REPUBLIC COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS' MINUTES MONDAY, JANUARY 5, 2015

The Republic County Governing Board met in regular session on Monday, January 5, 2015 at 8:30 a.m. Commissioners present were Marvin Bergstrom, Linda Holl and Frank Rytych. County Clerk Kathleen Marsicek was present to record the minutes of the meeting. Commissioner Elect Edwin Splichal and Deb Hadachek monitored the meeting.

Commissioner Bergstrom called the meeting to order.

Lay Pastor Kathleen Marsicek, Little Blue River Parish, offered Morning Prayer.

Commissioner Rytych made a motion to accept the minutes from December 29. Holl seconded, agreed 3-0.

Kevin Calkins stated Tabernacle Church won the Christmas display on the courthouse lawn for 2014 and will be awarded \$100 in Chamber Bucks.

Calkins expressed his gratitude for the extra holidays and the food basket from the county.

A letter from the Friends of the Belleville City Library announced the winner of the "Friend of the Year award". The Republic County Commissioners and Kevin Calkins were selected as the group winner for 2014. The annual meeting of the Friends of the Library will be held on Sunday, January 25 when the winner will be recognized.

Peggy Frint, Register of Deeds, asked for an explanation why she did not receive the budgeted wages requested. The Board stated they take all requests into consideration but nothing is decided until December when reviews are completed. Commissioner Holl reviewed the current wages and experience for Frint and agreed they are considerably lower than many register of deeds throughout Kansas. Commissioner Holl suggested to raise Frints' wage proposal for 2015 from \$29,290 to \$31,200. Frint stated she has been working for Republic County since 1994 in the deeds office and the increase would be appreciated.

Commissioner Holl made a motion to accept Resolution 2015-1A to rescind Resolution 2014-37 and accept Resolution 2015-1 increasing the wage of the Register of Deeds for Republic County to \$31,200. Rytych seconded, agreed 3-0.

Kay Shoemaker, RCD Treasurer, announced that there would not be a meeting on January 7.

Scott Finkbiner along with Terry Cherney, Justin Novak and Lisa Jones presented the weekly update on road and bridge matters.

- 1) Novak, Cherney and Jones will work together to facilitate the workings of the Road and Bridge department. Finkbiner presented Justin Novak as the contact person at Road and Bridge until the Board hires a Highway Administrator.
 - a. Jones is the office manager and understands the reports, budgets and deadlines for Federal Grants. Cherney and Novak are the road supervisors who know the projects planned for 2015.
 - b. Finkbiner has explained to Novak, Cherney and Jones their responsibility in a smooth transition to a new administrator and the need to stay on top of equipment repairs and new purchases and annual reports on all bridges to KDOT.
 - c. Clerk Marsicek will review files on the Finkbiner computer relating to HR matters.
 - d. Novak and Cherney will report weekly to the Board just as Finkbiner has done as administrator.
- 2) Finkbiner has not heard any response on the grants from NCRPC regarding the Republican River Bridge at Republic or transportation grant from KDOT for a new bus.
- 3) Finkbiner reported more people are dumping trash on the road sides and outside the gate at the landfill. He suggested putting up game camera at the landfill and prosecuting any person recorded on the camera. If the

- county does not prosecute, putting up the cameras will not prevent persons from continuing to dump their trash where it does not belong.
- 4) The Commissioners thanked Finkbiner for his service to Republic County and commended him for the grants and funds he found for projects to reduce the county's financial responsibilities.
- 5) Finkbiner stated he would be available to answer any questions from the road and bridge crew.

At 11:55 a.m., Commissioner Holl requested an executive session for 5 minutes to discuss non-elect personnel with the Board, Splichal and Marsicek. Bergstrom seconded, agreed 3-0. An additional 5 minutes was requested by Holl and seconded by Rytych.

The Board reconvened at 11:05 a.m., taking no action.

Commissioner Holl presented a citation to Rytych from KCCOA for his years of service as a Commissioner.

Doug McKinney, North Central Regional Planning Commission (NCRPC), presented the flyer explaining NCRPC is a channel for federal or state program funding. Today the NCRPC serves 13 counties in Kansas. McKinney thanked Rytych for the years of service to Republic County and to NCRPC and served as Vice-Chair in 2014.

McKinney reported the approval of grants will published by the middle of January on the Kansas website and letters will be sent to recipients.

At 11:50 a.m., the Board moved the meeting to the District Courtroom for the swearing in of new Commissioner Edwin G Splichal.

The Board reconvened at the Commissioners' board room at 12:20 p.m.

Commissioner Holl moved the Board meeting be adjourned at 12:20. Bergstrom seconded, agreed 3-0.

A reception for the outgoing Commissioner Rytych and the incoming Commissioner Splichal was held from 1:00 to 3:00 in the Commissioners' board room.

REPUBLIC COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS' MINUTES MONDAY, JANUARY 12, 2015

The Republic County Governing Board met in regular session on Monday, January 12, 2015 at 8:30 a.m. Commissioners present were Linda Holl, Marvin Bergstrom and Edwin Splichal. County Clerk Kathleen Marsicek was present to record the minutes of the meeting. Deb Hadachek monitored the meeting.

Commissioner Bergstrom called the meeting to order and welcomed new 1st District Commissioner Edwin Splichal.

Kay Shoemaker, RCD Treasurer, presented the RCD program income report for KDOC for signing.

Pastor Mark Imel, Central Christian Church, Belleville, offered Morning Prayer.

Commissioner Holl made a motion to accept the minutes from January 5. Splichal seconded, agreed 3-0.

Accounts payable vouchers totaling \$334,650.00 were approved for payment.

Commissioner Bergstrom made a motion that Linda Holl become the Board Chairperson for 2015, Splichal seconded, agreed 3-0.

Cindy Coons, County Treasurer, presented the Treasurer's accounting report of funds as of 1/1/2015 totaling \$15,695,008.47. These funds are split throughout all the banks in the county and the Kansas Municipal Pool.

Sheriff Ron Blad presented a report from the 2nd floor body scanner. Blad stated reported that 22,680 persons passed through the scanner in 2014. The scanner counts only persons entering the restricted area. Metal was detected on 68% of the persons scanned. Of those 68%, only 5 persons had suspicious items which were secured in the sheriff's office.

At 8:40 a.m., Commissioner Bergstrom requested an executive session for 5 minutes to discuss non-elected personnel with the Board and Clerk Marsicek. Holl seconded, agreed 3-0.

The Board reconvened at 8:45 a.m. taking no action.

Commissioner Splichal suggested regular meetings with the department heads. Each department head would be assigned a time to meet with the Board during regular session to keep the commissioner informed of activities or concerns in that department. Clerk Marsicek will create a schedule and notify the department heads of their assigned times.

Clerk Marsicek stated her goal for 2015 is to set up regular department head meetings monthly.

Chairperson Holl suggested meetings with all city mayors and/or city managers. The Board wants to be aware of activities and problems involving all cities in Republic County. Clerk Marsicek will attend city council meetings in each city and invite mayors to attend a scheduled meeting with the Republic Board of Commissioners. These meetings will make the Commissioners aware of the needs of the cities.

Peggy Frint, Register of Deeds, presented a report of activity in the Deeds office during 2014.

- 418 Deeds recorded
- 205 Mortgages recorded
- 405 Other Documents recorded
- Total of \$98,937.40 deposited into County general

Melinda Pierson-Belleville Chamber and Mainstreet, Kelvin Blecha and James Popelka- Fair Board, Neil Lewis-Belleville City Manager, Gina Aurand-4-H Extension, and Rob Kasl joined the meeting to discuss using the Commercial building as a community center for Republic County. Aurand explained the 4-H building is needing some repairs and updates and the funds are available. However, there are activities that cannot be held in a building designated by the "4-H" sign including any activity where alcohol is served. If the county is remodeling the commercial building is there a need for the 4-H Building? Blecha stated that other towns have buildings used jointly by 4-H and fair activities with a hired person in charge of scheduling activities and maintenance.

Commissioner Holl feels that both buildings are needed at this time even if the commercial hall is remodeled it might be too large for some functions such as auctions that are held in the 4-H building. The discussion about remodeling and the cost is not available until design suggestions can be obtained. Aurand will contact K-State about a possible visit to the North Central Fair Grounds to suggest options for remodeling/repairing both buildings. This subject will be tabled until designs developed.

Scott Finkbiner along with Terry Cherney, Justin Novak and Lisa Jones presented the weekly update on road and bridge matters.

- 1) Finkbiner presented a Thank You to the Commissioners from the Road and Bridge department for the holiday food basket.
- 2) Finkbiner presented the annual agreement between Michael S. King, Secretary of Transportation, KDOT and Republic County, Kansas.
- 3) Scott and Justin met with Hi-Plains Sand regarding the necessary land to create an adequate mixing strip on US Hwy 36. It was decided an additional 8-9 acres should be sufficient.
- 4) Finkbiner has instructed Justin and Terry where to find reports and other important information in his computer.
- 5) Finkbiner contacted Dane Barclay from Alsop Sand Co. about the gravel prices for 2015. The Alsop gravel includes too much blow sand instead of larger gravel for a higher price than the Nebraska gravel. Barclay will be asked to join a meeting in the near future to review comparison samples.
- 6) Finkbiner asked if the Interim Supervisors will have any input into candidate hiring for the Road and Bridge Administrator. Chairperson Holl stated the Board will narrow the list of candidates, then discuss these with Justin and Terry but the ultimate decision will be made by the Board of Commissioners.

At 10:55 a.m., Commissioner Holl requested an executive session for 5 minutes to discuss non-elected personnel with Novak, Cherney and Clerk Marsicek. Bergstrom seconded, agreed 3-0.

The Board reconvened at 11:00 a.m. Commissioner Holl made a motion to increase Kyle Lervolds' hourly wage to \$13.00 based on outstanding work and meeting probationary requirements. Bergstrom seconded, agreed 3-0.

Marlea James, County Attorney, expressed her disappointment that the Telescope portrayed her and her department as not accomplishing their work. James explained to the Board, her department is responsible for many court cases that take several hours to prepare in addition to the juvenile in need of care cases, collection letters sent on behalf of the county for all departments and the tax sales. James states there have been eight tax sales in the last 38 years. She has prepared two prior to this year and is currently preparing another. Three of the tax sale preparations were outsourced totaling \$18,910 paid from County General Fund. There is no charge to County for tax sales prepared by the County Attorney however, it is very time consuming.

James says, court reports need to be filed promptly and correctly and her staff person has only been exposed to court terminology for a year. Hands on training including visiting the court and reviewing other files of cases is more economical than sending the staff out of county to train.

The consensus of the board gave James permission to request assistance from other departments to aid in completing the 2014 tax sale such as asking the sheriffs' officer to photograph properties or have another department prepare non-legal forms. Permission to hire assistance in tax sale preparation on future tax sales was granted.

Commissioner Holl moved the Board meeting be adjourned at 12:20. Splichal seconded, agreed 3-0.

The Republic County Governing Board met in regular session on Monday, January 19, 2015 at 8:30 a.m. Commissioners present were Linda Holl, Marvin Bergstrom and Edwin Splichal. County Clerk Kathleen Marsicek was present to record the minutes of the meeting. Deb Hadachek monitored the meeting.

Commissioner Holl called the meeting to order.

Pastor Roger Walls, United Methodist Church, Republic, offered Morning Prayer.

Commissioner Bergstrom made a motion to accept the minutes from January 12. Splichal seconded, agreed 3-0.

At 8:35 a.m., Commissioner Holl requested an executive session for 5 minutes to discuss non-elected personnel with the Board and Clerk Marsicek. Bergstrom seconded, agreed 3-0. An additional 5 minutes were requested by Holl seconded by Splichal, agreed 3-0.

The Board reconvened at 8:45 taking no action.

Cindy Coons, County Treasurer, asked for clarification regarding the Neighborhood Revitalization Program (NRP) rebate. Coons states that Part 6 Section G has conflicting information. Paragraph 1 says if the property owner is delinquent in payment of property taxes they are no longer eligible for tax rebates but in paragraph 2, it states the owner is late they shall not be eligible for rebate until such payments including interest and penalties have been made. After discussion with the appraiser, director of NRP, it was the consensus of the Board to remove paragraph 1.

