Marsicek was also present to record the minutes of the meeting. Also in attendance: Debbie Hadachek, Luke Mahin, Mikel Hadachek.

Pastor Kathy Aeillo, United Methodist Church, offered Morning Prayer.

Chairman Holl called the meeting order.

Commissioner Rytych motioned the minutes from February 4th be approved, Bergstrom 2<sup>nd</sup>. Agreed 3-0.

Republic County Board of Commissioners instructed the clerk to notify Sherry Koster of the Smith County Health Department that no one from the Board will be attending the 4 County Commission Meeting February 25.

Permission to travel was granted for Kathy Zack to KHCA Spring Conference in Manhattan on March 6-7 and Mike Nondorf to attend the District meeting in Abilene on February 14, 2013.

Sheriff Blad asked the commissioners if they were planning to send Republic county prisoners to the new Cloud County jail when it was completed. The Board assured Blad that Republic county prisoners will remain in Republic County.

Blad announced the dismissal of Sarah Hoselton as of February 3 on grounds of violating the standards of conduct in his department.

Chairman Holl requested Treasurer Coons join the meeting to review vouchers to the Appraisers department for postage on the property tax forms. Coons stated that since the Appraisers office and Solid waste were "stand alone" budgets they were invoiced for postage used. After discussion, the vouchers will be used for 2013 but starting in 2014 ALL postage for courthouse mail will be paid out of general funds therefore the "stand alone" budgets will NOT have a line item in their budgets.

Highway Administrator Scott Finkbiner shared with the Board he had contacted KCAMP-our insurance carrier about the increased values he is requesting and they will supply a quote. Finkbiner suggested that we trade our chipper (valued \$4,000-6,000) for usable equipment the next time a new piece of equip should be needed if the vendor would allow trading. The chipper is seldom used.

The Board signed an agreement between Republic County and Kansas Department of Transportation in regards to KA-2115-01, a bridge replacement project. The Secretary desires to detour traffic from State Highway No. K-266 onto the County roads described below: Junction of US-36 and 30<sup>th</sup> Road and proceed six (6) miles north to Jade Road, then proceed two (2) miles east on Jade Road to K-266 (the "Detour Route"). The County agrees to allow the Secretary to detour State Highway No. K266 traffic onto the Detour Route during prosecution of the project and accept the compensation identified in Article 1, paragraph 1 for up to \$36,000.

Finkbiner stated KDOT will be creating detours in October for work at 170 Rd and US Hwy 36. Another detour being created in October will be for work between county road 60 and 70 on US Hwy 36.

Finkbiner asked for clarification on the Nepotism in the handbook since there is a possibility an employees' relative applying for a position. It states immediate family but does not state specifics-the proposed new handbook proof was reviewed for clarification but did not list 1<sup>st</sup> cousin in the listing so 1<sup>st</sup> cousin will be added when the new handbook will be approved later this spring. The Board advised

Finkbiner to follow through with the application and interview processes as normal and if the applicant is qualified they will review the relativity of the employees.

Finkbiner stated he should have the tire bids available for review on Tuesday next week.

Luke Mahin and Mikel Hadachek present the Board with the Foundation agreement for ROZ for signing. The Board signed the agreement but since the Economic Development contractor has not signed, Luke will acquire that signature and send a copy of the agreement to the county clerk for filing. Mahin shared there are donors waiting to contribute to the ROZ fund and as soon as there is \$1500 and matching donor will make a contribution.

Hadachek said the economic development group would allow for an 80' easement on the west side of the land that is being traded to Republic County in Freedom Township, Section 34,Range 3. Luke would be contacting Campbell and Johnson to have deeds drawn up and ready for signature next week

Chairman Holl motioned to table any action until the next commissioner meeting, Bergstrom 2<sup>nd</sup>, agreed.

Mikel Hadachek and Kay Shoemaker present a RCD loan application for consideration.

Chairman Holl made a motion to accept the loan application from Tami VanSant dba TamiCakes for \$33,600 to come out of original loan funds.

Commissioner Rytych made motion, employees can use sick leave as earned not waiting for the 180 days (6 months) probationary time. No one knows when they will be sick. Bergstrom 2<sup>nd</sup>, agreed 3-0. The clerk will make the changes to the new proposed handbook.

Chairman Holl motioned the Emergency preparedness supervisor purchase 250 weather radios and offer to the residents of Republic County at the price of \$6.75. Bergstrom 2<sup>nd</sup>, agreed 3-0.

Chairman Holl brought up for discussion of the newly elected County Clerk salary for review. She feels the Board originally thought they presented a proper salary but after reviewing statements voiced last week by Republic County citizen Debbie Hadachek, maybe the action should be modified. She stated the clerk registered for a position under the assumption the wages would be what the current clerk (\$35,000) was paid not at the decreased rate of \$27,500. Commissioner Bergstrom commented some county residents and visited with him in regards to this matter so he relayed his concern about hiring someone totally new with no experience at the same pay rate as the outgoing clerk. He stated as a businessman I never pay a newly hired employee the same as someone who has been working for me for years, however, as knowledge increases so does the wage. Bergstrom said he would be willing offer ½ of the difference in 3 months and the other ½ in 6 months. Commissioner Rytych stated citizens had discussed the matter with him also and thought ¼ of the difference each quarter until the total sum was met. Commissioner Holl felt the right thing to do was to offer the complete salary because if the candidate had paid the registration filing fee it would have been 1% of the currents clerk's salary.

County Clerk Marsicek, stated she would appreciate whatever they offered but mentioned when the position of the accounts payable became vacant in the clerks' office she offered to fill that position herself instead of hiring a new person and paying them fulltime wages.

After discussion about how to prevent this type of misunderstanding occurring after future elections research will be done by the clerk to accommodate proper documentation. Commissioner Rytych made a motion to rescind Resolution 2012-30 and increase the county clerk's wages back to the original wages

(\$35,000) the outgoing clerk was being paid retroactive to the new clerks starting day of January 14, 2013. Chairman Holl 2<sup>nd</sup>, agreed 3-0.

Kathy Calkins stated she had contacted the Historical Society about the Boards' decision on the window project. Katrina Ringler requested a letter from the Board stating our intentions along with repaying the origination fees of the loan totaling \$4191.93.

Commissioner Rytych move meeting adjourn, Bergstom 2<sup>nd</sup>, carried 3-0.

The Republic County Governing Board met in regular session on Tuesday, February 19, 2013 at 8:30 am. Commissioners present Frank Rytych and Marvin Bergstrom. County Clerk Kathleen Marsicek was also present to record the minutes of the meeting.

Pastor Mark Imel, Central Christian Church, offered Morning Prayer.

Commissioner Bergstrom called the meeting order.

Commissioner Bergstrom motioned the minutes from February 11th be approved, Rytych 2nd. Agreed 2-0.

Permission to travel to training session in Topeka on February 27, 2013 for Debbie Sells, Kathy Zack and Linda Wendt was approved.

Permission to travel to Topeka for Kansas W/C conference on April 1-3, 2013 for Debbie Sells and Karen Henke was approved.

Raymond Raney, Emergency Preparedness director discussed the possibility of his department being responsible for determining late starts or closing of the courthouse instead of the County Clerk and County Treasurer. His department follows the weather for emergency situations and they could determine if road conditions were dangerous for county employees to travel.

Raney said his department could setup a calling log that could be sent to all department heads and employees with his 911 system that would only require one call to let everyone know of the courthouse hours. The health department administrator would be required to contact her staff until their phone numbers were added to the call list. The county deputies will call dispatch to advice of conditions so a decision can be made to submit the necessary information to be sent before 6:00 am. Because of the upcoming snowstorm, this would become a test of the system. Employees, per the handbook, would be required to cover the hours with vacation time or go unpaid if they do not have any vacation time available.

Commissioner Bergstrom made motion to move the responsibility of late starts and/or the closing of the courthouse to the Emergency Preparedness department. Rytych 2<sup>nd</sup>, agreed.

Raymond stated he had ordered and received the weather radios. His department was now cataloging and programming the radios prior to presenting them to the public for purchase. He will distribute a few to each city clerk for the citizens of those towns to purchase. Each household may only purchase one radio and they will be required to fill out a registration sheet and pay \$6.75 per radio. The radios should be available at the city clerk's offices by March.

County Treasurer Coons and Appraiser Porter reported to the Board the current computer system that is used by the treasurer, clerk, register of deeds and appraiser office for accounting and taxes and the regular internet (effects the rest of the courthouse offices) was down for 1 ½ days last week. Porter explained our computer systems have two parts, 1) Pertains to the PC networking-excel, word, internet, etc and 2) AS400 which stores our county records for taxes, accounting and motor vehicle information.

When the system goes down, no one can update the computer files and customers are required to come back when the computer is running. Porter stated the system server is 8 years old and needs replaced hopefully before it completely fails to run. Coons presented the invoice from 2004 when it was purchased showing a value of \$27,734.00. She has contacted Sonny Sagar from Thomson Reuter for a quote on a new server. He emailed an unofficial estimate of \$21,795.00 but would send a detail estimate before next Monday's commissioners meeting. Coons checked the budget and there are funds in the special equipment fund to cover the new server. Coons will present the official quote next week and the commissioners will act on it at that time.

Porter explained the internet problems was a problem with the DVR equipment in the E.P. department. Porter discussed this with Raney and they are requesting that a separate internet serves be purchased for the dispatch/911/E.P. department. Raney said these expenses could come out of 911 funds and would not affect the taxpayers.

Commissioner Rytych motioned a standalone internet be purchased by the dispatch department. Bergstrom 2<sup>nd</sup> carried 2-0.

Commissioner Bergstrom made a motion to amend Resolution 2012-31, which listed the 2013 wages of all county elected officials, to state the salary for County Clerk of \$35,000. Rytych 2<sup>nd</sup> carried 2-0.

Clerk Marsicek stated during the past years the county has held their employee appreciation dinner during March and asked if that is when we want to hold it again this year. She is to work with Beth Reed to proceed with the plans. Board will set the date next week when Chairman Holl would be there.

Highway administrator Scott Finkbiner brought in the sealed bids for tires for the year. Three companies submitted bids-Shaun's Tire, Crouse Tire and Agenda Oil. No decisions were made until Finkbiner compares each bid for the same types of tires.

Commissioner Rytych motioned to table any decisions on the tire contracts until the next meeting when all three commissioners should be in attendance. Bergstrom 2<sup>nd</sup> carried.

Finkbiner discussed some of the tires on the graders have recaps and work well but they do not last as long as new tires. His department tries to recap as many tires as possible.

Commissioner Bergstrom stated he heard very good comments on the work Justin Novak has been doing as the road supervisor in the western part of the county. Finkbiner will pass on the message to Justin.

Finkbiner submitted Narka and Courtland cities trash refuse contract for signing.

Finkbiner notified the Board the older county senior bus has officially been taken out of service and he will be requesting bids on a new bus to replace it.

Finkbiner has visited with Thayne Larson about some ground next to the old mixing strip on US Highway 36 in the event the county would need to expand the area needed mixing asphalt and store equipment IF the balance of the land on US Hwy 81 in the future would be sold to Economic Development.

Finkbiner submitted information about a truck he wanted to bid on through Purple Wave in Manhattan. Commissioner Rytych will be in that area on Wednesday and could stop and look at it.

Finkbiner has interviewed 4 persons for the Operation operator 1 position but has not made a final decision. He stated the bids for asphalt are due February 22 and would be opened at the next commissioner's meeting.

Kevin and Kathy Calkins presented an updated bid and contract for the window project from Glass Services showing a \$10,000 increase because of the increase products, freight and performance Bond, new total \$166,600.00.

Commissioner Rytych moved the new bid be accepted, Bergstrom 2<sup>nd</sup> agreed.

Commissioner Rytych had been asked if citizens wanted to make a donation toward a window in honor or memory of someone could they donate and be recognized in some manner. He asked Kathy Calkins to look in to this matter and report back at the next meeting. He called it ADOPT A WINDOW.

County Health Administrator Marcia Hansen asked permission to move forward and purchase a new refrigerator that meets the Federal guidelines to store medicine and vaccines. She discussed the type needed with the local businesses and none of them would be able to supply what is needed and she wants to order from Panasonic Refrigerator but it must be paid for before it will ship and the best method is by credit card but the Health department limit is \$1500 and the cost is over \$4100.

Commissioner Rytych move the refrigerator needs purchased and the credit limit on the card increased to cover this one time purchase. Bergstrom 2<sup>nd</sup> agreed. The clerk will contact the credit card company for the increased limit.

Beth Reed asked for permission to dispose of old cell phones and charges that are outdated and usable. The Board suggested they be taken to E-waste.

The Republic County Governing Board met in regular session on Monday, February 25, 2013 at 8:30 am. Commissioners present Linda Holl, Frank Rytych and Marvin Bergstrom. County Clerk Kathleen Marsicek was also present to record the minutes of the meeting.

Pastor Roger Walls, Republic United Methodist Church, offered Morning Prayer.

Chairman Holl called the meeting order.

Commissioner Bergstrom motioned the minutes from February 19th be approved, Rytych 2nd. Agreed 2-0.

Sheriff Blad will be looking for additional people in his department due to vacancies.