Coons explained the sales tax money collected as of January 1, 2015 in the amount of \$1,272,267.65, will cover bond payments for 2015, 2016 and 2017. An estimate of \$40,000 could be collected each month and the balance of the bond money could be available by June 2017. The bond cannot be paid off early but the funds would be available.

Peggy Frint, Register of Deeds, revisited the possibility of starting e-recording deeds and mortgages in Republic County by using Simplifile. The Board requested that Frint contact the E-recording vendor and our computer service provider to make sure our computers and printer/scanner is capable of handling this process. Frint will contact both companies and will report back next week to the Board. Frint explained there are 36 Kansas Counties using E-Recording.

Commissioner Splichal reported there were commissioners from 50 Kansas counties at the new commissioner training in Topeka January 14-15. He thought many good ideas and suggestions were presented to the new commissioners.

Commissioner Holl made a motion to appoint Darrell Hanson as Big Bend Township Treasurer. Splichal seconded, agreed 3-0.

Commissioner Splichal made a motion to appoint Joan Holmberg as Richland Township Trustee. Bergstrom seconded, agreed 3-0.

Terry Cherney and Justin Novak presented the weekly update on road and bridge matters.

- 1) At 10:00 a.m., Commissioner Holl requested an executive session for 10 minutes to discuss non-elected personnel. Bergstrom seconded, agreed 3-0. The Board reconvened at 10:10 a.m., taking no action.
- 2) Cherney and Novak suggested the county develop an asphalt mixing strip along the west side of section 34-2-4 in the land Republic County owns. Novak visited with Todd Wecker from High Plains and an area of 330' x 330'

- would be necessary to develop a mixing strip. Republic County will discuss with Luke Mahin and Mike Hadachek if Economic Development has any other solutions to the mixing strip area.
- 3) Novak set up a meeting for next week with Dane Barclay from Alsop about gravel (sand) samples to compare with the grade of gravel (sand) received from the Nebraska sand company.
- 4) The dump truck purchased last fall from Virginia needs a new motor because the head is cracked. Sasser will be locating a rebuilt motor for this dump truck.
- 5) Discussion regarding purchasing a motor grader is tabled until a new highway administrator is hired.
- 6) The new pickups ordered from Melton Motor should arrive the last of January or first of February.

Road and Bridge employees including Danny Davis, Kevin Kopsa, Tom Thompson, Allan Carlson and Jeremiah Allen, presented concerns about the road and bridge department.

At 11:05 a.m., Commissioner Bergstrom requested an executive session for 10 minutes to discuss non-elected personnel with the Board, Clerk Marsicek, Davis, Kopsa, Thompson, Carlson and Allen. Splichal seconded, agreed 3-0. An additional 5 minutes was requested by Bergstrom, seconded by Splichal, agreed 3-0. An additional 5 minutes was requested by Holl, seconded by Splichal agreed 3-0.

The Board reconvened at 11:25 a.m., taking no action.

The Board suggested the road and bridge employees be patient during this transition of hiring a Highway Administrator. Commissioner Holl told the employees, they all play a key role in keeping our county roads safe and looking good and keep up the good work.

The Republic County Governing Board met in regular session on Monday, January 26, 2015 at 8:30 a.m. Commissioners present were Linda Holl, Marvin Bergstrom and Edwin Splichal. County Clerk Kathleen Marsicek was present to record the minutes of the meeting. Deb Hadachek monitored the meeting.

Commissioner Holl called the meeting to order.

Pastor Bruce Burfield, First Baptist Church, Belleville, offered Morning Prayer.

Commissioner Splichal made a motion to accept the minutes from January 19. Bergstrom seconded, agreed 3-0.

Commissioner Holl made a motion to accept the updated requirements of the Neighborhood Revitalization Program (NRP) removing paragraph 1 of section "G". Bergstrom seconded, agreed 3-0.

Commissioner Bergstrom made a motion to allow the refund to two participants that did not qualify under the old qualifications to be refunded in June 2015. Splichal seconded, agreed 3-0.

At 8:40 a.m., Commissioner Holl request an executive session to discuss confidential financial data of Republic County Hospital for 15 minutes with the Board, Deb Hadachek and Blaine Miller. Bergstrom seconded, agreed 3-0. Holl requested an additional 5 minutes, Splichal seconded, agreed 3-0.

The Board reconvened at 9:00 a.m. taking no action.

The Board signed two Tower Lease agreements between Republic County and Joe Strnad and Republic County and Jerry Strnad for 2015.

The Board welcomed Belleville City Manager, Neil Lewis, for the first scheduled report to the Board of Commissioners from each city by a mayor or city manager.

Commissioner Holl requested an explanation of non-payment of the "In Lieu of Tax" from Grandview Housing Unit for 2014. Commissioners understood the housing unit would no longer collect the "In Lieu of Tax" but thought it would start in 2015 instead of 2014. Lewis explained, that Deb Sells approached the city council regarding this "Tax". Sells explained to the council other housing units associated with HUD programs had been exempted by cities. The city council of Belleville agreed to apply the exemption to Grandview.

Splichal made a motion to approve the exempt status and waive the payment of "In Lieu of Tax" by the City of Belleville housing unit; however, if the housing unit has collected the 2014 "In Lieu of Tax", it should be paid to the county since budgets were approved including said income. Bergstrom seconded, agreed 3-0.

Neil Lewis, Belleville City Manager, reported Belleville has many projects underway for 2015.

- 1) The first phase of the city trails is planned to start between M Street and the high school.
- 2) Cleaning Rocky Pond and developing a water resource to refill the pond for recreational use.
- 3) Redesigning the Belleville swimming pool so it will be ADA compliant.
- 4) The more activities available in Belleville will draw others to Belleville and Republic County.
- 5) The purchase of land for the Loves Station is moving according to plans and final closing papers should be signed in February.
- 6) The city council is in full support of the county with the updating of the commercial building at the NCK Fairgrounds to be used as a community building.

The Board accepted with regrets the resignation of Marcia Hansen, Republic County Health Administrator. Hansen has dedicated over 30 years as the Health Administrator and stated June 22 would be her last day. Hansen knows considerable training will be

necessary for her replacement and advertising for this position should be started as soon as possible. Over the years, Hansen has learned to do more with less and the medical field of county health care has changed greatly.

Terry Cherney and Justin Novak presented the weekly update on road and bridge matters.

- 1) Novak presented solid waste agreement between Republic County and the City of Belleville for solid waste fees for 2015.
- 2) Novak stated Hall Bros from Marysville will be submitting a bid for mixing cold mix asphalt for Republic County if there is an asphalt mixing strip available. High Plains Company has mixed the cold mix in the past and has delivered it to Republic County and would like to submit a bid as soon as a mixing strip is available. The Commissioners will be meeting with the Republic County Economic Development committee later this morning and hope to have information regarding an asphalt mixing strip.
- 3) KDHE has approved the opening of another landfill cell and the county will begin digging this spring.
- 4) Novak and Cherney stating the road and bridge department is operating as normal. Since the weather is unpredictable it is difficult to start some spring projects.

Luke Mahin, Mike Hadachek, Jimmie Blecha, Rod Woods, Neil Lewis and Randy Wise from Republic County Industrial committee met with the Board regarding the Industrial area on the Northwest corner of Belleville.

At 11:05 a.m., Commissioner Holl requested an executive session to discuss confidential data with Industrial committee for 10 minutes with the Board, Industrial committee and Clerk Marsicek. Splichal seconded, agreed 3-0. Commissioner Bergstrom requested an additional 10 minutes. Holl seconded, agreed 3-0.

The Board reconvened at 11:25 a.m. taking no action.

Kay Shoemaker, RCD treasurer, announced the quarterly meeting will be February 11 at TAG'S in Scandia. Shoemaker present the first drawdown check for The Bel-Villa Restaurant.

At 8:35 a.m., Commissioner Holl requested an executive session to discuss non-elected personal for 5 minutes with the Board and Clerk Marsicek. Bergstrom seconded, agreed 3-0. An additional 5 minutes was requested by Holl and seconded by Bergstrom. Agreed 3-0.

With cut backs in funding to the Kansas Society of Historical Land Surveyors, Johnson hoped Republic County would make a donation. The monument was erected in 1986.

The Board signed a memorandum of agreement with the City of Scandia for collection and payment of solid waste fees.

Cindy Coons and Kay Shoemaker, county treasurer's department, explained a computer programing error that distributed a shortage payment to the State of Kansas. After discussing the issue with the county auditor and the computer programmer from Thomson Reuter, Commissioner Bergstrom made a motion to pay the shortage from County General funds. Splichal seconded, agreed 3-0. The program has been fixed and will function properly for distributions in 2015 forward.

The Board reconvened at 10:14 a.m. No action taken.

At 10:15 a.m., Commissioner Holl requested an executive session for 10 minutes to discuss non-elected personnel with the Board, Zenger and Marsicek. Splichal seconded, agreed 3-0. An additional 15 minutes was requested by Holl and seconded by Bergstrom, agreed 3-0.

Vouchers were approved totaling \$135,081.89.

Commissioner Splichal made a motion to accept the minutes from February 3. Bergstrom seconded, agreed 2-0.

Acting Commissioner Chair Bergstrom signed the Determination of Level of Review from Kansas Department of Commerce for the CDBG grant.

Permission to travel was granted for Mike Nondorf to attend the monthly Weed Directors meeting in Abilene on February 12.

Permission to travel was granted for Clerk Marsicek to attend the training session for recipients of the CDBG grants in Stockton on February 11.

E.C. Thompson discussed with the Board the lack of gravel on the east ½ mile of King Road between 130 Road and 140 Road. He receives his mail at this farm but the road has not been gravel for a few years. Commissioner Bergstrom explained unless the road is a school bus route or mail route with persons living at the residence, the road is not maintained as a gravel road. The Board will discuss this road with the road department supervisors. Thompson explained the dissatisfaction with the proposed closure of the 3 ton bridge on Timber Road.

Kay Shoemaker, RCD treasurer, invited the Board to attend the RCD Quarterly meeting on February 11. No applications have been received but a meeting to sign quarterly reports will be held at TAGS in Scandia.

Blaine Van Meter, EMS Director, presented a quote for Electronic Reporting Tablets from Safety PAD. Van Meter explained in the near future all EMS transfers will need to be transmitted electronically instead of manually through the mail. The cost for tablets, training and software total \$2,213.00. Van meter has researched 12 different software models and felt Safety PAD was the most compatible with what Republic County's needs. The Republic County Governing Board met in regular session on Tuesday, February 17, 2015 at 8:30 a.m. Commissioners present were Linda Holl, Marvin Bergstrom and Edwin Splichal. County Clerk Kathleen Marsicek was present to record the minutes of the meeting. Deb Hadachek monitored the meeting.

Commissioner Chairman Holl called the meeting to order.

Pastor Robert Fraiser, Belleville United Presbyterian Church, offered Morning Prayer.

Commissioner Bergstrom made a motion to accept the minutes from February 9. Splichal seconded, agreed 2-0.

Sheriff Ron Blad asked permission to acquire bids to replace a patrol truck.

Blad will be placing a classified ad for an open position in the sheriff's department.

Following discussion regarding the request from Scott Finkbiner to be paid for the balance of vacation hours due to salaried employees, Commissioner Bergstrom made a motion to pay Finkbiner for any unused vacation hours for 2015. Holl seconded, agreed 3-0.

Permission to travel was granted for Mike Nondorf to attend the regular district monthly meetings of the Weed Directors for the remainder of 2015 at various locations and dates.

The Agreement for solid waste fees between Republic County and the City of Courtland was signed.

At 8:40 a.m., Commissioner Splichal requested a 5 minute executive session to discuss non-elected personnel with the Board and Clerk Marsicek. Bergstrom seconded, agreed 3-0. An additional 5 minutes were requested by Splichal and seconded by Holl. Agreed 3-0.

Van Meter and Holloway presented a proposal from Account Recovery Service Inc. (ARSI) as a source for collecting outstanding balances of the EMS accounts. Currently, delinquent accounts are reported to the 'Set-Off Program' at the State of Kansas. The state holds Kansas tax refunds and pays outstanding accounts. Holloway said, Republic County receives payment for approximately 12-15% of the accounts but the accounts could drag out for several years. The proposed source (ARSI) collects about 60% of funds submitted to them. ARSI's fees are only charged if they collect money and that fee is 30%. The consensus of the board was to give permission for Van Meter to pursue a contract with ARSI.

Van Meter stated, two new employees will start in March.

Terry Cherney and Justin Novak presented the weekly update on road and bridge matters.

- 1) Novak asked who should contact the farmer renting the ground from Republic County regarding the necessity of destroying the 8.2 acres of wheat for the asphalt mixing strip. Commissioner Bergstrom asked Novak to follow up with the farmer and report back to the Board with a settlement value of the ground.

The Republic County Governing Board met in regular session on Monday, February 23, 2015 at 8:30 a.m. Commissioners present were Linda Holl, Marvin Bergstrom and Edwin Splichal. County Clerk Kathleen Marsicek was present to record the minutes of the meeting. Deb Hadachek monitored the meeting.

Commissioner Chairman Holl called the meeting to order.

Pastor Mark Imel, Belleville Central Christian Church, offered Morning Prayer.

Commissioner Splichal made a motion to accept the minutes from February 17. Bergstrom seconded, agreed 3-0.

Accounts payable vouchers totaling \$296,931.21 were approved for payment.

Commissioner Splichal will be attending the Republic County Hospital Board meeting at noon.

Blaine Miller and Deb Hadachek requested an executive session with the Board of Commissioners.

At 8:32 a.m., Commissioner Bergstrom made a motion for an executive session for 15 minutes to discuss confidential financial data relating to a private corporation. Splichal seconded, agreed 3-0.

The Board reconvened at 8:47 a.m., taking no action.

Sherry Koster, LEPC representative, presented the semi-annual report of activities and finances from July 2014 to December 2014 for the LEPC organization.

Marcia Hansen, Health Department Administrator, requested the signature of the Board Chairman on the Grant Application to the State of Kansas. Hansen applied for \$16,154.80 for Immunization Action Plan, Maternal & Child Health and State Formula. The Board thanked Hansen for all the grants she applies for on behalf of Republic County.

Barry Porter, County Appraiser, informed the Board of repairs needed to the 2006 Chevrolet Equinox used by various departments. The 2006 Chevrolet Equinox has 90,000 miles and is needing replaced while there is trade-in value and repairs are minimal. The consensus of the Board is to contact Melton Motors for quotes on a new or used vehicle with under 10,000 miles. Porter returned later in the morning stating James Melton will be attending an auction this week where several vehicles will be available meeting the counties' specifications.

Mayor Tim Garman from Courtland expressed his gratitude for allowing the mayors of each city to share activities and problems within their cities. He encourages the Board to attend all activities planned in the cities of the county. Garman shared the recent pancake feed was well attended. Courtland businesses are going strong and expanding thanks to county citizens. Garman voiced a concern regarding the asphalt along the edges of the new streets and requested the county road crew pack and reseal the streets when the asphalt

becomes available. Commissioner Holl assured Garman she would pass on that request to the road and bridge department.

Sheriff Ron Blad presented two bids for a 2015 Chevrolet 1500 4WD, including trade-in.

Dustin Zenger, the new Road and Bridge Administrator, along with Terry Cherney and Justin Novak, presented the weekly update on road and bridge matters.

- 1) Novak contacted Robert Cline regarding the 8.2 acres of ground rented from Republic County in Section 34, Township 2, Range 3. Cline agreed to work with the county for a fair settlement on the wheat crop being destroyed to establish the asphalt mixing strip.
- 2) Novak and Zenger had contact with Dane Barclay regarding gravel issues. Barclay will be attending the Board meeting at 11:00 today.
- 3) Commissioner Holl stated the Mayor of Courtland, Tim Garman, has requested some asphalt work when the county has asphalt available.
- 4) The road crews are out cutting trees which hang over many of the country roads.

At 10:20 a.m., Commissioner Holl requested an executive session for 5 minutes to discuss non-elected personnel with the Board, Zenger, Novak, Cherney and Marsicek. Bergstrom seconded, agreed 3-0.

The Board reconvened at 10:25 a.m. taking no action.

The Board of Commissioners toured the Register of Deeds Office, the Sheriff's office and jail area this week.

Dane Barclay, Alsop Sand Company manager, expressed his disappointment with the decline in the amount of gravel purchased from a local business in the last 15 years. Commissioner Holl explained one reason for the decrease is that the number of gravel roads has decreased in the last 15 years. Commissioner Bergstrom stated the quality of gravel offered from Alsop Sand did not match the quality of gravel purchased in Nebraska and if Barclay could provide equivalent gravel, Republic County would increase its orders. Barclay presented samples of different grades of gravel from Alsop. Barclay presented research information regarding the freight charges Republic County has been paying to the companies from Nebraska and savings ordering from Alsop could give to the county.

Barclay explained after the meeting last year, he met with the Road and Bridge Administrator, as requested, to discuss changing the grade of gravel but the Road and Bridge Administrator would not discuss ordering any additional gravel. Barclay apologized for not rescheduling a meeting with the Board to pursue the issue. Commissioner Holl stated, the Board was not aware Barclay had contacted the Road and Bridge Administrator with the offer to change the grade of gravel. Commissioner Holl apologized to Barclay about this lack of communication and stressed Republic County needs to support local businesses if all possible.

Novak and Cherney expressed the gravel samples displayed today do not match the gravel they have in piles at the supply area. Barclay agreed to join Zenger, Novak and Cherney after lunch to examine the gravel piles and preform a grading test of gravel. - 2) The income surveys have been reviewed and accepted by the KDOC.
- 3) The next step is to prepare an Environmental Review and have the results published. This could take 60-90 days but must be completed before any letting of bids this fall.
- 4) A copy of Republic County Procurement policy, conduct of the Board policy and Civil Rights Policies need to be sent to Deb.
- 5) The original two copies of Grant Agreement No. 15-PF-026, Determination of Level of Review and financial papers including signatures need to be sent to KDOC by March 15.
- 6) Republic County must participate in a Fair Housing activity such as a publication of Fair Housing in the county paper.
- 7) A separate special fund account needs to be set up to receive the grant monies and to pay invoices for this grant project.

Beth Reed presented a request from Matt Farmer, Manager for Kansas Wildlife and Parks, for Republic County support regarding a national grant. Commissioner Holl made a motion to support the Kansas Wildlife and Parks regarding the grant. Bergstrom seconded, agreed 3-0.

Commissioner Splichal made a motion to adjourn. Bergstrom seconded, agreed 3-0.

The Republic County Governing Board met in regular session on Monday, March 2, 2015 at 8:30 a.m. Commissioners present were Linda Holl, Marvin Bergstrom and Edwin Splichal. County Clerk Kathleen Marsicek was present to record the minutes of the meeting. Deb Hadachek monitored the meeting.

Commissioner Chairman Holl called the meeting to order.

Pastor Roger Walls, Republic Methodist Church, offered Morning Prayer.

Commissioner Splichal made a motion to accept the minutes from February 23. Bergstrom seconded, agreed 3-0.

Commissioner Holl made a motion to accept Resolution 2015-18 to rescind Resolutions 2015-04, 2015-09 and 2015-10 in which Justin Novak and Terry Cherney were appointed Co-Directors of Road and Bridge, Transportation and Solid Waste in the absence of a Road and Bridge Administrator. Bergstrom seconded, agreed 3-0.

Commissioner Holl made a motion to accept Resolutions 2015-19 to 2015-21 appointing Dustin Zenger as the Road and Bridge Administrator, Director of Transportation and Director of Solid Waste. Bergstrom seconded, agreed 3-0.

Beth Ball-Deputy Clerk and Kay Shoemaker-Deputy Treasurer proposed changing the employee monthly pay period from every four (4) weeks to once a month on a set day. Shoemaker explained the county computer system presents challenges when payroll and or vouchers need to be paid during the first week of the month. The prior months' funds need to be closed and balanced before current expenses can be posted. Since last fall, the monthly bank statements are mailed to the Treasurers' office but are not always received before the 5th or 6th of the new month, making it difficult to close the prior months records. Shoemaker and Ball discussed changing the payroll dates with Auditor Randy Hofmeier as far as the auditing and bookkeeping. Randy said it may actually be better for department budgets to have a set day for payroll.

Ball presented two scenarios for consideration.

- 1) The cut-off date would be the third Saturday of each month and payday on the 25th.
- 2) The cut-off date would be the second Saturday of each month and payday on the 18th.

Commissioner Holl made a motion to move the pay period from every four (4) weeks to being paid on the 18th of each month starting with March 2015. Bergstrom seconded, agreed 3-0.

Ball explained when this change takes place there would be two paychecks the first month to get on schedule with the new pay roll timing. The first check, paid on March 5, would cover the regular pay period and the second check, paid March 18, would cover from the end of the last pay period to the second Saturday of the current month.

Clerk Marsicek will enclose a letter explaining the cut off dates and pay days during 2015 with the pay stubs this week. When the 18th is on a Saturday, the pay day will be on Friday and when the 18th is on a Sunday, pay day will be on Monday.

Blaine Van Meter, EMS Director, presented a quote to apply Polyprene on the front east area of the EMS building that has been leaking. Van Meter had requested quotes from several local businesses but only received a quote from Geisler Roofing for \$2,221. The consensus of the Board was to approve the bid from Geisler Roofing.

Van Meter stated there have been several persons applying for the full time and part time positions. Van Meter has hired one full time and one part time person with the possibility of hiring a couple additional part time EMTs in the next couple of weeks.

Van Meter explained the PEER group meeting sponsored by the Kansas Highway Patrol for support and counseling was held last Friday at the Central Christian Church for all persons involved in the fire on February 23. There were several persons attending from EMS, the Fire Department, the Police Department and the Sheriff's Department.

Mayor Joe Chizek from Cuba explained a waterline replacement project beginning in Cuba. Through the help of Deb Ohlde, Cuba received a grant for matching funds to replace the waterlines in Cuba that date back to 1929. Chizek requested assistance from the county roads department to help paving the streets when waterlines are replaced. Commissioner Holl will contact the road department about this request.

Chizek invited the Commissioner to attend the annual Rock a Thon starting March 15.

Permission to travel was granted for Cindy Coons to attend the Spring NCK Treasurer and Register of Deeds District Meeting in Salina on April 9th.

The Board signed the Memorandum of agreement between Republic County and the City of Cuba for solid waste fees.

The Board signed the Memorandum of agreement between Republic County and the City of Agenda for solid waste fees.

Raymond Raney and Colleen Alkire from dispatch discussed the need for additional dispatchers. Raney will be interviewing for the open positions.

At 9:45 a.m., Commissioner Holl requested an executive session for 5 minutes to discuss non-elected personnel with the Board, Raney, Alkire and Clerk Marsicek. Splichal seconded, agreed 3-0. Holl requested an additional 10 minutes seconded by Splichal, agreed 3-0.

The Board reconvened at 10:00 a.m. taking no action.

Dustin Zenger, the new Road and Bridge Administrator, along with Terry Cherney and Justin Novak, presented the weekly update on road and bridge matters.

- 1) Dane Barclay, Alsop Sand, presented the test results of the current gravel Republic County has available. Barclay's results showed some grading variances between what Barclay stated the Alsop quality should be and what was tested. Zenger, Novak and Cherney expressed this is the type of gravel they have always picked up from Alsop. The Nebraska gravel is more course. Barclay expressed his possibility of closing the Scandia Alsop Sand Pit if Republic County will not increase the amount of gravel needed. Barclay restated the county could get more gravel for the same dollars if they purchased the gravel locally instead of Nebraska companies. Zenger requested to table this matter until he has researched the total cost of gravel and freight to all parts of Republic County.
- 2) Barclay stated the gravel roads were in better shape back in the 1970-1980 when Republic County purchased more gravel from Alsop. Cherney shared that it was not the gravel that makes the roads better but the road graders had more time to work the roads and road beds. The road graders only responsibility at that time was to maintain the roads, now these same people are required to put in culverts, trim trees, haul the gravel and work on other projects. Commissioner Holl encouraged Zenger to hire necessary employees to become fully staffed so roads could become a priority.
- 3) The opening of tire bids was postponed until Monday, March 9.
- 4) On March 30, the road and bridge department will start summer hours 7-5:30.
- 5) The dump truck purchased last summer from Purple Wave had a bent frame bed when it was purchased, a bid for a new bed will cost \$3,000-5,000. The board granted permission to purchase the necessary repairs.
- 6) Permission to travel was granted for Dusty Zenger and Lisa Jones to attend a Vehicle Order Meeting in Topeka on March 9.