Barb Ferguson from Computer Information Concepts presented a software program proposal to replace our current AS400 system that is over 8 years old. CIC is based in Greeley, CO and has been in business for 30 years. There are 22 counties in Kansas that current using this software. Ferguson stated Cloud County started using this program last summer 2012. The software has more functions and is PC based. The base estimate cost \$160,000; however, this can be spread out over 5 years. The first year value would be 10% or \$16,000 which would include a new server and technical support for training through the conversion. The balance would be divided into the next four years. Any upgrades to the system in the future are included as part of the contract.

Board requested a list of all the counties currently using this software. They want to compare our current software to the proposed. Board will contact Ferguson as soon as they make a decision or request a demonstration. Chairman Holl wants our county computer system to run smoothly and with the best affordable system and since we are looking at updating servers it might be time to reevaluate the software.

Melinda Pierson from Belleville Mainstreet and Brett Grauholtz requested use of the Republic County Square on July 6, 2013 to hold the first "AMERICAN AG HERITAGE FESTIVAL". This event will replace the Octoberfest as a county event on the square. The First Annual American Ag Heritage Festival is a celebration of the deep agricultural heritage in Republic County Kansas and Mid-America. Modern equipment and agricultural products will be on display for everyone. There will be a parade early in the day along with activities and food vendors all day and Dance under the stars in the evening.

Chairman Holl motioned to allow this group to use the courthouse square for this event. Bergstrom 2<sup>nd</sup> agreed 3-0.

Terry Cherney informed the Board, he and several others from the road and bridge department were not happy about the deduction for medical coverage just because they were smokers. He explained he and the other employees had acquired the requested amount of wellness points to receive the discount however since they smoked they still were penalized. Cherney feels the smokers are being discriminated against. He asked if the persons that were overweight were being charged because that was a health risk. Chairman Holl informed Cherney the clerk would contact our health provider for answers to these questions for this information would be helpful for all employees to understand.

Highway Administrator Scott Finkbiner presented a lien release for the 1998 Ford 13 Passenger lift equipped van from KDOT stating it can be used as we wish. Finkbiner stated he would research costs to repair and request bids for new van to replace.

Finkbiner has reviewed the tire quotes for like tires and reported the following bids for consideration:

- 1) Shaun's Tire Service high bid \$36,424.90 and lowest \$27,976.50
- 2) Crouse Tire high bid \$38,024.20 and lowest \$30,348.48
- 3) Agenda Oil Company high bid \$29,291.14 (not same tires as other bids) and lowest \$28,197.86.

Commissioner Rytych motioned to accept the bid from Shaun's Tire Service as the overall lowest bid to purchase tires for equipment used in the road department. Bergstrom 2<sup>nd</sup> agreed 3-0.

Sealed bids for asphalt oil were opened at 10:30 am. Four bids were received quoting 115,000 gallons of oil for the coming year delivered to Belleville.

The Republic County Governing Board met in regular session on Monday, March 4, 2013 at 8:30 am. Commissioners present Linda Holl and Marvin Bergstrom. County Clerk Kathleen Marsicek was also present to record the minutes of the meeting.

Chairman Holl called the meeting order.

Pastor Emily Meckley, Belleville United Methodist Church, offered Morning Prayer.

Commissioner Bergstrom motioned the minutes from February 25th be approved, Holl 2nd. Agreed 2-0.

Sheriff Blad informed the Board he had hired Lucas Wiseman to fill one position in his department but is unsure of a start date. Blad had contacted our attorney regarding the employee that is on disability leave regarding termination from his department and was given permission to terminate on the grounds that person can no longer carrier a weapon or perform his duties as an officer.

Emergency Preparedness director Raymond Raney stated the first 250 weather radios have been distributed through the county and he would like permission to order 400 more as there are additional citizens requesting radios.

Chairperson Holl moved Raney purchase an additional 400 radios. Bergstrom 2<sup>nd</sup>, agreed 2-0.

Treasurer Cindy Coons presented a quote from Thomson Reuter for a new server totaling \$23,932.00. Chairperson Holl stated no action will be taken until other quotes can be received and all commissioners can discuss the quotes. Coons suggested before the Board decides on any new software all the department heads that use it have a chance to discuss and test it. She also said our appraiser's office has an enhancement on their system that could be applied to the other departments instead of replacing the entire system.

Scott Kasl delivered several pieces of railroad spikes and iron that he found on his road located between 180 and 190 on Lincoln road. He had a tire that was punctured with one of the spikes. The Board expressed their concern for the debris on his road and would inform the road and bridge administrator to check into the matter. Our graders are supposed to have magnets to draw this type of debris from the rock used on roads. Mr. Finkbiner will contact Mr. Kasl to discuss this matter. The Commissioners stated that this is a road hazard and not county responsibility for any damage.

Roger Novak informed the Board there will be a consignment sale March 23 and if the county has any goods or equipment they want to sell to get a list to him by Thursday March 7<sup>th</sup>.

Custodian Kevin Calkins asked the board if additional parking could be allotted on the east and west sides of the garage by putting down asphalt or concrete. This area is used for parking when snow is being removed from the parking lot. Chairperson Holl stated it was an unnecessary expense at this time.

Road administrator Scott Finkbiner stated he too has found various pieces of debris in the railroad rock but rock overall does more good than harm and his graders usually have a magnet attached when grading however during the winter with the snow removal it is not possible to put the magnets on the machines. He will inform his supervisors to monitor the railroad rock for debris.

Finkbiner presented information from Leland Tice regarding the new signs DOT will be putting up on US 81 near Marble road.

10:30 a.m., sealed bids were opened for mixing asphalt for 2013. Two bids were received.

- 1) Hall Brothers bid \$13.75 per ton
- 2) Hi Plains Sand Inc bid \$9.65 per ton

Chairperson Holl moved the acceptance of Hi Plains Sand, Inc bid of \$9.65 per ton. Bergstrom 2<sup>nd</sup> agreed.

Finkbiner will review his equipment and items in storage for the consignment sale.

Finkbiner ordered one set of carbide blades as a trial use for Mike Wickstrums' grader. He stated the cost is \$97/foot but should last 10 times longer than our regular blades.

Finkbiner received a call from Danielle Strickler, 30<sup>th</sup> road and Xavier asking for a stop sign to be put up at that intersection as she has had several near miss accidents there. Finkbiner will review this intersection for options to make it safer.

Project updates for the road and bridge department included

- 1) The county has started to receive bids on replacing the bridge at Republic.
- 2) This spring road work will be done on the Queen road west of Courtland.
- 3) Permits to repair three more bridges will be requested
- 4) Culvert by Kevin Kuhlman will continue as weather permits.

Finkbiner asked about the health points discount and how long it takes to get back to preferred coverage. The clerk will have an answer for him next week.

Marcia Hansen, Health Administrator presented her application grant for the State of Kansas Health Department in the amount \$33,007.00 for signatures. She shared the new refrigerator used for vaccines and medicine only was delivered on February 28 and is now installed and running.

Luke Mahin and Mike Hadachek along with several of the board members from North Central Kansas Industrial Development Incorporation presented the surveyed map from Johnson and Campbell for the land exchange as discussed to swap 23.32 acres in Section 34 Township 2 Range 3.

Chairperson Holl moved the approval of the exchange of Land in said location to North Central Kansas Industrial Development Incorporation pending the signing of Resolution 2013-17 next week. Bergstrom 2<sup>nd</sup> agreed 2-0.

Chairperson Holl called the meeting order.

Lay Pastor Kathleen Marsicek, Narka Presbyterian Church, offered Morning Prayer.

After amending the March 4, 2013 minutes by adding to the paragraph recognizing Scott Kasls' inquiry about the tire damage when informing road and bridge administrator Scott Finkbiner, the following statement was added. "The commissioners stated the damage was road hazard and not county responsibility". Chairperson Holl moved the minutes from March 4, 2013 be approved as amended. Bergstrom 2<sup>nd</sup> agreed, 2-0.

Permission to travel was approved for Clerk Marsicek and Deputy Loring to the Annual County Clerk's Spring Conference in Marion, Kansas on March 21 and permission for Clerk Marsicek and election Deputy Ball to travel to Manhattan May 7-10 for training.

Clerk Marsicek update the Board on the wellness points and employee deduction may be withheld if points are not earned. The employees that have met their allotted points before the deadline for the next year (2014 must be met by July 31, 2013) there will be no deductions from their payroll. Payroll deductions for not acquiring the allotted points will last for a full 12 months before earning the status of preferred.

There will be a meeting of department heads which currently use the AS400 software on March 25 at 9:30 a.m. during the commissioners meeting to discuss computer software.

Bids were opened for catering the Employee Appreciation meal to be held March 25, 2013 at the 4-H Building.

Lieb expressed his appreciation for allowing 3 employees to attend the advance training classes for MTI in Concordia and training should be completed by April 1<sup>st</sup>.

Permission was granted for the EMS department to attend a training session on March 26 in Marysville as long as the shift time was covered.

The EMS department is searching for new ambulance to replace the 1989 unit that has 170,000 plus miles. Lieb stated funding would come from ambulance vehicle fund, special county funds and a loan when the necessary vehicle was located.

Lieb informed Board his department is moving to more computerization to meet requirements of other ambulance and hospital services. He already has 4 TABLETS in use and feels they are beneficial.

Sheriff Blad announced the hiring of part-time employee Eric Isaacson.

Road and bridge Administrator Scott Finkbiner presented a complete biennial bridge inspection update from the CFS Engineers with the recommendations for repairing or replacing bridges in Republic County along with cost estimates.

Other projects involving the road and bridge department.

- 1) Plans to repair 3 bridges and inspect others before determining if new weight limits or closings signs are necessary.
- 2) Presented an electric cable agreement allowing Tobe Duensing to construct and operate an underground Electric line located ¼ mile east of 160<sup>th</sup> on Cedar Rd. thence crossing from Section 15; T1S; R3W into Section 10; T1S; R3W approval. Permission granted.
- Researching additional funds (grants) for bridge replacement at Republic.
- 4) Old Boom mower will be sold on the consignment sale later this month. Replacement attachments being researched.
- 5) Dump truck is out of service and pricing repairs to convert it from automatic to manual.
- 6) Marty Kolman started March 11 as Operations Operator 1.

Chairperson Holl motioned the adoption of Resolution 2013-18, <u>A Resolution to Preserve and Defend the Second Amendment of the United States Constitution</u>. Bergstrom 2<sup>nd</sup> agreed 3-0.

County Health Administrator Marcia Hansen and Sherry Koster from Sanitarian informed the Board there would be a mailed ballot regarding an increase in annual contract with LEPG raising

Melinda Pierson from Mainstreet and Chamber organization asked permission to hold the annual county Easter Egg Hunt on the courthouse lawn on March 30 at 11:30am.

Commissioner Rytych motioned to hold the annual Easter Egg Hunt on the courthouse lawn. Bergstrom 2<sup>nd</sup> agreed.

Road and Bridge administrator Scott Finkbiner along with Jon Halbgewachs and Bill Strait from Kirkham, Micheal and Associates, Inc visited with the board about the detours needed and contracts needing to be signed before the final paperwork is submitted to request road reclassifications from major collector to minor in order to qualify for possible grants to help fund the bridge replacement on the Republican River near Republic. Jon will finalize the request letter then send to Finkbiner for review before he submits the letter to KDOT. Since Jon will not be able to attend the board meeting next week Bill will attend and present update on the status of the paperwork. It was a conscience of the board to table the signing of contracts until next week when all the commissioners would be available. Scott stated the county should create a special highway fund to be used for the bridge repairs being projected for the next few years. The board asked Jon to give an estimate of cost for this project and Jon estimated 1 to 1.5 million but the grants should help considerably. Jon stated when all the paperwork and detailed bridge plans are submitted and approved; it could take 1 to 1 ½ years to complete the project.

Finkbiner has located a side boom mower with tractor from Re-Bus. The equipment is used but only has 760 hours and the price is \$49,900 but it is located in Florida. Commissioner Rytych made a motion if Finkbiner can purchase this equipment and the freight for the total of

\$49,900, he may order it. If the price is not negotiable or if the freight will be extra, Finkbiner is not to proceed with the purchase. Bergstrom 2<sup>nd</sup> agreed 2-0.

The Board discussed with Finkbiner about the alleyway (road) between the hospital and the ambulance department. Finkbiner strongly suggests that the city is responsible for that alleyway but he will contact the city manager Neil Lewis and work out details to fix the alleyway.

The Republic County Governing Board met in regular session on Monday March 25, 2013 at 8:30 am. Commissioners present Linda Holl, Frank Rytych and Marvin Bergstrom. County Clerk Kathleen Marsicek was also present to record the minutes of the meeting.

Commissioner Holl called the meeting order and no stated no commissioner would be attending the Republic County Hospital Board meeting at noon.

Pastor Kathy Aeillo, Scandia/Courtland United Methodist Church, offered Morning Prayer.

Commissioner Rytych moved the minutes from March 11, 2013 be approved after amending the name of Jon to Scott in paragraph discussing the special bridge fund. Bergstrom 2<sup>nd</sup> agreed, 3-0.

Weed supervisor Mike Nondorf presented descriptions of two pick-up trucks he has determined would meet his needs to replace the current pickup in his department. Purple wave auction will be closing bids on these March 28 and board gave their approval to purchase a pickup. His current pickup will be sold to the road and bridge department upon purchasing the replacement truck.

Scott Kasl and Scott Finkbiner meet with the board for a second time regarding the tire damage to Kasl vehicle. Kasl stated if the county knows there is debris in the railroad rock that is used on the roads why is the county not responsible for the damage it causes? Finkbiner said the rock is screened for large debris items but they cannot remove it all before it applied to the roads. Commissioner Rytych stated he understands both Kasl's point of view and the county's and feels the railroad rock builds a good surface to our roads at a less expensive price than regular rock and it far outweighs any damage. Rytych requested that Finkbiner have his employees screen the rock more and make sure the magnets are ran over the rock as it is graded to remove as much debris as possible. Finkbiner suggested his department purchase some metal detectors to be used on this road to aid in removing the debris the magnets may not pick up. Kasl is still not satisfied with the board's decision when he left. The purchase of two metal detectors was approved by the Board.

Department heads from the Appraiser department, deeds department, treasurer department, and the clerk's department discussed the computer software and server problems. Clerk Marsicek shared that there are several counties around Republic that have purchased the CIC computers and software. A few of the counties stated the system works very well but it takes time to convert information from the AS400 to the new. Marsicek stated since she is new to the old program she would agree to learn the old system and become efficient on it before trying to change the entire computer network. However, she would like permission to order and enhancement from Manatron-Thompson Rueter that would enable her computer to toggle between the regular DOS system and a PC networking. The staff in the appraiser's office has this enhancement and the cost would be \$900 one time setup and then \$150 per year for maintenance.

Commissioner Rytych motioned the county to move forward with purchasing the server and continue to use the software Republic County is currently using for \$23932.00 from Thompson Rueter. Holl 2<sup>nd</sup> agreed 3-0.

Appraiser Porter stated the county would now have time to research more deeply other types of software and when the next server is needed we could try to upgrade.

Chairperson Holl motioned Marsicek could order the enhancement for the clerks department. Rytych 2<sup>nd</sup> agreed 3-0.

Treasurer Coons presented an updated list of delinquent property tax report showing of the 56 persons that were sent letters to pay their property tax or the property would be put on a delinquent tax sale, there were 26 persons that responded and paid at least partial payments to keep off the sheriff's sale. There is still \$160,339.69 outstanding and would like the board to proceed with the sale.

County Attorney Marlea James visited with the board about the costs of having a delinquent tax sale and thought it should be not every year. Board explained to her, there were several years of past due taxes and the cost of the sale is small compared to the outstanding taxes.

Chairperson Holl moved Resolution 2013-19, "Ordering Preparation for Tax Foreclosure Sale" approved. Rytych 2<sup>nd</sup> agreed 3-0.

Road and Bridge Administrator Scott Finkbiner and Bill Strait from Kirkham, Micheals presented the Request for Revision of the Functional Classification System to change the road from Hwy 266 to the Republic Bridge to "OFFSYSTEM" and Jade road to be upgraded to major collector road. By submitting this change, if approved, the county could be awarded 80/20 Funding on the replacement bridge at Republic. Strait requested the board sign the contract for the new bridge; however, Finkbiner stated another company (Husker Steel) is presenting a bid for this bridge work on April 8 and would like the board to hold off signing Kirkham's contract until after that presentation. Strait understands all projects should have multiple bids but make sure Husker Steel is bidding the same plans. Finkbiner will present Kirkham & Micheal contract for review by the Board at the April 1st meeting at 10:00 a.m.

Updates on road and bridge work:

- 1) Boom Mower was purchased from Re-Bus for the quoted amount of \$49,900 and that includes touch up painting and delivery.
- 2) Effective March 22, 2013, Vince Armstrong quit his position. The Board approved Finkbiners' request to fill the open operator position. The open operator position will be posted for two weeks or until filled.
- 3) Work has started on the bridge located at 220 Rd and Ash
- 4) Finkbiner, Isaacson and Lewis met on the alleyway between the hospital and ambulance department. It was agreed the county would dig up the road, repair and

- overlay with asphalt and the costs will be split 3 ways. Hospital, City and County, if all the board members agree to the repair request.
- 5) Finkbiner wants to work with the hospital in regards to removing the island area just south of the clinic parking area. He feels if it is removed the water and ice that settle in that area would drain better.
- 6) A couple of Finkbiner's employees were at the 4-H building this morning setting up tables and chairs for the annual County Appreciation Supper to be held this evening March 25, 2013.
- 7) Kelvin Blecha from the Fair Board asked Finkbiner to work on fair grounds around the east side of the commercial building and around where the new Methodist food stand is located.

Commissioner Rytych motioned Republic County sign the NCKLEPG Voting Ballot for FY 2014 and contract to increase in fees for 2014. Bergstrom 2<sup>nd</sup> agreed 3-0.

Luke Mahin along with 5 members of the Economic Development committee introduced Erik Pedersen to the board to explain the organization he works for-Entrepreneurship Community Partnership a Network Kansas Entrepreneurial Program commonly called E-Community. An E-Community cultivates an entrepreneurial environment by connecting startups & small businesses to a network of resources who offer business building expertise, education, and economic resources at low or no cost to the business owner. Pedersen explained his group has funds to help communities with monies much like our RCD fund and Economic Development but can be used in addition to those by using tax credits. Mikel Hadachek stated our county is familiar with tax credits and any additional assistance we could give to local new businesses would be a great asset. E-Community works much like our RCD revolving loans and all paperwork would be processed through the RCD group for applications and payments, they are just a funding source.

Board agreed to allow the Republic County Economic Development Committee to file the necessary application to become part of the E-Community of Kansas.

Luke Mahin presented the clerk a check from Duclos Foundation to be deposited in the special fund being set up for the ROZ distribution. Mahin informed the board, he has pledges of \$3000.00 for the ROZ fund.

At 12:00 noon, Chairperson Holl called the Board, Marcia Hansen and clerk Marsicek into executive session to discuss non-elected personnel for 10 minutes. At 12:10 pm an additional 5 minutes was requested. At 12:15 pm an additional 5 minutes was requested. Board reconvened at 12:20 pm with no action taken.

Chairperson Holl informed Hansen there would be a review of all wages in her department once the department was running smoothly.

At 12:31 pm, Chairperson Holl along with Highway administrator Finkbiner requested an executive meeting for 10 minutes to discuss non-elected personnel. At 12:41 pm Board reconvened with no action taken.

Chairperson Holl motioned the Republic County Courthouse be closed Friday March 29, 2013 from Noon to 2 pm for employees to attend Good Friday services of their choice. Bergstrom 2<sup>nd</sup> agreed 3-0.

The Republic County Governing Board met in regular session on Monday April 1, 2013 at 8:30 am. Commissioners present Linda Holl, Frank Rytych and Marvin Bergstrom. County Clerk Kathleen Marsicek was also present to record the minutes of the meeting.

Commissioner Holl called the meeting order.

Pastor Roger Walls, Republic United Methodist Church, offered Morning Prayer.

Chairperson Holl moved to approve minutes from March 18<sup>th</sup> with the amendment changing "Sheriff sale to Delinquent Tax Sale". Rytych 2<sup>nd</sup> agreed 3-0.

Sheriff Blad informed the Board he hired a part time jailer, Deb Smee.

Blad stated there was an accident on the Hardy River Bridge on March 30 that has caused the bridge to become a one lane bridge until repairs are completed.

Board reviewed a DVD presented by commissioner Rytych dealing with the Juvenile Detention Center in Junction City. Rytych is the Republic County representative on the Juvenile Board. Rytych stated Republic County's quarterly support would decrease in 2014 which is based on the amount of use by Republic County referrals.

Emergency Manager Raymond Raney shared his department will be using the old copier the District Court replaced with a newer model however it did not have a fax board installed and ask the Board for permission to purchase the fax board for \$300 installed and discussed if a maintenance agreement for \$30 per month would be necessary. Board agreed to the purchase of the fax board but stated the maintenance agreement was not necessary.

Raney stated there were only 95 weather radios available out of the 650 total purchased but felt by the end of summer they should be sold.

Chairperson Holl stated the ambulance department had requested the large pine tree on the corner of the ambulance grounds should be removed since it is diseased. John Forshee from the Extension department will examine the tree within the next two weeks and report to the Board his recommendation.

Permission to travel was granted to Raymond Raney and Colleen Alkire to Emergency Management Training in Wichita April 7-9.

Kevin Calkins, Custodian, told Board Glass Services was ahead of schedule on the project they are working on (Beloit Courthouse) and could start to replace our windows sooner than expected probably by the end of April. However, they could not put muttons on the windows that opened but could put the muttons on the balance of the windows. The windows would look like the courtroom windows. The Board agreed to accept those types of windows. The Board asked Kevin if he would go to Beloit and review the work the vendor is doing.

Cathy Calkins requested that Kevin advise each department a few days ahead of time if possible when window work will begin so that department can move equipment and supplies away from the window area.

Highway and bridge administrator Scott Finkbiner presented his weekly report.

- 1) He requested the Board NOT sign the contract with Kirkham & Micheal until the Board decides which contractor will be building the bridge at Republic because of the wording in the contract.
- 2) Husker Steel will be presenting their bid next Monday April 8.
- 3) There was an accident on the Hardy Bridge over the Republican River the last weekend March 30 causing it to become a one lane bridge until repairs can be completed. The bridge is located on the Jewell county line and Jewell County is responsible for the inspections on said bridge; however, Republic County maintains the roads. Finkbiner is to contact Jewell County as to which county is responsible for the repairs. The damage to the 10 road river bridge will be inspected by an engineering firm to evaluate the integrity of the damaged structure.
- 4) Chairperson Holl asked about repairing the road at the intersection of US Hwy 36 and the Dollar Store, there are many potholes there and Finkbiner will contact the state to repair.
- 5) Bid quotes have been requested for three bridges to comp0lete hydraulic survey for permitting and construction of: 1<sup>st</sup> at 20<sup>th</sup> and Elm, 2<sup>nd</sup> at 40<sup>th</sup> and Diamond, and 3<sup>rd</sup> at 190 and Young Road. These three bridges are critical bridges that require much higher inspection cost to the county.
- 6) Finkbiner requested a review of the credit card limits for his department. The county has an overall limit and each department has separate limits; however, the overall limit does not cover the total of all the limits of the departments. Meaning, a large purchase by one department could cause a decline of purchase of another department if the total amount was over the limit. The Board asked the clerk to contact our credit card carrier to apply for a separate card just for the Road and Bridge department with a limit of \$10,000. Then remove Road and Bridge department from the General Card use. Chairperson Holl made the motion; Bergstrom 2<sup>nd</sup> agreed 3-0.
- 7) Finkbiner would like to purchase a concrete breaker to attach to the 410 John Deere bach-hoe, possible value \$12,000-14,000. Board asked for quotes.
- 8) Four people have filled out applications for the open operator position.
- 9) Mike Nondorf is still looking for a pickup to replace the current one used for the weeds department.
- 10) The new summer hours for road and bridge department started today April 1. They are now working 4 days at 10 hours.
- 11) Thayne Larson will be contacting Finkbiner regarding the land located at Sec 7, Township 3, Range 3 which is next to the old mixing strip on US Hwy 36. Republic County will be interested in possibly purchasing additional land from Mr. Larson for mixing asphalt at the Rydal mixing strip.

At 11:09 am the Board went into executive session with clerk Marsicek to discuss non-elected personnel for 5 minutes. An additional 5 minutes were requested.

At 11:19 am, board reconvened and the conscience of the Board was to appoint the Clerk Marsicek as Director of Human Resources for the Health Department to work with Health Administrator Hansen.

Commissioner Holl called the meeting order.

Deputy election clerk Beth Ball presented the provisional ballots to be canvassed from the city/school election.

Chairperson Holl moved to approve minutes from April 1st. Bergstrom 2nd agreed 3-0.

EMS Director Don Lieb and assistant Blaine VanMeter discussed their concerns about the newly implemented random drug testing the county started using April 1<sup>st</sup>. Their concern for the Ambulance department could end up costing the county more money since when an ambulance employee is called for testing another person needs to be at the station to cover if a call is received for dispatching. A solution to this is to have the person(s) being tested from that department tested at the ambulance station with the understanding if a call is received the test is over and the employee would be tested another time. The testing program was set up at the road and bridge department to comply with workman's Compensation Insurance including all Republic County employees exempting elected personnel.

The consensus of the Board of County Commissioners was ALL employees including elected officials and the Board will be included in the random sampling. The sheriff's department and ambulance department will supply Finkbiner with the schedules of employees so testing would only occur when a person was on duty. If an officer is required to be tested after regular hours at the road and bridge office, Scott would make sure someone would be available onsite or testing could be done at the courthouse.

Becky Fisher from Carlson testing shared she is contracted by many counties to conduct onsite drug testing. Jewell County has been doing this for a few years and we could contact Karla there to review their drug testing procedures in their handbook. Clerk Marsicek will follow-up with Jewell county clerk in obtaining this information.

Permission to travel was granted to Peggy Frint to attend the Spring Conference at Phillipsburg on April 16, 2013.