- 9) Plans are being made for a hot mix asphalt base for the mixing strip.
- 10) Discussion about the access road from Marble Road to the new asphalt mixing strip resulted in the consensus that an access road will not be needed at this time.

Marcia Hansen-Health Administrator, Sister Mary Savioe and Stephanie Simmons-Mitchell County Regional Medical Foundation (MCRMF) announced Republic County will be one of 5 counties to share a \$225,000 grant awarded to the North Central Kansas area. Simmons explained the grant funding supports implementation of a coordinated approach to the prevention and control of diabetes, heart disease, obesity and associated risk factors. Simmons stated Hansen and Savioe have been part of the program with the Chronic Health assessment done in Republic County and thanked them for their work. One of the requirements of the grant is for a member of RCRMF to meet quarterly with the Board of Health in the county which is the Board of Commissioners. Commissioner Holl invited Simmons to contact the County Clerk to schedule the appointments.

Permission to travel was granted for Karen Henke to attend CE classes in Salina on March 6.

Emergency Preparedness Director Raymond Raney along with Beth Reed announced the annual Storm Spotter training will be held on March 10. Two bids were received for the meal served during the training.

The Republic County Governing Board met in regular session on Monday, March 9, 2015 at 8:30 a.m. Commissioners present were Linda Holl, Marvin Bergstrom and Edwin Splichal. County Clerk Kathleen Marsicek was present to record the minutes of the meeting. Deb Hadachek monitored the meeting.

Commissioner Chairman Holl called the meeting to order.

Pastor Bruce Burfield, First Baptist Church of Belleville, offered Morning Prayer.

Commissioner Splichal made a motion to accept the minutes from March 2. Bergstrom seconded, agreed 3-0.

Accounts payable vouchers totaling \$543,392.08 were approved for payment.

Dustin Zenger, the new Road and Bridge Administrator presented the weekly update on road and bridge matters.

- 1) Zenger presented a list of complaints regarding the new method of pay periods.
 - a. It is difficult enough to stretch the paycheck for 4 weeks but now there will be three months the check must stretch to 5 weeks.
 - b. They would rather be paid every two weeks.
 - c. The road and bridge department was not aware of the proposed change in pay period until they heard the minutes on the radio. Better communication could have helped to explain why the Board proceeded with the change. At 9:30 a.m., the commissioners and Clerk Marsicek toured the County Attorney's department and the District Court area. The Board returned to the board room at 10:00 a.m., to continue the rest of the agenda.

Blaine Van Meter, EMS Director, stated he will have a meeting with the Account Recovery Service Inc. representative later Monday March 9.

At 10:15 a.m., Commissioner Bergstrom requested an executive session to discuss non-elected personnel for 10 minutes with the Board, Van Meter and Clerk Marsicek. Holl seconded, agreed 3-0.

The Board reconvened at 10:25 a.m., taking so action.

The new Safety Pad program will be starting on May 1st in the EMS department.

The Republic County Governing Board met in regular session on Monday, April 20, 2015 at 8:30 a.m., with Commissioners Linda Holl and Marvin Bergstrom present. Absent was Edwin Splichal. In the absence of County Clerk, Kathleen Marsicek, Deputy County Clerk Beth Ball was present to record the minutes of the meeting.

Pastor Bruce Burfield, First Baptist Church, offered the Morning Prayer.

Commissioner Chair Holl called the meeting to order.

Commissioner Bergstrom made a motion to approve as read the previous week's minutes. Second by Holl, motion passed 2-0.

Candace Fielder, Secretary for the County Attorney, explained to the Board that, through her private practice, she has been considering a Therapy dog. Since the dog must be with her as much as possible, she asked the Board to approve bringing the dog with her to work. She has approval from her supervisor as well as the Custodian at the Courthouse and explained that she spoke with the Sheriff about the possibility of using the dog to calm agitated prisoners. It was the consensus of the Board to approve her request.

Deputy Treasurer and RCD Secretary Kay Shoemaker presented a letter she received from Debbie Beck, the CDBG Specialist that visited her office on April 8, 2015 regarding the revolving loan fund. In the letter, Ms. Beck complimented the County and reported that the files were in excellent condition. The Commissioners congratulated Shoemaker on a job well done.

Shoemaker also reported that she and Mikel Hadachek had asked Ms. Beck some additional questions, but these would be discussed at the next RCD meeting.

Telescope Editor Deb Hadachek monitored the remainder of the meeting.

Luke Mahin, RCD, presented the Duclos grant application for signature and discussed additional grant opportunities with the Board. Some grants will be used to fund ROZ while others will fund training for business start-ups. The Commissioners encouraged Mr. Mahin to pursue these grants and instructed the County Clerk's office to share the County's FEIN with Mr. Mahin.

Commissioner Bergstrom asked Mahin if he could pinpoint a start date for Loves. Mahin was unsure but explained that they were completing a store in McPherson and should be coming to the area when that was completed.

Mr. E.C. Thompson visited with the Board about the closed bridge on Timber road. He said the barricade blocked complete access and he could not even walk across the bridge. Commissioner Holl explained that this was a fracture critical bridge and the funds were not available at this time to repair or replace it. Thompson asked that the road be closed between his property and the neighboring one. Commissioner Holl explained that a landowner owns land on both sides of a road that is closed, the closed road becomes the owner's responsibility but since that is not the case with this road, it is unclear of the liability. More research will have to be done in this case.

Dustin Zenger, Highway Administrator, presented bids for asphalt. The two bids were from High Plains at \$30.00 per ton with 7000 ton delivered by June 30, 2015 and Hall Brothers at \$33.15 per ton with 350 ton delivered within five (5) days and additional deliveries made 7 - 10 days of request with a total of 7000 tons delivered by June 19, 2015. Zenger explained that even though Hall Bros was higher, the fact that they would have delivery of 350 ton within 5 days and subsequent deliveries within 7 - 10 days was beneficial. Crews could begin patching roads in May rather than waiting until the end of June to begin their work. Upon recommendation from Zenger, the Commissioners agreed to purchase asphalt from Hall Brothers.

The Board discussed the closed fracture critical bridges with Zenger. He expressed regret that the bridges had to be closed and said he would like leave them closed and fix one at a time rather than continue to spend money for frequent inspections. Zenger shared that he viewed the bridge on 40 Rd. between Elm and Diamond. Zenger discussed the different options for providing access to the property north of the bridge and stated that repairing Diamond Road to provide access from the West appears to be the most feasible option.

At 10:24 a.m., Chairman Holl made a motion to go into a 15-minute executive session with Commissioner Bergstrom and Zenger to discuss non-elected personnel. Second by Bergstrom, motion passed 2-0. Regular session resumed at 10:39 a.m., with no action taken by the Board.

Commissioner Chairman Holl called the meeting to order.

Pastor Rick Snodgrass, Belleville Assembly of God, offered Morning Prayer.

Commissioner Bergstrom made a motion to accept the minutes from May 4. Splichal seconded, agreed 3-0.

A/P vouchers totaling \$151,697.96 were approved for payment.

Pastor Rick Snodgrass, Mid-America Cruise-In committee, requested permission to use the courthouse square for the 23rd Annual Mid America Cruise-In activities on June 20, 2015. Permission was granted.

Kay Shoemaker, RCD Treasurer, stated there would be an RCD meeting on May 13 at 6:30 PM to review a loan application.

Kevin Calkins, courthouse custodian, stated that Rob Kasl from the Patriot Project has 30 additional flag poles to erect around the courthouse lawn. Calkins understanding was the poles would be removable so he could mow over them, instead Calkins must manually trim around the poles and plaques which takes additional time.

Calkins sought permission to continue to mow around the library and the empty lot east of the courthouse square as long as it does not conflict with the new County Code of Ethics. The consensus of the Board is to allow Calkins to continue to mow all areas he has been mowing.

Candace Fielder, County Attorney assistant, informed the Board of a date change in the Delinquent Tax Sale. The new date is June 23 instead of June 10th.

LeAnn DeJoia, Pawnee Mental Health, asked the Board to Declare May as Mental Health Month. According to Commissioner Holl, Republic County will designate May as Mental Health Month. DeJoia presented the 2014 Pawnee Mental Health Annual report and a Stress Relief calendar for May.

Clerk Marsicek invited the Commissioners to attend the Retirement Reception for Marcia Hansen to be held on June 12 from 2-4 at the Health Department.

After discussion, Commissioner Splichal made a motion to designate that on the weeks there are vouchers, the first hour will be set aside for reviewing and signing vouchers. Holl seconded, agreed 3-0.

- 1) Due to the storms last week, the bridge tour has been postponed.
- 2) There are two bridges closed until repaired because of flood damage.
- 3) Many roads in the county will need gravel replaced and debris removed around the Republic and Scandia areas.

Kansas Representative Sharon Schwartz called to discuss damages to Republic County from the tornado and heavy rains. Schwartz conveyed that Kansas Governor Sam Brownback will help any way possible to aid in the repairs to the county. Raymond Raney explained that the final cost of damages cannot be accessed yet.

- A) Damage reports of 12 structures including two homes, 10-12 Irrigation Pivots, at least two bridges and multiple power lines.
- B) Two homes were totally destroyed.
- C) Scandia Feedlot and Ethanol Plant near Scandia sustained severe damage due to a tornado.
- D) Many roads in the western part of the county will need major repairs and debris removal.

Raymond explained that in order for a state to receive funds from FEMA, many requirements must be met throughout the state during one storm system. Damage must total over \$4,220,896.38 of uninsured damage. As total costs from other areas report to the state Emergency Management Department, a final assessment can be determined. If the state qualifies for FEMA, then Republic County will submit expenses for damages, but this could take weeks to be completed.

The Commissioners thanked Representative Schwartz for calling and will inform her of any problems that occur as clean up continues.

Commissioner Splichal made a motion to accept Resolution 2015-23 regarding the financial statements for 2015. Bergstrom seconded, agreed 3-0.

At 12:00 pm, Commissioner Bergstrom made a motion to adjourn. Splichal seconded, agreed 3-0.

Commissioners granted permission for the Belleville Chamber and Mainstreet to use the courthouse parking area adjacent to M Street for the weekly farmers' market beginning May 23 and ending September 26.

Beth Ball, Council on Aging, presented a list of accomplishments from the Agency on Aging in Republic County and requested the same amount of funding in 2016 as Republic County funded in 2015.

Representatives from the Republic County Employee Task Force, Mike Nondorf, Kathy Calkins, Lori Kuhlman, Lisa Jones, Jerad Sasser and Beth Ball, presented a list of pros and cons regarding the implementation of time clocks for county departments. The commissioners will review the list before making any decision to use time clocks instead of the hand written time cards for tracking working time for employees of the county.

Neil Lewis, Belleville City Manager, explained projects the City of Belleville has planned for 2015.

- 1) Building a swimming pool and splash-pad in the Belleville Park. The proposed cost is \$1.8 million. The construction will begin following the closing of the pool after the North Central Free Fair and will be operational by May 2016.
- 2) Building two shelters near the new splash-pad.
- 3) Building an additional shelter and playground near the Lions ball field.
- 4) Construction on the Love's Station will begin this summer.
- 5) Annexing land along US Hwy 81 for an access road leading to the Love's convenience Store has been proposed.
- 6) KDOT has proposed reducing the speed limit to 50 MPH on US Hwy 81 starting 750' north of Marble Rd and ending just south of the Sale Barn.