Permission to travel was granted to Mike Nondorf to attend District meeting in Beloit on April 11, 2013.

Nick Levendofsky, Special Project Coordinator for Kansas Farmers Union, discussed a bill SB191 and HB2404 concerning agricultural corporations; Kansas Corporate Farming Law. This legislation would prohibit direct investment by corporations or private corporation-size entities and their stockholders in the business of farming. One key provision to the SB191 is that it will

take away the county option, meaning NO county in Kansas will be able to opt out of consideration by any corporation looking to relocate to Kansas. SB191 would take the power from the commissioners and place it in the hands of the Kansas Legislature, Secretary of Agriculture and Governor.

Chairperson Holl motioned the mileage reimbursement rate for using personal vehicles if a county vehicles is not available be raised from \$0.47 to \$0.52. Bergstrom 2<sup>nd</sup> agreed 3-0.

Road and Bridge Administrator Scott Finkbiner presented his weekly update.

- 1. Leland Tice from KDOT has been contacted about repairing the roadway area at the intersection of US HWY 36 beside the Dollar General Store.
- 2. Stop signs positions were reviewed from Hwy 36 North on 20<sup>th</sup> to Jade road to make sure the stop signs are in the correct places by resolutions. Finkbiner will get a survey cost from Campbell & Johnson Engineering to place stop signs at each intersection from Hwy 36 north on 20th road to Jade.
- 3. Railroad rock has been acquired located between 210-220 roads and Ash and Birch road. The county has one to two months to remove the rail road rock.
- 4. KDOT funds in amount of \$134,000 will received again this year but the prorated \$106,000 will be held back until a later date.
- 5. Leon Ball has been contracted to move a double steel constructed culvert from Clifton, KS to 170 and Elm east near the Kuhlman farm. The moving permit fee was waved for Ball and Sons since the county is paying the moving fees.
- 6. Positions for summer help will be posted in the near future for 2-4 people.
- 7. Several persons have applied for the two open positions and Finkbiner will be setting up interviews this week.
- 8. Jewell County has not responded in regards to the Hardy Bridge repairs. However, Finkbiner and Kirkham and Micheal inspector will inspect the bridge for any integrity issues on April 9<sup>th</sup> at 10 am.
- 9. The random drug testing of county employees in underway. Some scheduling changes have been made for persons not working the 7-5 shifts. All paid county employees and Board of County Commissioners will be included in the random drug testing program. Finkbiner will gather all the schedules from the Sheriff's department, EMS and Emergency Management.

At 10:14 a.m., Chairperson Holl called an executive session with Finkbiner and the board to discuss non-elected personnel for 20 minutes.

Board reconvened 10:34 a.m. with no actions taken.

Kay Shoemaker, RCD treasurer informed the Board there would be a meeting Wednesday night April 10 at 6:30 at the Bell-Villa Restaurant to review a new application. Shoemaker also presented a lien release form on Todd Frye regarding a trailer.

Health Administrator Marcia Hansen updated the board, she and clerk Marsicek have narrowed the applications to three persons and a decision would be made later on Monday for the position of Secretary/bookkeeper.

Clerk Marsicek informed the Board the main printer used in her office is over 11 years old and not functioning properly and would like permission to purchase a new printer. The Board requested quotes from Central Office, Computer solutions and Thomson Reuter to make sure printer is compatible with our AS400 system to print checks and other necessary forms.

Richard Bergstrom visited with the board about his concerns with the landfill responsibilities. The Board asked Finkbiner to return to the board meeting to discuss these.

Commissioner signed accounts payable vouchers totally \$315,066.93.

At 12:00 pm, Chairperson Holl moved Board meeting be adjourned, Bergstrom 2<sup>nd</sup> agreed 3-0.

The next regular meeting will be held on Monday, April 15, 2013, Courthouse, Belleville.

The Republic County Governing Board met in regular session on Monday April 15, 2013 at 8:30 a.m. Commissioners present Linda Holl, Frank Rytych and Marvin Bergstrom. County Clerk Kathleen Marsicek was also present to record the minutes of the meeting.

Commissioner Holl called the meeting order.

Lay Pastor Kathleen Marsicek, Narka Presbyterian Church offered Morning Prayer.

Commissioner Rytych moved to approve minutes from April 8th. Bergstrom 2nd agreed 3-0.

EMS assistant director, Blain Van Meter, presented a letter of resignation from EMS Director Don Lieb effective immediately to the Board of Commissioners. Lieb would like to remain employed fulltime but is stepping down as director. Chairperson Holl moved to accept Liebs' resignation with regrets and accepts Liebs' offer to remain a fulltime employee. Bergstrom 2<sup>nd</sup> agreed 3-0.

Commissioner Bergstrom moved to appoint assistant director Van Meter as EMS Director effective April 15, 2013. Chairperson Holl 2<sup>nd</sup> agreed 3-0.

Sheriff Blad visited with Board about part-time employees and needing additional help due to illness and injured employees. He has hired Melissa Anderson as a part-time jailor but could still use more jailors.

Chairperson Holl asked Blad to research a cost analysis of transporting Republic County prisoners to Cloud County facilities once it is complete. Blad agreed to prepare this information for review but feels it would not be cost effective to transport prisoners back and forth for court and medical needs if it is necessary along with paying Cloud County to house our prisoners.

Chairperson Holl stated John Forshee from Kansas Research and Development has examined the tree located near the ambulance department and determined it has environmental damage and should be removed. The Board will inform road and bridge administrator to have it removed.

At 8:55 am, Chairperson Holl requested executive session for 5 minutes with clerk Marsicek to discuss non-elected personnel. An additional 5 minutes were requested.

Board reconvened at 9:05 am, No action taken.

Permission was granted for Clerk Marsicek to attend KPERS training in Marysville on April 25 and Sanborn Institute-First year in Wichita on June 10-14.

All department heads with the exception of County Attorney James whom was in court, attended the department head meeting to review the rough draft of the hand book and discuss the recently implemented random drug testing. Questions about who the Medical Review Officer-MRO and Designated Employer Representative- DER were discussed. Road and Bridge administrator Finkbiner stated the MRO is the testing center TMHC but the county needs to appoint a DER. The Board feels that person should be located in the clerk's office and will determine by the next meeting who will be designated as the county DER. Finkbiner would create an information sheet to be presented to employees in the event they do not pass the random testing regarding an appeal process. Department

heads will meet again April 29<sup>th</sup> 11:00 a.m. to present any recommendations they have to the new proposed handbooks.

Chris Adelman from Husker Steel in Omaha, NE relayed his thanks to the board for the opportunity to bid on the Republic river bridge project but his company feels this project is too large and would require more time than they could provide. He apologized to the Board for taking so long to respond to Finkbiners' request.

Road and Bridge Administrator Finkbiner presented his weekly update.

- 1. Quotes from Campbell & Johnson Engineering to survey for 4 intersections for stop sign installation on 20<sup>th</sup> road north of US Hwy 36 would be \$1000.
- 2. Bridge inspection of Hardy River bridge by Kirkham & Micheal revealed the integrity of bridge was not damaged so general repairs to top of bridge could be completed. Finkbiner will get quotes from two contractors for the bridge repairs. The insurance company of the driver who damaged the bridge will be responsible for repairs.
- 3. Jewell County has not replied to Finkbiner's request regarding which county is responsible for the bridge.
- 4. Belleville city wide clean up starts this week.
- 5. Trying to set a date for county wide cleanup.
- 6. Tractor and boom mower will be here next week.
- 7. Interviews of 6 applications will be done by Tuesday.
- 8. Board informed Finkbiner to remove the damaged tree from the EMS property.
- 9. The county will be receiving \$800 for scrap metal accumulated from the County Landfill from MTD Iron of Belleville.

Finkbiner presented two waterline agreements for signing:

- 1. Every Angle Covered for Robison Farms;
- 2. The second for Premium Feeders.

Bill Strait from Kirkham & Micheal presented a revised contract and explained the county would have up to 14 days prior to work starting to cancel the contract. He stated the state has been changing the formulas for county funding on new bridges. There should still be funding available for the 80/20 share when the bridge work is completed. There is a CBG grant the county can apply for but the window of construction is only two years from the date of application therefore he would recommend that we not apply until we have bridge design approved.

At 11:19 a.m., Board went into executive session for 5 minutes with Finkbiner and clerk Marsicek to discuss non-elected personnel.

Board reconvened 11:24am taking to action.

At 11:25 a.m., Board went into executive session for 5 minutes with Finkbiner to discuss non-elected personnel. An additional 5 minutes were requested.

Board reconvened at 11:34 and the consensus of the board instructed Finkbiner to create an information sheet listing how an employee can appeal if they test positive during a drug test including phone numbers and the name of our Medical Review officer.

Kay Shoemaker, RCD treasurer reminded the board of RCD meeting on Wednesday April 17<sup>th</sup>.

Clerk Marsicek reported to the Board, since AS400 has special needs for a printer chip, she has ordered a printer from Thomson Reuter in the amount of \$1642.00.

Health Administrator, Marcia Hansen, informed the Board, Lori Kuhlman has been hired as the secretary/bookkeeper for her department and will start full time April 22.

Board discussed the wages of the newly appointed EMS director and the retiring director. Chairperson Holl moved the retiring director maintain his current wages and Van Meter be offered \$13.25 per hour, with raises according to merit and additional training. The county agrees to pay for Van Meter to become a paramedic knowing the process can take up to three years to complete. Commission Rytych  $2^{nd}$ , agreed 3-0.

At 12:00 pm, Commissioner Bergstrom moved Board meeting be adjourned, Rytych 2<sup>nd</sup> agreed 3-0.

The next regular meeting will be held on Monday, April 22, 2013, Courthouse, Belleville.

The Republic County Governing Board met in regular session on Monday, April 22, 2013 at 8:30 a.m. Commissioners present were Linda Holl, Frank Rytych and Marvin Bergstrom. Beth Reed was present to record the minutes of the meeting in the absence of County Clerk, Kathleen Marsicek.

Commissioner Holl called the meeting to order at 8:30 a.m.

Rev. Kathy Aeillo, United Methodist Pastor from Scandia and Courtland offered the morning prayer.

Beth Ball, Republic County Elections Officer was on hand as the ballots from the Agenda City Election were canvassed.

The Commissioners signed the regular accounts payable vouchers in the amount of \$171,947.06.

It was the consensus of the Board that, as drug testing is being requested by the County, that all drug testing expenses be paid from County General instead of individual departments.

Permission was given for County Clerk, Kathleen Marsicek, to attend the following classes:

Financial Management – May 8<sup>th</sup> in Wichita Communication Skills for Effective Supervision – May 14<sup>th</sup> in Salina Overview of Human Resource Management – July 11<sup>th</sup> in Junction City

It was noted that Beth Ball has agreed to be Republic County's Designated Employee Representative. The County Clerk is to contact Jewell County for more information on what this position entails.

Arlene Clayton briefly visited the meeting.

Mikkel Hadachek and Kay Shoemaker met to discuss the RCD loan application of Dan Wilber, d/b/a Dan's Auto Body. After discussion and upon the recommendation by the Industrial Development Committee, Commissioner Holl moved that this loan be approved. Bergstrom 2<sup>nd</sup>, and made unanimous by Rytych. An amount up to \$10,000.00 will be financed to be used toward machinery/equipment/inventory purchase and start-up costs.

Marcia Hansen, Health Department Director, requested and received Permission to Travel for Linda Wendt to attend a mandatory WIC class in Topeka on June 3<sup>rd</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup>, 2013. Permission to Travel was also approved for attendance at the Governor's Public Health Conference being held in Wichita on April 29, 30, and May 1, 2013. Attending will be Marcia Hansen for CDRR; Sue Swanson for Family Planning; and Beverly Lapo for the Healthy Start portions of the Conference.

The Board approved a starting wage for Lori Kuhlman at \$9.84 per hour.

Minutes of the April 8<sup>th</sup>, 2013 Commissioner meeting were signed and will be included in the County's records. Also, Minutes of the April 15<sup>th</sup>, 2013 Minutes were approved as written.

Deb Hadachek monitored a portion of the remainder of the meeting.

Ellen Anderson, Director of the 12<sup>th</sup> Judicial District Community Corrections Department, had previously submitted a copy of the agency's Comprehensive Plan for review, and was seeking the Board's approval of that Plan. Commissioner Holl signed the Plan on behalf of the County. Ms. Anderson explained that their actual operation expenses were \$199,790.00, and depending on what the Kansas Department of Corrections allows for their next year's budget, it is possible that they will need to cut one staff member, which will be a hardship on the program. Caseload has increased throughout the six-county area; however, unless there is an increase in their budget, it will be necessary to make some changes, including cutting staff.

Scott Finkbiner, Highway Administrator, submitted for the Board's approval, two draft letters to be given to employees who test positive on drug and/or alcohol tests; one for employees who carry CDL licenses and one for non-CDL employees. The Board approved both letters. A question was raised regarding if there was a need to test for synthetic drugs. Mr. Finkbiner will inquire about this with the agency which is contracted to do the testing for Republic County.

Repairs to the road located between the Republic County Hospital and the Ambulance building was discussed. Peggy Frint from the Register of Deeds office had researched and found that in 1936, this road was vacated by the City and given to the County. Repairs to make a decent road will cost approximately \$7,000.00, which Mr. Finkbiner, representing the County, is making arrangements with the City, as well as the Hospital, to split the costs three ways. He is still waiting for approval from the City to proceed. The Board requested that, for safety purposes, this road be temporarily fixed until such time as we receive the asphalt to make it into a good road.

The Highway Administrator has visited with Jewell County and the costs and repairs to the Hardy bridge will be split between the two counties.

High Plains has advised that we will not be receiving any asphalt until mid-June of this year.

Ten hours of vacation time was reinstated to Justin Klima due to a misunderstanding and miscommunication concerning the same.

A bid has been requested from several companies for 95,000 gallon of oil (CRS-1H) delivered to Belleville for sealing asphalt roads.

Mr. Finkbiner reported that in April of 2014 Republic County Highway Department will be hosting the annual meeting for all counties within our District.

An estimated bid from Kirkham and Michaels was received concerning the Republican River Bridge. Our costs would be around \$500,000.00.

Brandon Mann from KWORK conducted a quick walk through the highway facility. Mr. Mann advised that all violations discovered will need to be corrected in a timely manner to avoid fines for non-compliance.

May 6<sup>th</sup> through 12<sup>th</sup>, 2013, will be the County-wide cleanup.

At the present time, tires received at the Landfill need to be disposed of at the County's expense. Mr. Finkbiner is looking into a machine that cuts the beads on the tires so that they may be buried in the Landfill instead of disposal through a contracting company. This would be a tremendous savings to the County.

Workmen's Compensation has notified the County that they are beginning to deny claims for personal safety equipment (face shields, dark glasses, etc.) to employees who are repeat violators for recurring expenses on these items Recurring expenses will then be the expense of the employee. Road and Bridge employees were informed of this change at their last Safety meeting.

Mr. Finkbiner reported that they have narrowed down applicants to five for the three positions that are open in his department. Beginning wages were discussed and the Board requested that job descriptions be drawn setting out skills needed for particular jobs. There can be no complete standard of starting wage as applicants have different skill and experience levels.

Mike Nondorf, Weed Director, submitted a draft letter to be sent to Republic County citizens who do not spray for weeds in a timely manner. It was the consensus of the Board that a telephone call should be made first prior to the letter being sent. Mr. Nondorf, also, submitted information on a pickup that he would like to bid on for his department. He was to check the Blue Book for a value prior to pursuing the purchase.

Blaine VanMeter, EMS Director, advised that he has enrolled at Cloud County Community College to continue toward his Paramedic status. Mr. VanMeter had purchased a copier for his department and discussion was held as to which fund to use for this purchase.

At 11:24 a.m. Mr. VanMeter requested a ten minute Executive Session to discuss non-elected personnel. This request was moved by Holl, seconded by Bergstrom, and made unanimous by Rytych. Another five minutes was requested at 11:34 a.m. Meeting resumed at 11:39 a.m. with no action taken.

Resolution No. 2013-19 was signed appointing Mr. VanMeter as EMS Director for the remainder of 2013.

Mr. VanMeter advised that it would be his recommendation that the EMS Department begin to set aside \$30,000.00 per year over a five-year period, to begin an ambulance rotation program.

Bergstrom, unanimous by Rytych.

The next regular meeting will be held on Monday, April 29<sup>th</sup>, 2013, Courthouse, Belleville.

Arlene Clayton visited with the BOCC about her concerns about all the reports of cattle out on the roads.

Health Administrator Marcia Hansen stated two of the vehicles assigned to her department were in need of repairs or be traded. One has not been driven for several months because it is not reliable. The second one a 1998 Neon is leaking oil and could cost over \$800 to repair. Since Hansen did not have any funds budgeted this year for vehicles, the consensus of the BOCC was to have the Neon repaired and place ads to sell the other.

At 10:20 a.m., Chairperson Holl requested executive session with the BOCC, Hansen and clerk Marsicek for 10 minutes to discuss non-elected personnel.

At 10:30 a.m., Board reconvened.

Commissioner Bergstrom made motion to increase Linda Wendt wages \$.25per hour for her additional responsibilities. Rytych 2<sup>nd</sup> agreed 3-0.

At 10:40 a.m., Chairperson Holl requested executive session with BOCC, County Treasurer Cindy Coons and Clerk Marsicek for 5 minutes to discuss non-elected personnel.

Mike Nondorf, Weed Director, advised that he received the 2003 GMC pickup as previously approved by the Commissioners. He has been advised by Superior Outdoor Power that a saddle and tank for the pickup would be \$1,600.00, and to switch the electronics from the old pickup to the new would be \$500.00. As the time to spray for noxious weeds is now, and the pickup was purchased for \$2,500.00 less than was originally planned, the Board gave permission to incur these expenses.

In the May 6<sup>th</sup>, 2013 meeting of the Board of County Commissioners, a bid was submitted by Cunningham Communications, to upgrade the speed of the County's Internet system. Upon motion of Commissioner Rytych, seconded by Commissioner Holl, and made unanimous by Commissioner Bergstrom, the quote was approved in the amount of \$925.00.

All meetings were approved.

Blaine requested permission to begin the process of gathering information on the purchase of a new ambulance. The Board advised him that he could begin to gather information, but until a report from the 2012 Audit was received from the County's auditor, no action would be taken on this request.

Deb Hadachek with the Belleville Telescope monitored a portion of the meeting.

Melinda Pierson from the Main Street Program, requested permission to use the West side of the Courtyard for the Farmers Market, which is to begin on May  $25^{th}$  and run through September  $28^{th}$ , 2013, from 8:00-11:00 a.m. each Saturday morning during that time period. Permission was granted.

Cindy Coons, County Treasurer requested permission to travel to KCTA Legislative meeting in Wichita on June 12-14<sup>th</sup>. Permission was granted.

Appraiser, Barry Porter, requested permission to travel to the Kansas County Appraiser Conference to be held in Wichita June 2<sup>nd</sup> through June 5<sup>th</sup>. One-half of all expenses will be paid by Cloud County. Permission was granted.

Marlea James, Republic County Attorney, submitted two bids received for title search on properties that could be on the next tax sale. Bids were received from Chapman-Hyland of Belleville for \$140.00 per parcel; and from Condray-Thompson, also of Belleville, for \$125.00 per parcel. Commissioner Holl moved, seconded by Commissioner Bergstrom and made unanimous by Commissioner Rytych to accept the low bid of Condray-Thompson. There are approximately 46 parcels to have a title search at this time; however, this number will change as it gets closer to the sale date and property owners are noticed. A sale date is yet to be determined.

Scott Finkbiner, along with Bill Strait of Kirkham Michael and Associates, Inc., met with the Board. An Agreement for Engineering Services was signed regarding the FAS Bridge 370 which is located 1.0 mile south and 1.0 west of Republic (Republican River Bridge). The initial cost will be \$155,000.00 for this work. This contract is being approved based off of the determination of Kansas Department of Transportation to design an alternative local road route.

Bids for permit surveys related to the replacement of three drainage structures at the following locations were submitted: 2-E.1, 4-D.8, and 19-Y.5. Bids were received from Cook-Flatt & Stroebel in the amount of \$7,500.00; Campbell and Johnson in the amount of \$13,500.00; and Kirkham Michael and Associates, Inc. in the amount of \$6,500.00. The low bid of Kirkham Michael and Associates, Inc. was awarded the bid and a contract to that effect was signed with that agency.

A bid for 1 concrete rail repair, 10 LF section was received by Reece Construction Company, Inc. in response to a bid request sent out by Republic County. King Construction has also indicated that they are interested in bidding on this project, so the County is waiting for that bid prior to making a choice of who will be awarded this work.

Mr. Finkbiner requested and received permission to travel to a KDHE Workshop at Emporia on May 14<sup>th</sup>, 2013.

At 10:02 a.m., Commissioner Holl requested a five minutes executive session with Mr. Finkbiner to discuss non-elected personnel. Board reconvened at 10:07 a.m. with no actions taken.

Clerk Marsicek asked the Board to review the monthly administrative fees from TMHC (Drug testing facility) explaining we are charged \$519.75 per month (or \$5.25 per person) whether or not any employee is randomly tested. However, if the county paid per test it would be \$70.00 each test as currently charged when pre-employment testing is processed. It was the consensus of the Board to invoice each department for pre-employment testing only and all administrative fees paid from County General funds.

Sheriff Blad stated several accidents in the county last week kept his department busy. He is interviewing for fulltime jailers this week and hopes to hire as soon as possible to relieve his current staff of some overtime.

Blad explained a jailer has been off work since mid-March due to accident at work. He feels our contact at KWORC has not processed the necessary paperwork to insure employee receives the medical treatment necessary and asked Mr. Finkbiner to follow up. Finkbiner assured Blad he would contact KWORK and get answers.

Road and Bridge Administrator Scott Finkbiner presented his weekly update.

1) He requested a purchase amount on the crane from PurpleWave. The final day to bid will be May 22. Freight estimate to have the crane delivered \$4500.00.

Commissioner Rytych moved to allow Finkbiner to bid up to \$60,000 on the crane; the combined value of the crane, bidder fees and freight not to exceed \$70,000. Bergstrom 2<sup>nd</sup>, agreed.

- 2) Board gave Finkbiner permission to purchase a Landpride mower from C & W Supply with a free set of blades for \$9,900.00. This will be picked up this week.

- 8) Discussion about the bridge located on 250 road near Frank Popelka is being reviewed.

Health Administrator Marcia Hansen, Sister Mary Savoie and Doane Sells, asked Board to consider a donation to the Master Trails Committee to fund the new sidewalk through the Fairgrounds coming from the City Park to promote wellness of Republic County residents and safety during the NCK Free Fair.

There are three phases presented. 1) Sidewalk from the park to the new Methodist Food stand. 2) From the Methodist Food stand north to the Floral hall. 3) From the Methodist Food stand south to the Kiddy Barn. Board tabled this discussion until all the commissioners are present.

- 4) Road and Bridge department is fully staffed after hiring 2 summertime part-time persons.
- 5) Finkbiner will be visiting with KDOT about purchasing hot mix for roads and Hall Brothers for use of the laydown machine to apply hot mix. Finkbiner will supply Board with estimate of needed tonnage for roads and the cities that have requested.
- 6) Employee that was on medical leave is back to work.
- 7) An Electric Cable Agreement was presented to grant Charles Popelka permission to construct and operate an underground electrical line on Sec 26, T2S, and R3W.

Blaine Miller Hospital Administrator and Deb Hadachek presented information requesting an increase in mill levies for the hospital. Board agreed there were still radios available and yes businesses/city offices could purchase them.

Health Administrator Marcia Hansen thanked the Board for the County donation to the Master Trails Committee for sidewalks on the Fair Grounds.

EMS Director Blaine VanMeter presented a quote a new 2014 Ambulance from Osage for an amount of \$142760.00. ## REPUBLIC COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS' MINUTES Monday, June 10, 2013

The Republic County Governing Board met in regular session on Monday, June 10<sup>th</sup>, 2013, at 8:30 a.m. Commissioners present were Linda Holl, Frank Rytych and Marvin Bergstrom. Beth Reed was present to record the minutes of the meeting in the absence of County Clerk, Kathleen Marsicek.

Commissioner Holl called the meeting to order at 8:30 a.m.

Pastor Kathy Aeillo offered the morning prayer.

Deb Hadachek of the Belleville Telescope monitored a portion of the meeting.

Accounts Payable Vouchers were signed.

Barry Porter advised that his contract for the position of Appraiser of Republic County is due every four years and that a new contract will need to be completed to take effect as of July 1<sup>st</sup>, 2013. Mr. Porter presented to the Board wage scale comparisons with other counties the size of Republic County. The signing of this contract was tabled until Monday, June 24<sup>th</sup>, 2013, to allow time for further information.

Blaine VanMeter, EMS Director, advised that the time to apply for CDGB grants for 2013 has expired. The Commissioners advised VanMeter to begin on a CDGB grant for 2014 so that it would be in place when it came time for submitting grant applications, the paperwork would already be in place. This grant application would be submitted to help fund a new ambulance for Republic County. It was suggested to contact North Central Regional Planning Commission for help with writing the grant.

At 8:55 am, Mr. VanMeter requested a 10-minute Executive Session to discuss non-elected personnel. Holl moved, seconded by Rytych and made unanimous by Bergstrom that the meeting proceed into Executive Session. Meeting resumed at 9:05 am with no action taken by the Board.

It was moved, seconded and made unanimous that since Janice Dusek has completed her RN Degree, her wage would be increased to \$13.35 per hour, and as soon as she finishes the ACLS Course, another increase will be made to bring her salary to a comparable rate as other County nurses.

Discussion was held on the number of Weather Alert Radios that were left for purchase by the public. It was learned that there are approximately thirty radios left and could be purchased at the office of Emergency Management in the basement of the Courthouse.

At 9:08 am, Marlea James, County Attorney, and Ron Blad, County Sheriff, met with the Board to inform them of House Bill 2052, which has been signed into law by the State Legislature, regarding new regulations pertaining to allowing or not allowing concealed-carry weapons into the Courtroom and/or the Courthouse itself. Prior to making a policy on how this will be implemented, the Board would like to meet with our District Judge, County Sheriff, County Attorney, as well as the County's insurance company for input into how to comply with this new ruling. The County Clerk will set up a meeting with these individuals for discussion.