Mike Hadachek, Luke Mahin and Kay Shoemaker joined Neil Lewis to discuss RCD matters. Hadachek presented a loan application for Landon Wolters in the amount of \$20,000 for equipment and start-up costs for the new Belleville Chiropractic Clinic in Belleville. Commissioner Holl made a motion to approve the RCD loan to Wolters. Bergstrom seconded, agreed 3-0.

Commissioner Holl made a motion for Kay Shoemaker to remain as RCD treasurer after her employment with Republic County has ended. Splichal seconded, agreed 3-0. All files for RCD will be moved from the Treasurer's vault to the Clerk's vault for access when Shoemaker files records for RCD. The bank account will remain as part of the Republic County funds and vouchers will be requested by Shoemaker.

The NCK Industrial Committee wants to deed this land to the City of Belleville for an access road leading from the Love's Station to 14th Street. Neil Lewis will discuss this possibility with the Belleville City Council.

If the City Council agrees to develop this access road, Republic County will share in the cost. The Commissioners asked Dusty Zenger to join the meeting to discuss the access road.

Zenger offered to help with labor and supplies for the access road.

Dustin Zenger, Road and Bridge Administrator, presented the weekly updates.

- 1) An agreement between Republic County and Premium Feeders to construct and operate an underground electric line was approved.
- 2) Two agreements between Republic County and Kansas Gas Service to construct and operate an underground gas line crossing 50 Rd and 60 Rd were approved.
- 3) Zenger is researching the Rural Road Sign Program that funds sign replacements in rural areas.
- 4) Zenger presented bids for culverts:

5) Commissioner Holl reported the culvert at the intersection of Penn Rd and 250 Rd needs dirt added because of water damage.

- 1) Zenger presented for signature Agreement No. 119-15 between Republic County and Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) to authorize the Federal Fund Exchange Program for 2015 annual allotment in the amount of \$91,243.26.
- 2) Zenger presented a proposal to Republic County by BG Consultants to replace the Off-System Bridge 28-N.3 for a lump sum of \$8,033.00, not including permit application fees.
- 3) Zenger proposed changing the county landfill hours during the summer to 3-5 instead of the current 1:30 to 3:30. The employee responsible for the landfill works the rest of the day driving trucks for the road crew and it would

be better use of their time to operate the landfill later in the afternoon instead of the middle of the day. It was the consensus of the Board to change the hours of the landfill during the week but leave the Saturday hours the same as they are now.

Peggy Frint submitted a Permission to Travel to attend a Register of Deeds Seminar in Wichita on June 2-5, 2015. Permission was granted. Mrs. Frint, also, mentioned that before the fall and winter months, she would like to see something done to the heating in the Register of Deeds office as that office is always cold. The Commissioners will look into this matter prior to the cold weather season.

Tim Garman, Mayor of the City of Courtland, visited with the Board and advised of projects that are in the process, or have been improved within the City. He advised of a sink hole that is located on the south end of Main Street and asked if the County Road and Bridge Department could fill the hole with asphalt. The Board approved this request and notified the Road and Bridge Department to meet with Mr. Garman concerning this repair.

Dustin Zenger, Road and Bridge Department Director gave an update on projects within his department.

• New hours at the County's Construction and Demolition Landfill will be Tuesdays and Thursdays from 3:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m., and 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon every Saturday during the summer months, effective as of this week.

- Mr. Zenger reported that decking, beams and sheet piling will cost an additional \$31,000.00
 on top of material currently in stock to replace the bridge located on 280 Road just north
 of US 36. The Road and Bridge Budget will cover these materials.
- The County is in the process of submitting information for a KDOT program which will replace county signs with new signs that meet KDOT standards for retro-reflective sheeting. The intent is to set up a three year program, installing a portion of the new signs each year. These projects will be 100% state funded, including contractor costs for installation.
- The Road and Bridge crews are beginning today to start asphalt patching with cold mix. Discussion was held concerning different options for repairing the asphalt roads.
- Discussion was held on property maintenance and updates to some buildings located in the County yard.

Kelvin Blecha discussed with the Board and Mr. Zenger plans to use county forces to upgrade a section of the fairground roads. Approximately 100 tons of cold mix asphalt will be purchased from the Road and Bridge Department for the improvements. There is money available to do this project, as well as redo a portion of the wiring in the cattle barns.

Luke Mahin with Economic Development reported on the status of the Republic County Rural Opportunity Zone (ROZ) Program. At the present time, there are three applicants that have been approved, two that are sponsored and six on a waitlist. After discussion, Commissioner Splichal moved, Commissioner Holl seconded, made unanimous by Commissioner Bergstrom, to participate in this project. The amount of \$10,500.00 per year over a five-year period, will be provided through the County Budget process, beginning with calendar year 2016 to help fund this project.

 - 1. Sign replacements on Major, Minor and Local roads to be completed over three years at no cost to Republic County. Major road signs would be given priority, Minor roads second priority and local roads the least priority.
 - 2. Local Road Safety Plan that includes KDOT surveying every road in Republic County for safety issues. The total cost of this program is \$40,000 that is shared 90/10 with KDOT paying 90%. This is a proactive project to maintain safe roads in Republic County.

- Commissioner Bergstrom made a motion to apply for both programs with the understanding there is no cost unless Republic County is accepted into the programs. Splichal seconded and Holl made it unanimous.
- Zenger asked permission to designate Kyle Lervold as the team leader of the asphalt crew. Permission was granted.
- Zenger received some calls from concerned citizens regarding the heavy rains that damaged roads and caused possible bridge issues. The road crews are grading and applying gravel to many roads.
- Zenger appreciated the support of Republic County citizens regarding these calls, it really helps to quickly assess priority needs to road and bridge repairs.

OCCK members Sheila Nelson-Stout, Lorraine Harris and Pat Wallerius presented the 2014 annual report of services to the Republic County residents along with a budget request for 2016 for \$23,307 which is the same amount as the 2015 request. Commissioner Holl explained that the budget for the county is still being processed and that OCCK's request will be considered.

Jenny Pachta from The Blair Center for the Arts presented a list of summer activities planned for the Blair Center. Pachta, who visited with the board back in March, thanked the Board for the advice about researching the possibility of the Blair Center assessment rate re-evaluation and applying for a non-profit status. The Blair did qualify for non-profit status and the assessment rate on the building was re-evaluated and decreased from the 25% commercial bracket to 12% non-profit bracket, thus saving the Blair expenses. Pachta requested that the Board consider an annual donation to the Blair Center for the Arts in the amount of \$10,000. Commissioner Holl explained that the budget for the county is still being processed and that the Blair request will be considered.

The commissioners reviewed the expenses of their department used in 2014 and so far in 2015. Commissioner Bergstrom suggested an increase in the contractual area. Therefore, the commissioners could attend more training conferences.

Kay Shoemaker, RCD treasurer, announced the loan application for Landon Wolters has been approved and presented the final papers for signing. Shoemaker asked the commissioners for the entire amount upfront, or a small draft for start-up funds and the balance as needed. Commissioner Splichal suggested \$5,000 now and other monies as needed. It was the consensus of the board to follow Splichal's suggestion.

Beth Reed and Clerk Marsicek visited the board regarding the Cunningham monthly invoices. Currently, Reed receives the monthly invoice then separates the invoice into departmental billings. In the past, a portion of the invoice was paid from County General funds with the long distance and fax fees billed to the individual department funds. Commissioner Holl stated phone service is just part of doing business and it should all be paid from County General just like the lights and water. The three departments not located in the courthouse will still be responsible for their phone invoices. All cell phone invoices will be charged to the departments using the cell phones.

At 12:00 pm, Commissioner Holl made a motion to adjourn. Bergstrom seconded with Splichal making it unanimous.

- New waterlines are being laid through the city that were funded through a CDBG grant.
- The annual Cuba Harvest Festival will be July 17-18.

Cindy Coons, County Treasurer, presented the list of properties on the tax sale that will be held on June 23. Originally there were 61 parcels on the list. Taxes and fees totaling \$100,061.34 were paid on 34 properties leaving 27 properties on the tax sale. All back taxes and the costs of title searches and publication notices must be paid to remove the property from the sale.

At 9:36 am, Commissioner Holl requested an executive session for 5 minutes to discuss non-elected personnel with the Board and Clerk Marsicek. Commissioner Splichal seconded with Bergstrom making it unanimous. Commissioner Holl requested three additional 5 minute extensions seconded by Splichal with Bergstrom making it unanimous.

The Board reconvened at 9:56 am taking no action.

Dustin Zenger, Road and Bridge Administrator, presented the weekly updates.

• No quotes for new trucks were received, however, Zenger will contact the local dealers this week for quotes.

- Two cell phones were replaced.
- Zenger asked permission to research other companies to rent heavy equipment such as skid loaders. Currently, the county rents a skid loader from Bob Cat in Salina for \$2,450 per year. That contract will expire in November. Commissioner Bergstrom suggested that Zenger contact C & W Farm Supply in Courtland along with other companies.
- New employee Jeff Biekman started Monday, June 15, 2015.
- Due to the continuous rain, a limited amount of gravel was applied to roads.
- Zenger is working with Dane Barclay from Alsop Sand for additional deliveries of gravel in preparation for drier weather.

At 10:37 am, Commissioner Holl requested an executive session for 5 minutes to discuss non-elected personnel with the Board, Zenger and Clerk Marsicek. - Zenger is pricing a used gooseneck flatbed trailer from Becker Auto in Beloit. It could be pulled behind a pickup instead of using a semi-tractor when moving equipment around the county.
- Zenger discussed using an industrial type tractor to place asphalt. It might prove to be more efficient than the equipment being used currently.
- Apple One Media is interested in quoting sign sheeting for county road signs.

At 8:48 am, Commissioner Holl made a motion for an executive session to discuss non-elected personnel for 10 minutes with the board and Zenger. Bergstrom seconded, made unanimous by Splichal.

The Board reconvened at 8:58 a.m. taking no action.

Clerk Marsicek advised the Board the 2015 Republic County property valuation is \$63,908,286 which is an increase of \$6,178,317 from the 2014 property valuation.

Rob Kasl, Republic County Patriot Project, announced that 50 additional flag poles will be placed around the courthouse starting this week.

Kasl thanked the commissioners for allowing the use of the courthouse square for the Cruising America activities last weekend. Kasl encouraged the commissioners to allow use of the courthouse square Cruising America activities for next year.

Robbin Cole, Executive Director of Pawnee Mental Health, presented the Pawnee Mental Health annual report of services for 2014. A total of 7,558 persons received services from Pawnee Mental Health including 173 persons in Republic County. Cole presented the annual budget request for funding for Republic County. With medical costs on the rise and decreases in covered services, Cole asked the commissioners to consider an increase of \$500 over 2015 funding for a total of \$26,000. Commissioner Holl thanked Cole for the service that Pawnee Mental Health provides to our county and will consider an increase when the budget is prepared.

Melinda Pierson, Belleville Chamber and Mainstreet, requested permission to use the north, west and south sides of the courthouse square for the Ag Fest to be held on July 4. Permission was granted.

Carl Eyman, KWORC Deputy Administrator, presented the annual workers compensation experience rating. Republic County loss percentage is 36% which is below average compared to other Kansas counties. The experience rating is 1.01 for 2015

which is good however, in 2016 the rating will jump to 1.15 creating an estimated increase of 15% in premiums for workmen compensation.

Eyman suggested additional safety training be presented to fray future claims. Eyman suggested some online training that law enforcement can complete for continuing education hours.

Cindy Coons, County Treasurer, stated the delinquent property tax sale will start at 10:00 am on Tuesday, June 23 in the District Courtroom. Commissioner Holl expressed her concern about other properties that could become delinquent in 2015 and advised Coons to start the process for the 2016 delinquent tax sale as soon as the September deadline for taxes has passed.

Kay Shoemaker and Beth Ball suggested that Shoemaker continue to be paid for the work as RCD treasurer through payroll and submit a voucher to RCD yearly for reimbursement. The Board was agreed to this suggestion.

The Republic County Governing Board met in regular session on Monday, June 29, 2015 at 8:30 am. Commissioners present were Linda Holl and Edwin Splichal. Commissioner Marvin Bergstrom was absent. County Clerk Kathleen Marsicek was present to record the minutes of the meeting. Deb Hadachek monitored the meeting.