At 9:30 am the Conservation District, represented by Wayne Pachta, Lori Siemsen and Jerome Kieffer, presented a Budget request for 2014. This request will be considered when the 2014 County Budget is adopted.

Republic County Resolution 2013-25 was signed by the Board increasing the mill levy for the benefit of the Republic County Hospital from four (4) mills to six (6) mills.

Kay Shoemaker, representing the Republic County Development Committee, advised that the High Banks Hall of Fame, Inc. has paid the full loan received from the County Loan Fund through the Kansas Department of Commerce, and the Department of Housing and Urban Development.

Discussion was held concerning the funding to the Masters Trail Committee for the sidewalk project from the City Park throughout the Fairgrounds. Prior to designating the funds to use for payment of this project, the Board would like to visit with Fairgrounds personnel concerning any projects that they have pending or are expecting to initiate from the budgeted fairgrounds fund.

At 10:00 am Scott Finkbiner, Highway Administrator, met with the Board concerning various matters pertaining to his Department. Chairman Linda Holl, signed a document from the Kansas Department of Transportation, Bureau of Local Projects, stating that the County's share of federal funds exchange for 2013 is \$127,961.55.

Mr. Finkbiner submitted bids for repairing the county truck that was struck by a deer as follows:

Melton Motor Company	6,397.85

Dan's Auto Body was awarded the work for the lowest bid of \$4,257.48 to repair the truck.

The crane that was purchased on Purple Wave has been received, but not in the condition that was advertised. There are several issues to resolve and Mr. Finkbiner has a scheduled Conference Call on this date at 1:00 pm to discuss the discrepancies on the inspection report.

Permission was granted to advertise for an equipment operator as well as a mechanic.

The County is required to once a year file a Post-Closure Landfill form, setting forth the amount it would cost to close out our Landfill should this become necessary. Mr. Finkbiner is working on this document to be submitted to the Kansas Department of Health and Environment. County personnel will be allowed to file this form for year 2013, but in all future years, the County will need to hire an Engineer to determine these costs.

Fair Board members, Rhonda Blecha and James Popelka along with Master Trails committee members, Sister Mary Savoie, Marcia Hansen and Doane Sells attended the meeting. Board signed Lease Agreement by and between the Republic County Board of County Commissioners and Jerry Strnad to own and operate an Omni-directional antenna tower and related equipment located Section 1, Township 2, Range 3.

Barry Porter presented his contract, Resolution 2013-30 for approval. Porter's current salary of \$31,500.00 will remain until December 31, 2013. In the past years, Porter has received 50% of the increase his department employees received, however; in December 2012 for the 2013 year the Board approved an 85% increase. Board will review an increase when all other annual increases are set.

Commissioner Holl made a motion to approve the request to use the courthouse lawn for water games sponsored by Belleville Library and 4-H Ambassadors on July 11. Rytych 2<sup>nd</sup> agreed 3-0.

Custodian Kevin Calkins explained 2 air conditioners were being removed today and 2 on Tuesday in preparation to the new windows being installed starting July 8.

County Treasurer Cindy Coons updated the Board the state sales tax changed July 1. The new rate is 6.15%, so Republic County sales tax will be 8.15% instead of 8.3%.

Register of Deeds, Peggy Frint, is now a certified Register of Deeds in the state of Kansas. She was presented her official plaque at Register of Deeds Conference June 27.

Board discussed the budget for the commissioners for 2014; consensus was not to increase any line items for their department.

AT 8:55 am, Chairperson Holl called for executive session to discuss non-elected personnel with clerk Marsicek. Bergstrom 2<sup>nd</sup> agreed 3-0.

Board reconvened at 9:00 am taking no action.

Jenny Pachta, Blair Center for the Arts, requested funding for Drug, Alcohol and Bulling presentation by the Wichita Children's' Theater being held in November to K-8 students from Republic County and Pike Valley at the Belleville Blair Theater in the amount of \$2900.00. Pachta explained in the past she has requested monies from Duclos foundation and would again if funds were not available through the county. Last year 630 students attended a production held at the Blair Theater for students.

Chairman Holl moved to accept the request from Blair Center for the Arts in the amount of \$2900.00 from the Drug and Alcohol Fund for funding the Drug, Alcohol and Bulling presentation. Bergstrom 2<sup>nd</sup> agreed 3-0.

Highway Administrator Scott Finkbiner presented his weekly report:

- 1) Estimate to repair the master brake system on the new crane is \$5,000-7,000 the estimate will be presented to Purplewave Auction and seller.
- 2) Employees currently need a CDL to work in the Road and Bridge Dept. Since not every employee drives heavy equipment that requires a "A" CDL, Finkbiner requested they have a "B" class CDL but would prefer "A" class CDL.
- 3) Five (5) stop signs were damaged over the weekend near Lincoln and 240 rd. Three signs were taken.
- 4) High Plains construction has scheduled hot mix for Republic County but it will not be available until the last week of July or 1<sup>st</sup> of August.
- 5) The 55 M.P.H speed limits signs were discussed going out of city limits of Munden and Narka. Finkbiner will review which towns do not currently have speed limit signs leaving the towns and have them installed.
- 6) The survey letter for the Republic city and rural area of Republic City has been sent to the Republic City Clerk to be mailed and returned as soon as possible for governmental funding requirements for the Republican River Bridge at Republic.
- 7) Kelvin Blecha has estimates for 5 projects at the fair grounds and Finkbiner will be working with Blecha on these projects.
- 8) The KDOT bridge auditor was concerned about the excess dirt on the bridge located 140 Rd north of 148 Hwy. The dirt has been removed and bridge deck repaired.

Tom Parker from the Washington County newspaper called to ask what Republic County agreed to spend on the ROZ program. Washington County commissioners were discussing the possibility of signing up for ROZ Program during their meeting Monday morning July 1. Commissioner Rytych explained our agreed to share \$3000.00 to support 2 applicants.

Health Administrator, Marcia Hansen, presented the sealed bids on the 1994 Chevy Cavalier advertised for sale. There was only bid submitted from Hoge construction for \$600.00. Hansen will contact Hoge and sign over the title.

Hansen presented Agreement NO. #3 for Public Health Emergency Preparedness (PHEP) grant in the amount of \$9164.00.

District Court clerk, Kris Kling, voiced her concern about lack of communication between departments concerning the powering down of equipment prior to power being shut off during the window replacement project. Her department must leave their computers up 24/7 to receive updates from the state and other counties. When power is shut off, even though they have temporary backup, they may lose transmitted information or experience computer problems. Her department along with all departments must be informed ahead of time whenever the power is being shut off.

Mary Gustin stated it would just be common courtesy if each department would be contacted in advance of work being disrupted because of power outages.

The commissioners stated they would ask Mr. Calkins to notify departments prior to working in their areas and take necessary steps to keep regular working schedules as uninterrupted as possible.

Michal Hadachek, Kay Shoemaker, Luke Mahin, Keith Anderson, and Jimmie Blecha from the Republic County Economic Development committee, recommended the Board approve the application to E Community Group in the amount of \$75,000. These funds will come from tax credits sold in Republic

County and will be used for new loan applications to RCD and Economic Development that do not meet their specific requirements.

Commissioner Rytych motioned approval of the application to E Community Group requesting \$75,000 in funding of tax credits. Bergstrom 2<sup>nd</sup> agreed 3-0. Luke Mahin will complete the application process on behalf of Economic Development.

County Clerk, Kathleen Marsicek was present to record the minutes of the meeting. Debbie Hadachek of the Belleville Telescope monitored a portion of the meeting.

Commissioner Holl called the meeting to order at 8:30 a.m.

Pastor Roger Walls, Republic United Methodist Church, offered Morning Prayer.

Commissioner Holl moved minutes from July 8, 2013 accepted, Rytych 2<sup>nd</sup>, agreed 3-0.

Commissioners approved vouchers totaling \$339,033.79

Board received word from the County Auditor and KCAMP Attorney Cowan that smoking cessation did not meet the requirements for Drug and Alcohol funding. Candace Fielder was notified her request has been denied.

The Budget for 2014 for the District Court was reviewed and approved for \$79,600.00 same as 2013.

Board signed Interlocal Agreement and Contract between Republic County Board of Commissioners and Cloud County Board of Commissioners and Barry Porter, a Certified Appraiser.

Nancy Holt from Republic County Historical Society presented their budget for \$68,800.00 for information only and thanked everyone that attended their annual Ice Cream Social July 14, 2013. Holt shared information about the US HWY 36 construction plans for 2014 stating their road sign will have to be taken down until construction is completed. The BOCC will be contacting Leland Tice, KDOT, about the construction details.

Custodian Kevin Calkins told the Board the window replacement is coming along. Glass Services is trying to replace at least 4 windows a day. They started on the south side of the courthouse and should have that side completed this week.

Road and Bridge Administrator Scott Finkbiner presented

- 1) Updated TMHC Drug and Alcohol Policy to meet FTA/KDOT changes. The Board of Commissioners approved and Clerk will fax signed and approved documents to TMHC.
- 2) Two contracts with KDOT for approvals of detours around US 36 (36-79KA 2188-01), HWY 148 (148-79KA 2472-01) were signed and approved by BOCC.
- 3) Permission to travel July 23 to Transportation Meeting for Lisa Jones and Scott Finkbiner-granted
- 4) BOCC signed an agreement between the Board of Commissioners and City of Scandia concerning collection and payment of solid waste fees.
- 5) Prices were presented for tarps for all dump trucks which included electrical and manual covering. BOCC approved the purchase of tarp systems for all county dump trucks.
- 6) Concerned about losing employees to higher paying companies.
- 7) Presented information on a Wildkat Side Shift Industrial Boom Mower
- 8) Purplewave has offered to reimburse Republic County \$2,000 for repairs to the 50 Ton Crane repairs. The offer has been accepted for \$2000.00.
- 9) Road vacating was discussed and the paperwork and notification will begin for Queen Road between 170 and 180 road.
- 10) BOCC approved the purchase of a new welder and Air Compressor/generator for service truck.

Judge Cudney explained there will be an armed security person in her courtroom during each court session and "NO CONCEALED WEAPONS" will be allowed.

Each County will have until January 1, 2014 to develop a plan for exemption for the next 4 years and a resolution stating a security plan of adequate security measure.

The Board discussed with Sheriff Blad the need for additional funding in his budget for 2014. Blad will update his
budget request to include additional staff and equipment.

Upon returning to Republic County Courthouse at 3:00 pm, Commissioner Holl moved meeting adjourned, Rytych 2<sup>nd</sup> agreed.

The Republic County Governing Board in Belleville, Kansas met in regular session on Monday, July 22, 2013 at 8:30 a.m. Commissioners present were Linda Holl, Frank Rytych and Marvin Bergstrom. County Clerk, Kathleen Marsicek was present to record the minutes of the meeting. Debbie Hadachek of the Belleville Telescope monitored a portion of the meeting.

Commissioner Holl called the meeting to order at 8:30 a.m.

Lay pastor Deb Hadachek, Beloit United Presbyterian Church, offered Morning Prayer.

Commissioner Holl moved minutes from July 15, 2013 accepted as amended, Rytych 2<sup>nd</sup>, agreed 3-0.

Justin Ferrell, KCAMP attorney, assured the Board, Republic County coverage will NOT be affected by the conceal carry laws regarding regular insurance and liability. The gray area of liability is in regard to employees that carry concealed weapon and may discharge it outside of their regular job duties however; these would be evaluated on a case by case situation. Since Republic County has filed an exemption to HB2052, Republic County will need to develop a plan of security by January 1, 2014. If the county allows conceal carry of the general public, any person questioned about carrying must produce a conceal carry permit. In the courtroom, there will be guards as per the District courts request.

Sheriff Ron Blad explained additional personnel and equipment will be necessary to comply with the new conceal carry regulations.

Deputy Clerk Cheryl Loring presented the preliminary budget reports from our auditor for review. Auditor Randy Hofmeier will be present next Monday July 29.

Chairperson Holl presented Resolution 2013-32, creating a building fund necessary for the enhancement, extension and restoration of the value and utility of public buildings of Republic County not to exceed one (1) mill for a period of ten (10) years, for review and action.

Commissioner Holl moved Resolution 2013-32 be accepted. Bergstrom 2<sup>nd</sup> agreed 3-0.

Health Administrator Marcia Hansen explained why the voucher for Bev Lapo included mileage reimbursement instead of using county car. No Health Department vehicle was available the day she attended training.

Leland Tice, KDOT from Mankato, Dr. Rick Holloway, and Nancy Holt-Republic County Museum Director were present to discuss the plans KDOT has for the US Hwy 36 improvements along the business area between US 81 and S Street. The plans are to change US Hwy 36 from a four lane to a three lane in this section starting sometime in the spring of 2014 and hopefully be finished in a year depending on the weather. The curb, gutter and storm sewers will be replaced leaving 4' shoulder, 12' westbound lane, 16' turning lane, 12' eastbound lane and 4' shoulder. The original width of the road will not change. An access road will be built on the north side of the current highway for traffic while the road is under construction. The access road will be located across private property of each business but will be removed when construction is completed.

Jimmie Blecha, Mayor of Munden requested an update on the railroad cars located west of Munden. Commissioner Holl informed him the owners have not returned our call but she would continue to pursue this matter. Blecha asked if the blacktop road south of Munden will be sealed this year and Finkbiner stated he did not think it would be done this year.

Road and Bridge Administrator Scott Finkbiner presented his weekly report.

- -JBN Telephone Co, Inc to construct and operate underground Fiber Optic Cable Commencing on Agenda Lane North 1 mile to Union Rd thence west 5.5 miles from K148 to 220 Rd 1 mile south to north side of K148
- -Lyle Schardt to construct and operate underground electrical line commencing 1/8 mile west of 50<sup>th</sup> Rd to Ash thence crossing from Section 3;T1S;R8W
- 2) Finkbiner shared an email from Leland Tice-stating KDOT wishes to partner with Republic County and will furnish the minimal amount of RAP needed for the Asphalt Hot Mix which Republic County will be purchasing from APAC.
- 3) Cloud County wants Republic County to assist on a bridge replacement located between roads 190 and 200 on the Cloud County/Republic County line. The commissioners will visit that location during the next regular meeting July 29 before making any commitment.
- 4) Road closing signs are posted on Queen Road between 170 and 180 Roads. The process requirement has been started to close this one mile of roadway.
- 5) High Plains is moving equipment and supplies to Republic County west yard to start mixing 4000 tons of cold asphalt mix.
- 6) Re-grade of 220 Road 2 miles north of Munden will begin the week of July 29.
- 7) Half-mile of re-grade work on old 81 will be completed this week, (6 miles south of US Hwy 36).

- 1) Discussion about recycling and delivery of recycled items to Washington brought up possibility that in the future each city in the county might deliver their recycle goods instead of the county incurring the expense. Finkbiner will bring information next week to the Board for further review.
- 2) Maurice Gieber and Robert Morris voiced their concern about vacating the road between 170 and 180 on Queen Road. The bridge is closed because of damage and the expense to fix it at this time. Maurice asked the Board to look in to other

- options rather than closing the road. Finkbiner will get prices to put in a low water crossing or replace the bridge with tubes. When Finkbiner has acquired these items, he will set up a meeting with Gieber to discuss this information.
- 3) Finkbiner is researching rock/metal sorter with a magnet to sort metal debris from railroad rock.
- 4) Republic County highway department will maintain the road south and east of Hardy that Nuckolls County has been maintaining for the past several years.
- 5) Another county that uses the tire cutter, expressed it is very convenient and saved their county \$1000 a month but the tires take up landfill space. The Board is concerned about the price Republic County pays to Champlin's in Concordia for disposal of tires. Either Republic County refuses to allow tires at the landfill or persons will start being charged a fee per tire for disposal.
- 6) The new dump truck tarp is working great and Finkbiner is in the process of ordering 10 more from Carolina Tarp.

# REPUBLIC COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS' MINUTES Monday, August 19, 2013

The Republic County Governing Board in Belleville, Kansas met in regular session on Monday, August 19, 2013 at 8:30 a.m. Commissioners present were Linda Holl, Marvin Bergstrom and Frank Rytych. County Clerk, Kathleen Marsicek, was present to record the minutes of the meeting. Debbie Hadachek of the Belleville Telescope monitored a portion of the meeting.

Commissioner Holl called the meeting to order at 8:30 a.m.

Pastor Roger Walls, United Methodist Church of Republic, offered Morning Prayer.

Commissioner Holl moved minutes from August 12, 2013 accepted, Bergstrom 2<sup>nd</sup>, agreed 3-0.

Brian Schultz, Belleville City Police Department, requested \$3000 from the Drug and Alcohol Fund for supplies and equipment to present programs in the local schools about impaired and distracted driving. Schultz presented this program a few years ago with borrowed equipment from a local insurance agency. His group (NCK Pride) would like to purchase their own equipment so it would be available anytime they presented the program. The Board would like more information about NCK Pride and their planned programs before approving the funding. Schultz will return next Monday, August 26, with others from the NCK Pride and supply the information.

Jenny Pachta from USD 109 C.A.R.E.S requested funding from the Drug and Alcohol Fund to promote "Creating Leadership Cultures in Schools" by Nick Lowery. This program challenges students to stand up against drug and alcohol use and bullying and to become leaders in their schools. Lowery Foundation fees total \$2000 each presentation; however, since Pachta would like to present it to both schools in the county, Lowery agreed to lower the second presentation to \$1500. Pachta stated the program would be presented to the entire student body of the Republic County schools and again at the Pike Valley schools. She is checking to see if a combined program could be presented at the Blair and the fee would remain \$2000.

Chairperson Holl made a motion to use up to \$3500 of the Drug and Alcohol funds to promote "Creating Leadership Cultures in Schools" by Nick Lowery. Bergstrom 2<sup>nd</sup>, agreed 3-0.

Commissioner Rytych motioned for the acceptance of Resolution 2013-36, a resolution expressing the property taxation policy of the Board of County Commissioners with respect to financing the 2014 annual budget for Republic County. Bergstrom 2<sup>nd</sup> agreed 3-0.

Permission to travel was granted for Barry Porter to attend the required educational IAAO Course, Appraisal of Agricultural Land, in Manhattan on Sept 24-26.

Permission to travel was granted for Deborah Eitzmann to attend the Personal Property Guide Meeting in Salina on Sept 26.

The Board signed agreements concerning collection and payment of solid waste fees between the Board of County Commissioners of Republic County and the following cities; Republic, Narka, Courtland and Belleville.

County Health Administrator, Marcia Hansen, invited the Board to attend a workshop held in Russell County on September 12 at the Dole-Specter Conference Center for County Commissioners to learn more about their roles and responsibilities as a local board of health. The workshop is sponsored by KAC along with the Kansas Association of Local Health Departments so counties can ensure that public health services are delivered efficiently and effectively at the local level.

Hansen asked permission for two Health Department employees attend training sessions in September.

Permission was granted for Linda Wendt to attend a billing meeting in Lincoln on September 11.

Permission was granted for Kathy Zach to attend the Kansas Homecare Association Conference in Lawrence on September 16 and 17.

Road and Bridge Administrator Scott Finkbiner presented his weekly report.

- 1) Presented the Board with an agreement to dissolve the agreement written in 1995 with Nuckolls County Highway Department wherein Nuckolls County Highway had been maintaining the first two miles of county road south of the Nebraska/Kansas border on 10 Rd.
- 2) Presented the Board for approval and signing the Memorandum of understanding regarding E-Waste through 2013.
- 3) Don Dean from KDOT explained to the Board the costs involved with installing a low water crossing on Queen Road between 170 and 180 roads. The structure would be 200' instead of 100' (current bridge length) and the cost could range from \$100,000 to \$125,000. He would recommend that the bridge be closed permanently or completely replaced but that would cost much more.
- 4) Railroad rock cleaning can be done by Hi-Plains Sand for \$210 per hour at a rate of 150 ton per hour. Republic County has an estimated 3000 plus ton of rock currently stock piled that can be cleaned. The Board requested Finkbiner contract the cleaning so the rock can be used with less metal debris. The iron cleaned out of the rock will be sold for scrap metal price.
- 5) Champlin Tire charges Republic County \$1.25 per regular car/pickup tire, \$4.00 for semi tires, \$21.00 for tractor tires, and \$45 for loader/scraper tires. The consensus of the Board is to start charging per tire that is disposed at the landfill effective January 1, 2014 at the same rate Champlin Tire charges us to dispose of the tires. During any county cleanup, NO tires will be allowed.
- 6) Interviewed several persons for the three open positions.
- 7) Finkbiner stated the persons he has interviewed voiced concern about the low starting wage and Finkbiner feels if we raise the starting wage for the road and bridge department he would have more qualified applications. The Board asked what he felt the starting wage to draw qualified applicants should be. Chairperson Holl motioned the starting wage in road and bridge department be raised to \$11.00 per hour and all employees hired since January 1, 2013 and all full time employees wages in that department that are below that amount be raised to \$11.00 starting the next pay period. All other employees' wages will be reviewed at their annual evaluation. Annual raises are based on the employees' work ethic, attendance and overall work performance. Rytych 2<sup>nd</sup>, agreed 3-0.
- 8) Documentation is in progress to identify all areas of damage from the last rain storm across the county. The water damage will be in the thousands of dollars in cost to the county.
- 9) Asphalt overlay and repairs to the Cuba road will be completed this week.

At 11:30 am, the Board, Finkbiner and Clerk Marsicek left the courthouse to inspect current bridge improvements and damaged bridges in the southeastern part of Republic County.

The Board, Finkbiner and Marsicek returned to the Republic County Courthouse at 12:50 pm. Clerk Marsicek will contact Maurice Gieber to request his attendance at the next commissioners meeting to discuss the damaged bridge on Queen Road.

The agenda items being completed, Commissioner Bergstrom moved meeting adjourned, Rytych 2<sup>nd</sup>, agreed 3-0.

Permission to travel was granted for Clerk Kathleen Marsicek and Deputy Cheryl Loring to attend KPERS Fall Workshop in Beloit on October 31.

Kevin Calkins, custodian, updated the Board on the window project. The south side is complete. The upper portion of the replacement windows on all floors on the north, east and west sides of the regular size windows is complete. The bottom portion or vent windows should be completed this week. Calkins asked the Board if equipment from Road and Bridge, boom truck or crane, could be used to lift down the metal design in the front windows. The weight of the metal design is too heavy for the lift equipment used by Glass Services. The Board will approach Finkbiner during his scheduled time for an answer to this request.

Schultz is part of NCK PPRIDE and is requesting \$3000 from the Drug and Alcohol Fund for supplies and equipment to present these programs. All the equipment will remain in the sheriff's department when not in use.

Chairperson Holl made the motion to give \$3000.00 to NCK Pride. Rytych 2<sup>nd</sup> agreed.

Sheriff Blad requested clarification of courthouse security in regards to conceal carry regulations as of January 1, 2014. The Board stated only the second floor with the courtroom will require the added security.

Maurice Gieber and Gerald Holmberg attended to voice their concerns about the road closure on Queen Road between 170 and 180 Roads where the bridge has been closed. Gieber and Holmberg use this road and would like to see the bridge fixed or a low water crossing put in. Finkbiner explained KDOT engineer requested the bridge be closed and stay closed. The estimates to put a low water crossing would cost \$125,000 or more. A replacement bridge would cost \$300,000 or more. The Board agreed with KDOT recommendation and will proceed with the vacating of Queen Road between 170 Road and 180 Road.

- 1) Finkbiner will contact Kevin Calkins about the needs for the boom truck or crane. Finkbiner feels the boom truck would be his choice because the weight of the crane.
- 2) Permission to travel for Scott Finkbiner and Lisa Jones to Transportation Meeting in Salina on August 28 was granted.
- 3) Finkbiner requested the HR department to notify Lisa whenever an employee is hired or dismissed so their name can be added or removed from the random drug testing.

The price for the program is \$500 per year with upgrades and his department would have a standalone version whenever the county canceled the yearly license. The consensus of the Board is to allow Raney to purchase the software system.

Road and Bridge Administrator Scott Finkbiner presented his weekly report.

- 1) Finkbiner presented the 2013 final bridge inspection report from Campbell & Johnson Engineering.
- 2) Permission to travel was granted to Finkbiner to attend MINK conference in St. Joseph, MO on September 25-26, regarding DOT and FHWA Safety Improvements.

Sherry Koster, County Sanitarian, and Marcia Hansen, County Health Administrator, presented the Biannual reports regarding county match, registration fees, waste water and well permits totaling \$4,425.00 and LEPGMO report, 2013.

Health Administrator, Marcia Hansen, reported on the workshop sponsored by KAC along with the Kansas Association of Local Health Departments she attended in Russell. Hansen presented each board member with a packet of information from the workshop and she will set another time to explain the information. She stated Republic County Board of Commissioners must hold a Board of Health meeting once a year to be compliant with the Kansas State Board of Health. Hansen also requested permission to travel to Kansas Immunization Conference in Wichita on Oct 16-17. Permission was granted.

Hansen asked if the Board was planning on attending the Kansas Association of Counties (KAC) meeting held October 29-31. At the present time, no commissioners will be available, but the workshops offered would provide good information for anyone wanting to attend.

Chase Brown, Liberty National Life Insurance, explained the different insurance policies his business can offer our employees. These insurance policies would be payroll deductible- Accidental death, Term Life, Cancer, Accident and Intensive Care. Brown would like at least three persons to sign up. Brown will meet with Clerk Marsicek at 1:00 pm to fill out group information.

EMS Director, Blaine Van Meter, presented a sample contract to be completed and signed next week regarding the Paramedic training VanMeter is receiving and work agreement for Republic County once the training is completed. At 9:45 am, Commissioner Holl requested an executive meeting for 5 minutes with the Board, Van Meter and Clerk Marsicek to discuss non-elected personnel. Rytych 2<sup>nd</sup>, agreed 3-0.

Commissioner Holl made a motion to remove 4 part-time  $1^{st}$  Responders from the random drug testing list since these persons are not on the regular payroll for ambulance duties. Rytych  $2^{nd}$ , agreed 3-0.