Commissioner Chairman Holl called the meeting to order at 8:30 am.

Pastor Mark Imel, Belleville Central Christian Church, offered Morning Prayer.

Commissioner Splichal made a motion to accept the minutes from June 22nd. Commissioner Holl seconded, agreed 2-0.

The Belleville City Library was granted permission to use the south courthouse lawn on July 23 for the end of the summer Reading program activities.

Commissioners Holl and Splichal reviewed the branches from trees on the north side of the courthouse that would interfere with the new flagpoles. The consensus of the board is to allow the Patriot Group permission to trim the necessary branches at their own expense.

It is the consensus of the board to pay the Kansas Crossroads Resource Conservation & Development Area 2015-2016 membership fee of \$700 from County General Funds. Commissioner Holl suggested including this fee in the budget starting in 2016.

Rob Kasl, Patriot Group, thanked the Board for allowing the tree trimming and noted that locations are marked for installation of 50 flagpoles.

County Attorney Marlea James, County Treasurer Cindy Coons and Belleville City Manager Neil Lewis joined the Commissioners at 9:45 am. Commissioner Holl asked Belleville City Manager, Neil Lewis, to explain why the City of Belleville had not purchased the building on M street at the tax sale. Lewis explained that the city attorney had advised the city not to purchase the building until the common wall issue is resolved. The original intent was for the City of Belleville to purchase the Price building and demolish it; however, that building has a common wall with Crossroads Floral and fear of the wall collapsing has discouraged the city from ownership. The City of Belleville would like to remove all buildings on the west side of the 1700 block of M street. Commissioner Splichal explained that the City of Belleville should have notified the county of their change of plans on the property because the tax sale was pushed through with the understanding the City of Belleville was going to purchase it.

Lewis apologized for the lack of communication but the City of Belleville assumed the county understood their position when the law suit regarding the Crossroad Floral reached a stalemate. Lewis stated that it is still the intention of the City to remove the rundown buildings on that block, however, it will take longer than originally planned. There is no short term solution but the City of Belleville doesn't want to jeopardize the relationship with Republic County.

Commissioner Holl requested that the City of Belleville write an agreement between the City of Belleville and Republic County stating the future intention to purchase all the buildings on block 1700 on the west side of main street.

Dustin Zenger, Road and Bridge Administrator, presented the weekly updates.

• Zenger presented a five (5) year lease contract from Bobcat in Manhattan for \$5,500 per year to replace the current contract with Bobcat in Salina which expires in November. C & W Farm Supply was contacted for a quote but owner Jeff Sothers stated that a comparable contract is not available at this time.

The consensus of the Board was to allow Zenger to proceed with a contract lease with Bobcat in Manhattan.

• Zenger asked permission to advertise sale of a Diesel Hammer not used since 2013. The money from the sale could purchase other needed equipment. The commissioners suggested a local advertisement along with a larger area classified ad. Zenger stated a company was contacted to research a larger market for this equipment.

- A Sheet piling machine is being researched for possible assistance in building back walls for bridges.
- FEMA inspectors toured Republic County on June 22 and reviewed many pictures and documents of damage sustained in Republic County since May 4. Zenger stated that Republic County should receive some FEMA funding to aid with the repairs needed to five bridges and several roads damaged by recent storms.

At 10:45 am, Commissioner Holl requested an executive session for 5 minutes to discuss non-elected personnel with Commissioner Splichal and Zenger. Splichal seconded. An additional 5 minutes was requested by Commissioner Holl and seconded by Splichal.

The Board reconvened at 10:55 am taking no action.

Luke Mahin, Jennifer Russell, Jimmie Blecha, Randy Hansen, and Mike Hadachek, representing the Republic County Economic Development group, presented the 2014 annual report and a budget request for 2016. Mahin explained that the Republic County Economic Development group was started in 1999 with the City of Belleville and Republic County as the financial supporters of a \$42,000 annual budget. The City of Belleville paid \$14,000 and Republic County paid up to \$28,000 per year. The proposed budget for 2016 will be \$55,000. Republic County Economic Development (RCED) has facilitated many positive changes in Republic County. The RCED group is visiting with each city in Republic County before their budgets are set for 2016, seeking support.

In the past, The City of Belleville billed Republic County when the treasurer of the Economic Development was employed by the City of Belleville. Now the treasurer of the Economic Development is not a city employee and county funding can be sent directly to the Economic Development Office. Effective today, June 29, 2015, all payments to Republic County Economic Development will be sent to the Economic Development office twice a year. The first payment for half of the budgeted amount for the year is due on July 1st with the balance due December 31.

Mahin asked the commissioners to consider an increase in the annual funding. Commissioner Holl, with the support of Commissioner Splichal, commended Mahin and the RCED group for the services to Republic County and proposed \$40,000 for the 2016 budget.

Mahin presented a list of ROZ applicants including seven approved, five on waiting list, four pending and eight denied persons. Republic County agreed earlier in June to sponsor seven new applicants but since that time, two more have been approved. Since all commissioners were not in attendance, Commissioner Holl asked Mahin to return on July 13 to discuss the possibility of sponsoring the additional applicants.

Mahin stated that the Love's construction will begin in August and should be completed by January 2016.

Danielle White requested permission to travel to Newton on June 30 to attend the Kansas Wellness symposium meeting. Permission was granted.

At 12:00 pm, Commissioner Splichal made a motion to adjourn. Holl seconded.

Commissioner Holl made a motion to accept the July 6, 2015 minutes. Bergstrom seconded with Splichal making it unanimous.

Accounts payable vouchers totaling of \$391,048.04 were approved for payment.

Commissioner Holl moved to approve Resolution 2015-31 for the appointment of Elizabeth Baskerville-Hilton and Darrell Miller as special prosecuting attorneys as needed during absence of the Republic County Attorney in July and August 2015. Commissioner Splichal seconded with Bergstrom making it unanimous.

Beth Ball, Deputy Clerk, announced that Group Benefit Services representative Alisha Bond informed her there will be an increase of 8.6% in the health insurance premium for Republic County in January 2016. Ball explained that the three year contract for the State Employee Health Plan (SEHP) expires January 1, 2016 and questioned whether commissioners should sign a renew contract with SEHP? Commissioner Holl said the Board will discuss this matter and notify Ball of their decision.

At 8:55 a.m., Commissioner Holl requested an executive session to discuss non-elected personnel for 5 minutes with the Board, Ball and Clerk Marsicek. Commissioner Splichal seconded with Bergstrom making it unanimous.

The Board reconvened at 9:00 taking no action.

Kris Kling, District Court Clerk, presented a 2016 District Court budget request for \$79,600.

Dustin Zenger, Road and Bridge Administrator, presented weekly updates.

- Zenger presented a Waterline agreement for approval between Republic County and John Garman to construct and operate an underground waterline.
- Zenger presented an Electric Cable agreement for approval between Republic County and Heath Eitzmann to construct and operate an underground waterline.
- Zenger presented information regarding mobile crane training and certification. Currently, only one person
 is trained to operate the crane owned by Republic County. Zenger wants at least one additional person
 trained and possibly a third. A class will be held July 21-23 in Omaha, NE with a cost of \$650 per person.
- The Commissioners granted permission to travel for Nathan Craig and Alan Carlson to attend a Mobile Crane Certification class in Omaha, NE July 21-23.
- Zenger said only one person has contacted Road and Bridge regarding a contract to bale the grass around the landfill. Consensus of the board is to grant Zenger permission to create a five year grass contract to bale the grass on the 21 acres.

- Commissioner Holl informed Dusty Zenger who is the Solid Waste director that several cities in Republic County are not satisfied with the current recycling program and that Republic County may assume responsibility for recycling. Zenger will research this matter.
- Clerk Marsicek will invite all the mayors in Republic County to attend the Commissioner meeting on July 20.
- Asphalt overlay work was completed on three miles of 180 Road south of Hwy K148.
- The patching crew is working on 280 Road and will put an asphalt overlay on part of the road
- Commissioner Bergstrom stated that 40 Road north of Courtland and Rock Rd east of 30 Road need graded.

Kevin Calkins, courthouse custodian, introduced Jacob and Joseph Stockton from Stockton Restoration. Stockton Restoration presented a bid to paint the courthouse. The bid total is \$56,000 which includes a five year guarantee. Stockton Restoration painted the Republic County Courthouse in 2004. Calkins will also be receiving a bid from Restoration and Waterproofing.

Cindy Coons, County Treasurer, and Candace Fielder, representing the County Attorney's office, requested permission to pay the deed recording fees from county general funds for the properties sold at the County tax sale. Coons explained the sale has not been finalized, therefore there are no funds in the tax sale account to pay the recording fees. When the tax sale is finalized the money will be returned to the general fund. Consensus of the board is to allow Coons to pay the recording fees from county general funds and transfer funds from the tax sale account when the paperwork is finished.

Luke Mahin, Republic County Economic Development (RCED), thanked the board for their generous support for the Rural Opportunity Zone (ROZ) funds budgeted for 2016. Other donors to the ROZ funding include Duclos Foundation and Reinke Manufacturing. Mahin said either Jenny Russell or he has visited each city in Republic County about donating to this fund.

Carol Miller, Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA) representative, presented a request for 2016 in the amount of \$12,000. This is an increase of \$7,000 over the past years. Nineteen children from Republic County have received services from CASA and Child Advocacy Center (CAC). Miller said Republic County has three CASA volunteers and more are needed. Anyone interested can contact Miller for training classes that will begin in September.

Kay Shoemaker, RCED treasurer, presented the Bi-annual report for Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), loan close certifications for two new loans and a voucher to Belleville Chiropractic for \$5,400.

At 12:10 pm, Commissioner Holl made a motion to adjourn. Commissioner Splichal seconded with Commissioner Bergstrom making it unanimous.

Randy Hofmeier, Republic County Accountant, presented a 2016 Republic County budget proposal. After reviewing department budget requests and the county general budget request, the proposed estimated tax rate for the 2016 Republic County budget will be 105.087 mills. This is a 3.689 mill decrease from the 2015 approved budget.

Kevin Calkins, courthouse custodian, presented a bid from Restoration and Waterproofing in Wichita for \$24,500 to paint the courthouse. The bid from Stockton Restoration was \$56,000.

Commissioner Holl made a motion to accept the bid from Restoration and Waterproofing to paint the courthouse of \$24,500. Commissioner Splichal seconded with Commissioner Bergstrom making it unanimous.

Dustin Zenger, Solid Waste Director, presented Memorandums of Agreement for solid waste fees; one between Republic County and the City of Scandia and the other between Republic County and the city of Belleville.

Zenger presented an agreement between Republic County and Dan Beneda to swath and bale the grass around the landfill for five years ending 2020.

Mayor Jimmie Blecha from Munden, Mayor Nathan Svoboda from Narka, Mayor Randy Thayer from Republic, Mayor Joe Chizek-Cuba, Neil Lewis, Belleville City Manager and Mike Johnson representing Republic joined the commissioners to discuss the recycling program. In August 2014, Commissioners and officials from each city in Republic County agreed that recycle trailers would be moved from each city to the recycling center. Recently, spokesmen from several cities have notified Commissioners about inadequate funds from recycling, and the lack of volunteers and vehicles to move the recycle trailer.

Commissioner Holl is a recycle advocate and is reluctant to end the program due to difficulties incurred by the cities. Zenger agreed to work out a schedule with the county solid works coordinator to move the trailer to the recycle center once a month and then move the trailer to the next city scheduled. A schedule will be sent to each city and an announcement will be sent to the local radio station

Danielle White, Health Department Administrator, requested permission to travel for Linda Wendt, Lori Kuhlmann and Sue Swanson to attend the Kansas Immunization Program Regional meeting in Salina on July 21. Permission was granted.

White stated that both the State Women, Infants and Children and Home Health Inspections were completed. Inspection reports will be received in a few weeks. White stated that the department was prepared for the inspections and does not anticipate any infractions.