Road and Bridge Administrator, Scott Finkbiner, and EMS Director, Blaine Van Meter met with the Board to discuss where drug and alcohol test is to be preformed. In the April 8<sup>th</sup>, 2013 meeting, a solution was discussed but no action was taken stating the EMS employees would be tested at the EMS station and all other departments would be tested at Road and Bridge Office. After more discussion, the Consensus of the Board of Commissioners is that ALL drug testing will be held at the Road and Bridge Office where the Designated Employee Representative is located.

Road and Bridge Administrator Scott Finkbiner presented his weekly report.

- 1) Finkbiner reported someone had vandalized the excavator by placing pine needles and tree bark in the diesel fuel tank. The sheriff's department will be investigating the incident and the insurance company will be contacted for a claim.
- 2) Finkbiner will contact all mayors of the cities in Republic County asking them to attend a commissioners meeting to discuss the recycle program and solutions to continue to recycle items in our county.
- 3) Schwab-Eaton, the inspection firm will meet with Finkbiner regarding the 23<sup>rd</sup> street bridge on September 24, 2013.
- 4) There are three bridges in Republic County that are incorrectly posted for weight limits, the correct weight limit signs will be installed.
- 5) A letter from KDOT has not been received regarding the funding dollar amount for 2013 and 2014 for the Republican River Bridge at Republic.
- 6) One of the graders needs repaired and Finkbiner said by having the county mechanic do the work it will save the county around \$3000 instead of taking the grader to the manufacturer.
- 7) The county will start sealing the Cuba asphalt road south to Hwy 148 and around the old high school on the east and north of Cuba to US Hwy 36 on October 1.
- 8) Finkbiner looked at the used recycle trailer at Byron for the possibility to purchase for the recycle program. This would allow the cities to have more flexibility with the recycling efforts.

The Board discussed the new regulations from Healthcare Affordability Act and employment hours for part time persons. Commissioner Bergstrom made a motion that all part time help will be 20 hours a week except for EMS' and Sheriff's department where it will be 24 hours. Rytych 2<sup>nd</sup>, agreed 3-0.

Commissioner Bergstrom was excused at 11:30 for personal reasons.

Commissioner Holl moved meeting adjourned, Rytych 2<sup>nd</sup>, agreed 2-0.

Acting Chairperson, Marvin Bergstrom, called the meeting to order at 8:30 a.m.

Minutes of the September 23<sup>rd</sup> meeting were approved on motion of Commissioner Rytych and seconded by Commissioner Bergstrom.

Deputy County Clerk, Cheryl Loring, met with the Commissioners to explain the issues that could occur if the County were to approve adding Liberty National Insurance as a provider of Life Insurance as another deduction from our payroll process. We already offer Life Insurance options to our employees and adding one more would just add more paperwork for the payroll clerk, as well as new software would be needed to expand to include the extra information.

Sheriff Ron Blad presented a Payroll Change form to include Kathy Calkins as the receptionist/secretary to fill the position that is soon to be vacated by Brandi Larson.

Arlene Clayton stopped by briefly.

Permission to Travel was granted to Blaine VanMeter, EMS Director, to attend the Northwest Kansas Educational Services Center (NKESC) in Oakley, Kansas on October 12<sup>th</sup> and 13<sup>th</sup>, 2013, which training is mandated for TO-I & TO-II certified techs. Also, permission was granted to Mr. VanMeter to attend the KEMSA Management Work Shop for Region #4 to be held in Newton, Kansas on October 16<sup>th</sup> & 17<sup>th</sup>, and again on October 30<sup>th</sup> & 31<sup>st</sup>.

At 9:00 a.m., Chase Brown from Liberty National Insurance Company called to discuss and request that his company be allowed to offer a life insurance policy option to our employees and offer this as a payroll deduction. The Commissioners advised Mr. Brown that as we already offer life insurance options as payroll deductions, it would not be feasible to offer yet another life insurance policy. The

Commissioners would have no problem if Mr. Brown would like to sell life insurance to our employees, but that it would be on a one-to-one basis and not go through our payroll process.

Deb Hadachek from the Belleville Telescope monitored a portion of the meeting.

Jenny Pachta, representing the Blair Theatre, reported that 700 people (students and teachers) attended the program given by Nick Lowery, a former Kansas City Chief's player who was inducted in 2009 to the Kansas City Chief's Hall of Fame. Mr. Lowery spoke on the subject of bullying. Ms. Pachta thanked the Commissioners for the financial help the Board gave to help bring Mr. Lowery to Belleville.

Kevin Calkins, Courthouse custodian, advised the Board that the new Judge, Starla Nelson, had requested that her office be repainted prior to November 1<sup>st</sup> when she begins her position of District Magistrate Judge. - 5) Finkbiner met with Neil Lewis and Brian Philips regarding roads/streets shared by Republic County and the City of Belleville to determine which group is responsible for these areas.
- 6) An additional mechanic is being offered a position and upon passing the drug test and physical capacity testing he can begin work.
- 7) Currently, the out of town transportation bus is not operating until a new driver is hired. A help wanted ad for a permanent part-time driver will be in the paper this week.
- 8) Finkbiner reminder the Commissioners, TMHC will be in Belleville on October 9 for Drug and Alcohol training for supervisors and employees at 702 K Street.
- 9) With the 1.7" to 4" of rain last week, the gravel on several roads north and west of Munden was washed off and needs replaced. Finkbiner will apply for FEMA assistance with the gravel replacement.
- 10) There will be a meeting on the recycling program for all cities in Republic County on October 14 at 10:00 am in the Republic County Commissioners Office.

#### REPUBLIC COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS' MINUTES MONDAY, OCTOBER 14, 2013

The Republic County Governing Board met in regular session in Belleville, Monday, October 14, 2013 at 8:30 a.m. Commissioners present were Linda Holl and Marvin Bergstrom. Absent was Commissioner Frank Rytych. Kathleen Marsicek, Republic County Clerk, was present to record the minutes.

Others attending a portion of the meeting were: Gary Cline, Jimmie Blecha, Harold and Karen Wilbur, Mike Charles, Kent Kalivoda, Neil Lewis, Roger Stephens, Nathan Svoboda, Bentley Parker, Mabel Woodman and Deb Hadachek.

Commissioner Holl called the meeting order.

Pastor Phil Goombi, Little Blue River Parish offered morning prayer.

The Board approved vouchers totaling \$340,911.49.

Cindy Coons, Republic County Treasurer, proposed "Pooled Money Investment Board" as a backup financial institution if our local banks for some reason could not handle the funds on hand in excess of current needs. Auditor, Randy Hofmeier had suggested the county have a backup institution to handle any excess of current needs.

Chairperson Holl moved Resolution 2013-39 to be adopted approving an account in the name of Republic County established with Pooled Money Investment Board (PMIB). The purpose of this account is transmitting funds for investment in the event local financial institutions are unable to handle the excess funds of current needs. Bergstrom 2<sup>nd</sup>, agreed.

Custodian, Kevin Calkins, presented only one bid for 7 air conditioners to replace the window units. The board advised Calkins to contact the other local businesses as a reminder the bids need to be submitted by October 25<sup>th</sup>.

Calkins asked the Board if businesses were going to be allowed to decorate the courthouse lawn for the holiday season. The consensus of the board is to have Calkins place the advertising on the radio stating the courthouse lawn would be available for any business or group to set up a holiday display.

Commission Holl moved permission to be granted to Phyllis Jensik and the Belleville Arts Council to use the North Side of the front Courthouse steps to display pumpkins for the Painted Pumpkin Contest on October 31. Bergstrom 2<sup>nd</sup> agreed.

Mayors and community persons from Scandia, Republic, Munden, Narka, Agenda and Belleville were present to discuss the countywide recycling program. Finkbiner presented three items he wanted to accomplish in the meeting with the community persons. 1) Is each city capable of moving the recycle trailer to the recycle location? 2) Which cities could be combined together to use one trailer? 3) How many additional trailers would be necessary to accomplish this program change from the county to each city?

The Board does NOT want the recycle program to go; they want suggestions to make it work better and more efficiently. The major expense of the recycle program is transporting the trailer from town to town and to the recycle locations. This takes labor and trucks that could be better utilized on other jobs. If the county could supply each town with recycle trailer and extra bins for storage, could the towns be in charge of delivering the recycled items to the recycling locations?

Mayor Gary Cline from Scandia stated his council has discussed this possibility and would be in favor of Scandia taking care of their trailer and goods but they do not want to share with another town. Cline feels Scandia has enough items to fill the trailer and if the trailer were available 7 days a week more people would recycle. Cline would like a list of contact persons and phone numbers in Mankato, Concordia and Washington to set up deliveries.

Types of items that can be recycled at this time are cardboard, plastic bottles, and aluminum cans. Cardboard takes up the most space. Food Mart and Scotts rent a baler to bale their cardboard. If a baler was located centrally located then it could be used by all communities, could it aid in the recycle program? This suggestion will be looked into.

Harold Wilbur asked if there were any grants available to purchase the additional trailers. Commissioner Holl will search out this possibility. Wilbur asked where the money the county will be saving will be used if it is a budgeted item. Commissioner Holl explained the recycling program is part of the solid waste budget but is not actually a budgeted item. The funds will remain in landfill program.

Munden Mayor, Jimmie Blecha, stated about 1/3 of the recycled items collected in Munden come from rural residents not city residents. The fact that all residents are concerned about recycling is the key and each community needs to do their part. Munden and Narka would be willing to share a trailer and transportation to recycle location.

Agenda Mayor, Kent Kalivoda, stated Cuba and Agenda could share a trailer. His city councils meets tonight and he will discuss this information at that time.

Commissioner Holl asked all the mayor and town representatives to take this information back to their town meetings to discuss and return to the commissioners meeting on November 12 with firm decisions from their councils.

Finkbiner stated he would research the cost of 2-4 additional trailers and have that available at the next meeting. Currently, used trailers cost \$5,000 to \$12,000 each.

Finkbiner presented his weekly update on road and bridge matters.

- 1) An employee was involved in an accident south of Cuba on Tuesday Oct 8. The road broom was damaged but a rental will be used until the broom can be repaired. The insurance company from the at-fault vehicle will cover the rental fees.
- 2) An additional mechanic will start on October 21.
- 3) Two persons will be offered positions for operator 1 later this week.

At 11:28 a.m., Chairperson Holl requested executive session with the BOCC and Finkbiner for 10 minutes to discuss non-elected personnel. Bergstrom 2<sup>nd</sup>, agreed.

At 11:38 a.m., Board reconvened taking no action.

At 12:00 pm, Commissioner Holl moved Board meeting be adjourned, Bergstrom 2nd agreed.

Arlene Clayton briefly visited with the board.

- 5) President Obama signed the Kansas FEMA claim for damaged roads in Republic County in the amount of \$362,000.00
- 6) The estimates to repair the boom mower damaged in the accident October 8 range from \$14,000 to \$16,000 which will be covered by insurance.
- 7) Finkbiner presented a list of current employees on the random drug testing for review. The clerk will review the names and follow up with Lisa Jones at the highway department.
- 8) The old transportation bus will be advertised for sale by closed bids due by December 6 to be opened at the December 9 commissioners meeting.
- 9) Finkbiner will send emails to other counties searching for recycling trailers.
- 10) Instead of purchasing another transportation bus, Finkbiner would like permission to price a mini-van. The Board suggested Finkbiner research both and they would review his findings.
- 11) Four persons have applied for the part time driver of the out of town transportation bus. He will be setting up interviews.
- 12) Waterline agreement between Republic County Rural Water District II and Republic County was signed granting permission to construct and operate an underground waterline commencing 130 feet west of intersection at 220<sup>th</sup> & Fir Road thence from Section 33; T1S; R2W; in to Section 28; T1S;R2W.

There will be three parts to the seminar program. He is working with Pike Valley to set up a similar seminar in that school.

Commissioners Holl and Rytych will be attending the Annual Hospital board meeting at 12 noon.

Marcia Hansen, Health Administrator, discussed briefly her thoughts regarding transferring the county drug testing to her department. She would prefer the testing remain at the road and bridge office due to interruption time it would cause in daily work at the Health Department. Commissioner Bergstrom explained the Board was just looking at options and gathering feedback.

At 9:38 a.m., Commissioner Bergstrom requested an executive session for 8 minutes to discuss non-elected personnel wages with the Board and Cindy Coons. Rytych seconded, agreed.

The Board reconvened at 9:46 a.m. taking so action.

Commissioners Bergstrom and Rytych requested Deputy Clerk, Cheryl Loring, join the meeting in order to express their gratitude for her years of service. Cheryl Loring will be retiring on Friday, December 6 after 40 years of serving in many departments of Republic County.

Finkbiner presented his weekly update on road and bridge matters.

VanMeter would like to have fulltime staff but it just is not an option at this time.

Van Meter stated Don Lieb has officially retired as of December 1 and no replacement EMT or Paramedic has been hired at this time.

Van Meter has run help wanted ads for several weeks for EMTs/Paramedic with very few responses.

Danielle LeDoux, Fair Board secretary, invited the Board to attend a meeting at the Pizza Hut tonight, December 2, 2013.