At 11:50 a.m., Commissioner Holl requested an executive session for 10 minutes to discuss non-elected personnel with the Board, White and Clerk Marsicek. Commissioner Bergstrom seconded with Splichal making it unanimous. Sheriff Ron Blad stated that he has interviewed candidates for the deputy sheriff position but has made no offer at this time.

Dustin Zenger, Road and Bridge Administrator, presented his weekly updates.

- Zenger presented for signature a solid waste fees agreement between Republic County and the City of Agenda.
- Zenger presented three quotes for extra heavy duty mowers including trade-in of an existing mower.
 - Sellers Equipment (Shulte Mower) \$940.00
 - o Concordia Tractor Inc. (John Deere Mower)- \$5,097.40
 - C&W Farm Supply (Land Pride Mower)- \$3,000.00 (Model 56-\$2,000 and Model 66 \$3,000)

Commissioner Splichal made a motion to accept the bid from Sellers Equipment for \$940.00. Commissioner Bergstrom seconded and Commissioner Holl made it unanimous.

- Zenger reported that he is still researching new dump trucks. Zenger suggested the county should purchase new trucks with warrantees instead of used trucks without warrantees.
- Employees at road and bridge are allowed \$150.00 per year for steel toed boots. Zenger asked if that \$150.00 could be applied to muck boots. The board agreed to allow the purchase of either steel boots or muck boots not to exceed \$150.00 yearly.
- Zenger stated that Republic County needs to purchase 2,000 tons of cold asphalt mix to meet the needs of the contract for 2015. Zenger is looking into trading out the remaining 2,000 tons of cold mix that was planned to be ordered for an overlay that would be performed by Hall Brothers. This would allow the county road crew to continue patching and sealing elsewhere. Zenger will attempt to solidify a price for the overlay work from Hall Brothers utilizing 500 tons of recycled millings already owned by the county. The Hall Brothers work would be a hot mix asphalt product ran through a laydown machine.

At 10:58 a.m., Commissioner Holl requested an executive session with the Board and Zenger to discuss non-elected personnel for 10 minutes. Commissioner Bergstrom seconded and Splichal made it unanimous. Commissioner Holl requested an additional 5 minutes seconded by Splichal and made unanimous by Bergstrom.

The Board reconvened at 11:13 a.m., taking no action.

Blaine Van Meter, Director of Emergency Medical Services (EMS), suggested a change in method of pay for persons on second out shift for the EMS department. Currently, employees are paid \$1.00 per hour to be on a second out list. That person will receive regular hourly rate if called to a first out position for a transfer or a 911 call while the current first out employees are covering a call. The consensus of the Board is to remove the \$1.00 per hour for second out effective August 23, 2015. Van Meter asked permission to purchase a time clock for the EMS department. With change in second out wages, the time clock should work well in the EMS Department. Van Meter will meet with Deputy Clerk Ball to purchase the time clock.

Van Meter will be starting EMS Instructors training classes this fall and will be certified in January to teach EMT classes. He will be offering classes in Republic County following the completion of certification.

The current EMT's have requested new uniform shirts. Van Meter suggested printed T-shirts but the Commissioner said T-shirts do not look professional. Commissioner Holl suggested polo shirts with embroidery or screen printing.

Van Meter informed the Board that Ambulance Unit #1, which is used for transfers, needs repairs. It is at Womack Sunshine in Concordia for an estimate of repairs.

Van Meter announced there would be a full scale drill on grain bin extraction held on September 19 in cooperation with Farmway Coop and Life Star Road and Rescue Unit from Concordia.

Rob Kasl, Patriot Group, reported that a trailer was ordered three weeks ago and when the trailer is delivered, flagpoles will be removed from the courthouse lawn on a regular basis. Many citizens appreciate the flags when flying. However, when there are empty flagpoles standing it takes away from the beauty of the Courthouse. Kasl announced the start up meeting for the hero's statue will be held on September 11th. Flyers will be circulated to invite interested persons to attend.

At 12:00 p.m., Commissioner Splichal made a motion to adjourn. Commissioner Holl seconded and Commissioner Bergstrom made it unanimous.

Accounts payable vouchers for \$444,829.91 were approved for payment.

Commissioner Holl and Commissioner Splichal plan to attend the Republic County Hospital Board meeting at noon today.

Clerk Marsicek stated that Rob Kasl of the Patriot Group reported that their new trailer would be ready September 4.

Permission to travel was granted for Kathy Zach to attend KHCA Annual conference in Lawrence on September 22 to 24.

Permission to travel was granted for Linda Wendt to attend a medical billing update meeting in Salina on September 1.

Commissioner Bergstrom suggested that each department head evaluate each permission to travel and determine whether it is a necessary requirement for grants, continuing education or to improve efficiency of that department. Our budget is fine but unnecessary trips can deplete our funds.

At 9:10 a.m., Commissioner Holl made a motion for a 10 minute executive session with the Board. Commissioner Bergstrom seconded and Commissioner Splichal made it unanimous.

The Board reconvened at 9:20 a.m., taking no action.

Mark Stenson, county resident, complained that his road needs gravel. When it rains or snows, only four wheel drive vehicles can get to his driveway. It has been a couple years since the road department has put any gravel on the road. It is a mail route and the mail man refuses to deliver if it is muddy. Stenson stated that there was discussion a couple years ago about replacing a box culvert with a drain tube on that road but the work has never been completed. Commissioner Holl will inform the road and bridge administrator, Dustin Zenger, of this matter. Zenger will then contact Stenson.

Blaine Van Meter sent word that ambulance Unit #1 is still not running and is at Womack Ford in Concordia for repairs.

Dustin Zenger, Road and Bridge Administrator, presented his weekly updates.

- Commissioner Holl informed Zenger of the road problems located near the Mark Stenson residence at 245 Elm Rd, Republic. Zenger will make an appointment to meet Stenson to discuss the necessary repairs to the road.
- Zenger explained that the road crew is patching the blacktop from Hwy K-148 near Norway going north to Fir Road. Commissioner Splichal made a motion to accept the minutes of the September 14, 2015 meeting. Commissioner Bergstrom seconded.

Accounts payable vouchers were approved for the amount of \$485,155.03.

Sheriff Ron Blad stated his concern regarding using time clocks in the sheriff's department. In an emergency situation, Blad wants his officers to concentrate on their job, not worrying about clocking in on their phones. Clerk Marsicek assured Sheriff Blad that the officers' job is more important than clocking in and explained there are ways to edit an employees' time with proper paperwork. When the officer is leaving their shift, the officer needs to fill out a missed punch form and the supervisor will be able to edit the officers' time.

Shannon Chambers from the Main Street Tabernacle Church Recovery Program requested a donation from Republic County to purchase 15 Big Book Program books for the recovery program. The cost of the books are \$9.50 plus handling. Commissioner Splichal made a motion to donate \$150.00 from the county's Drug and Alcohol Fund toward the purchase of 15 recovery books. Commissioner Bergstrom seconded the motion.

Clerk Marsicek presented for signing an agreement between Republic County and the Republic County hospital. The agreement states that the hospital will reimburse the county for wages and benefits for Jay Lewis for up to five hours of labor a week as a maintenance worker at Prairie Ridge Estate.

Neal Lewis, Belleville City Manager, presented updates on projects in the City of Belleville.

REPUBLIC COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS' MINUTES MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 28, 2015

The Republic County Commission met in regular session on Monday, September 28, 2015 at 8:30 a.m. Commissioners present were Linda Holl, Marvin Bergstrom and Edwin Splichal. County Clerk Kathleen Marsicek was present to record the minutes of the meeting.

Pastor Kathy Aeillo, Courtland/Scandia United Methodist Church, offered Morning Prayer.

Commissioner Splichal made a motion to accept the minutes of the September 21, 2015 meeting. Commissioner Bergstrom seconded.

Barry Porter, County Appraiser, announced that since Deb Eitzmann will be retiring January 2017, he will be advertising for an employee in the appraisers' office. Porter plans to hire her replacement this December so the new person may become familiar with the various department requirements scheduled throughout the year. The person hired will be responsible for field inspection along with data collecting and personal property evaluations.

Beth Ball, Deputy County Clerk noted that open enrollment for health insurance will be October 1 through October 31. Employees will have the choice of two State Employee Health Plans. Plan A deductibles are \$400 for and individual or \$800 for a family. Deductibles for Plan C are \$2,600 for an individual and \$5,500 for a family. Because Plan C is a high deductible plan, the state requires a Health Saving Account with contributions from both the county and the employee. Employee contributions are made from pre-tax income.

Ball has ordered a third time clock which will be installed by the end of October. The time clock for the courthouse will be located in the stairway outside of the dispatch office near the north entrance to the courthouse.

Permission to travel was granted for Clerk Marsicek to attend the Fall KAC/KCCEOA meeting in Wichita on November 4 and to attend a training for Effective Communication held in Hays on October 7.

Danielle White, Health Department Administrator, asked permission for Kathy Zach to teach a Home Health Certification course in Republic County. Zach would be paid her regular wages while instructing the course. The certification requires 20 hours of instruction, including home health, nutrition and compassion for death and the dying. The course would be available for a small registration fee to be determined later. Permission was granted for Zach to instruct the class.

Rob Kasl, Patriot Project, announced the trailer for the flag poles and flags is at the dealership and he plans to pick up the trailer on Friday, October 2. The Patriot Group has been donated the trailer to Republic County. Republic County will be responsible for the insurance and the Patriot Group will be responsible for the registration fee. A formal agreement between Republic County and the Patriot Project group will be presented at the October 5 commissioners meeting. Kasl has contacted Kelvin Blecha regarding to storage of the trailer on the fairgrounds.

There are 114 flag units completed, 22 units in process and 14 units to be added.

Kasl invited the commissioners to attend a meeting on October 7 at 2:00 p.m. at the Astra Bank. At this meeting, an endowment fund for the Patriot Project will be established for the upkeep of flags, flag poles and storage trailer.

Kasl asked permission to use the courthouse steps and lawn for the annual Veteran Day celebration on November 11. Permission was granted.

Permission to travel was granted for Danielle White to attend the following trainings:

- Hearing Screening Course Level 1 in Lawrence on October 19-20.
- Oasis Training in Abilene on October 21
- Vision Screening and Assessment in Salina on October 16

Permission to travel was granted for Susan Swanson to attend the 2015 Kansas Immunization Conference in Wichita on October 6-8.

Dustin Zenger, Road and Bridge Administrator, presented weekly updates:

- The Land Pride mower was delivered last week from C & W Farm Supply.
- A representative from FEMA will be here this week.
- The sealing of the road from Fir to HWY K 148 is complete.
- County employees are assisting the City of Belleville to seal several streets.
- Commissioner Bergstrom notified Zenger that there are several potholes on 30 Rd south of Courtland and on 50 Rd south of Kackley.
- The bridge on 280 Rd just north of Cuba will be completed this week.

At 10:20 a.m., Commissioner Holl requested an executive session for 10 minutes to discuss non-elected personal with the Board, Zenger and Clerk Marsicek. Commissioner Bergstrom seconded. Commissioner Splichal made it unanimous. Commissioner Holl requested an additional 5 minutes seconded by Bergstrom.

The Board reconvened at 10:35 a.m., taking no action.

At 10:40 a.m., Commissioner Holl requested an executive session for 5 minutes to discuss non-elected personal with the Board, Zenger and Clerk Marsicek. Commissioner Bergstrom seconded. Commissioner Splichal made it unanimous.

The Board reconvened at 10:45 a.m., taking no action.

Kay Shoemaker, Republic County Economic Development treasurer, requested signatures on a mortgage release for Jared O. Melton. Melton dba Mr. GoodCents has completely fulfilled his loan obligation to Republic County.

Cindy Coons, County Treasurer, explained that employees issuing motor vehicle tags are required to attend Kansas Department of Revenue (KDOR) MOVRS training. Coons also noted that on occasion the office is understaffed. Clerk Marsicek will allow Beth Ball assist in the Treasurer Office during those times. Permission was granted for Laura Joy and Beth Ball to attend the KDOR MOVRS training in Topeka on October 20 through 22.

Commissioner Holl made it unanimous.

REPUBLIC COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS' MINUTES MONDAY, OCTOBER 5, 2015

The Republic County Commission met in regular session on Monday, October 5, 2015 at 8:30 a.m. Commissioners present were Linda Holl, Marvin Bergstrom and Edwin Splichal. County Clerk Kathleen Marsicek was present to record the minutes of the meeting. Deb Hadachek from the Belleville Telescope monitored part of the meeting.

Pastor Rick Snodgrass, Belleville Assembly of God Church, offered Morning Prayer.

Commissioner Bergstrom made a motion to accept the minutes of the September 28, 2015 meeting. Commissioner Splichal seconded. Commissioner Holl made it unanimous.

Due to the increase of 5% in health insurance premium for Plan A for 2016, the Board asked Clerk Marsicek and Beth Ball, Deputy Clerk, to present options to reduce the amount of health insurance premiums. Options considered:

- County pay entire premium of Plan C and employee pay the difference if Plan A is chosen.
- Employee pay 10%, 15% or 20% of the health insurance.
- Employee pay \$50.00 per month.
- Remove dental coverage or employee pay for dental insurance premium.

Clerk Marsicek and Ball encouraged the commissioners to refrain from any changes other than offering the two plans outlined in Commissioners meeting September 28, 2015. Marsicek and Ball noted that many people want to work for Republic County because of the excellent health benefits totally paid by the county.

The consensus of the board is to fully fund the insurance premiums for 2016. Beginning January 2017, employees will assume partial payment of their health insurance premium.

Employees have asked about additional retirement programs. Ball informed the board that KPERS provide a 457 Investment program in which Republic County can enroll. Republic County is allowed to offer this investment program starting this year. The commissioners gave Ball permission to present the program during open enrollment for 2016 on October 14.

Commissioner Holl read a letter from Kansas Historical Society announcing the nomination of Woodland Place Stock Farm to be placed on the National Register of Historic Places and the Register of Historic Kansas Places.

Marlea James, County Attorney, requested commission signatures for an agreement between Republic County and the Patriot Group regarding the ownership of a storage trailer, flags and flag poles.

Kay Shoemaker, Republic County Economic Development (RCED) treasurer, invited the commissioners to join the RCED meeting Wednesday, October 7 at 6:30 p.m. at the Republic County Courthouse. One application for a loan has been received for review.

Permission was granted for Peggy Frint to attend the North Central District Register of Deeds & Treasurer meeting in Smith Center on October 6.

Tim Garman, Honorable Mayor of Courtland, updated the board on projects in Courtland and requested assistance from the county road crew to patch and seal a few streets. Commissioner Holl stated that Zenger would be informed of the assistance needed in Courtland. Garman noted that the concrete floors were poured for the new

restrooms in the park. Commissioner Splichal reminded Garman to apply for grant money through the Duclos Foundation. Applications are due by October 30.

Rob Kasl, Patriot Group, invited the commissioners to attend the endowment fund meeting on October 7, 2015 at 2:00 p.m. in the Astra Bank meeting room. Kasl presented information about a proposed eagle sculpture to be placed on the courthouse lawn. Freedoms Keeper, a sculpture by Peacock Studio, is estimated \$48,000 not including a base.

Dustin Zenger, Road and Bridge Administrator, presented his weekly updates:

- Zenger requested commission signatures on the agreement between Kansas Department of Transportation and Republic County authorizing the Federal Fund Exchange in the amount of \$91,243.26.
- Truck bids were received from Summit Trucking and Freightliner. Commissioners tabled their decision to accept any bid until Zenger has reviewed each bid.
- Ritchie Brothers auctioneers inspected the equipment for sale via auction and stated the equipment can be sold at the Odessa auction house.
- Zenger asked if CPR and First Aid Classes may be held for the road and bridge employees. EMS Director Blaine Van Meter will be contacted to set up a training schedule.
- Commissioner Holl noted that the Mayor Tim Garman, requested county help patching and sealing some streets in Courtland.

Raymond Raney, Emergency Preparedness Director, explained the annual voucher to maintain the 911 web portal. All expenses are paid through the 911 funds received from the State of Kansas 911. The Next Generation System currently in use is obsolete and needs replacing during 2016. The cost of the new regional system in included in the state wide improvement to 911.

Permission was granted for Raymond Raney and Colleen Alkire to attend the APCO Annual conference in Dodge City held October 11 through 14.

Clerk Marsicek requested commissioner signatures on an agreement between Republic County and Lindburg, Vogel, Pierce and Faris Charted for accounting services for three years.

Cindy Coons, County Treasurer, asked permission to purchase a printer for her office using treasurer technology funds. Permission was granted. Commissioner Holl noted that county equipment reserve funds may be used if needed.

At 12:00p.m., Commissioner Bergstrom made a motion to adjourn. Commissioner Splichal seconded. Commissioner Holl made it unanimous.

The Republic County Commission met in regular session on Monday, October 12, 2015 at 8:30 a.m. Commissioners present were Linda Holl, Marvin Bergstrom and Edwin Splichal. County Clerk Kathleen Marsicek was present to record the minutes of the meeting. Deb Hadachek from the Belleville Telescope monitored part of the meeting.

Lay Pastor Kathleen Marsicek, Little Blue River Parish, offered Morning Prayer.

Commissioner Splichal made a motion to accept the minutes of the October 5, 2015 meeting. Commissioner Bergstrom seconded. Commissioner Holl made it unanimous.

Accounts payable vouchers were approved for \$314,250.69.

Clerk Marsicek presented Resolution 2015-34 authorizing a Deferred Compensation plan for the employees of Republic County through KPERS 457. Commissioner Bergstrom made a motion to approve Resolution 2015-34. Commissioner Splichal seconded. Commissioner Holl made it unanimous.

Clerk Marsicek presented a letter from the Kansas Department of Revenue stating that Republic County has successfully achieved substantial compliance regarding the appraisal cycle of taxpayer fairness when appraising properties.

Luke Mahin from Republic County Economic Development and Barry Porter, County appraiser, announced the contract to offer the Neighborhood Revitalization Program (NRP) for Republic County will expire December 31, 2015. Porter explained that 72 applications were received in the last five years. Mahin asked permission to submit the renewal contract for an additional five years. The Board granted Mahin permission to proceed with renewal of NRP.

Kay Shoemaker, Republic County Development (RCD) Treasurer and Mike Hadachek RCD member, presented a loan application from Central Plains Respiratory & Medical, LLC for \$33,400. Commissioner Splichal made a motion to approve the RCD loan to Central Plains Respiratory & Medical, LLC. Commissioner Holl seconded and Commissioner Bergstrom made it unanimous.

Shoemaker noted that Belleville Chiropractic received their final draft of \$4,300. Shoemaker also presented a release of Life Insurance for collateral on the loan to Jerad Melton.

Blaine Van Meter, EMS Director, presented permission to travel requests for seven EMS employees to attend "EMS for Children" training held October 24 in Concordia, Kansas. Permission was granted.

At 9:40 a.m., Commissioner Bergstrom left the meeting.

Dustin Zenger, Road and Bridge Administrator, presented his weekly updates:

- Zenger presented truck quotes for final approval.
 - Truck Center Company Western Star w/ Crysteel body and snow plow \$153,939.00
 - o Truck Center Company Freightliner w/ Crysteel body and snow plow \$147,744.00.
 - Summit Truck Company Volvo Allison w/ Crysteel body and snow plow \$152,609.00
 - Summit Truck Company International w/ Crysteel body and snow plow \$146,692.00
 - Summit Truck Company Mac w/ Crysteel body and snow plow \$163,101.00
 - Summit Truck Company Volvo IShift w/ Crysteel body and snow plow \$144,531.00
 - Summit Truck Company Mac w/MDrive & Crysteel body and snow plow \$152,150.00
- All bids include a five year 200,000 mile warrantee.

Commissioner Holl made a motion to accept the bid from Summit Truck Company for the International w/Crysteel body and snow plow for \$146,692.00. Commissioner Splichal seconded.

- Commissioner Splichal requested that Zenger inspect 170 Rd for needed repairs.
- Discussion regarding the repair or removal of the driveway along the side and back of the Medical Arts Building concluded with Commissioner Holl stating she will discuss the options with the doctors at that facility.
- Commissioner Holl requested that Zenger research the fuel prices charged at the fuel center. The price per gallon on the vouchers this week were considerably higher than local businesses that must charge tax. Zenger will review the prices. Zenger stated the next load of diesel fuel will contain winter grade additive but the non-leaded fuel should not be effected.

At 10:15 a.m., Commissioner Holl requested an executive session for 10 minutes with the Board, Zenger and Clerk Marsicek to discuss non-elected personnel. Commissioner Splichal seconded.

The Board reconvened at 10:25 a.m. taking no action.

Beth Ball, Deputy Clerk presented concerns pertaining to health insurance open enrollment for 2016 and shared comments from a department head meeting last week. Employees asked if it would benefit the county if Plan C were chosen for 2016. Ball stated that it would, but also noted that employee would pay a higher deductible. The question is, why should an employee choose Plan C?

It was suggested that since the County is paying the full premium for Plan A, why not either supplement funding in an H.S.A. to offset the higher deductible or pay the \$50 portion of the H.S.A. for an employee selecting Plan C.

Ball presented a chart showing a scenario with the county paying the employee portion of \$50 and an additional \$50 per month for 2016 resulting in a lower premium than Plan A. The county portion of each H.S.A. to be paid along with the employee share from the employee benefits budget nets a cost saving to the county. Since mandatory rates for each employee is the same, the premium to upgrade to Plan A increases with each grouping, Ball suggested that a different amount be offered to each group for 2016 only.

- Single plan \$100
- Employee/spouse \$100
- Employee/child \$100
- Family \$200

Commissioner Holl made a motion to contribute the employee share of \$50 with an additional \$50 per month for each single, employee/spouse and employee/child plan and an additional \$150 per month each family plan within the Plan C for 2016 only. Commissioner Splichal seconded.

Dusty Zenger called to report the reason the fuel prices were high is that the bulk fuel was purchased at a higher price. Then the gas prices dropped at local pumps. The county purchases fuel at a set price and must charge that to recover the cost. There are times when fuel is purchased at a lower price and gas prices rise. The fuel charge is set at purchase price.

At 12:00 p.m., Commissioner Splichal made a motion to adjourn. Commissioner Holl seconded.

Lay Pastor Kathleen Marsicek, Little Blue River Parish, offered Morning Prayer.

Commissioner Splichal made a motion to accept the minutes of the October 12, 2015 meeting. Commissioner Bergstrom seconded. Commissioner Holl made it unanimous.

Candace Fielder, County Attorney secretary, was asked to join the meeting in the absence of the County Attorney, Marlea James. Commissioner Holl asked Fielder to convey a message to James to proceed with the road closure on 290 Road between Granite and Hickory.

Commissioners requested that Cindy Coons, County Treasurer, initiate the 2015 delinquent property tax sale. Coon said that 57 properties are delinquent for a total of \$66,901.15.

Rob Kasl, Patriot Group, apologized for missing the October 12 meeting. Kasl stated that the trailer for storage of the flags and flag poles was delivered to Republic County. He invited the commissioners to attend the Patriot Group meeting on October 20 at the Lutheran Church at 7:00 p.m.

J.E. Chizek Honorable Mayor of Cuba stated that 85% of the new water lines are installed and noted that 10 loads of concrete and rock mixture are available for the county. Chizek also noted that the City of Cuba is planning other repairs but funds are low. Commissioner Splichal encouraged Chizek to apply for the Duclos grants for the Cuba projects. Grant applications are due October 30.

Dustin Zenger, Road and Bridge Administrator, presented his weekly updates:

- Zenger presented a Request for Bids for construction of the Republic County Off System 16-F.5 Bridge Replacement to be sent to the Belleville Telescope for publication.
- Commissioner Holl stated that she discussed removal of the driveway on the east side of the Medical
 Arts Building with the doctors who practice in the building and received no objections. Commissioner
 Splichal made a motion to remove the concrete driveway on the east side of the Medical Arts building.
 Commissioner Holl seconded. Commissioner Bergstrom made it unanimous.
- Zenger shared information transportation of citizens system to transport citizens outside of Republic
 County for medical appointments and shopping. The North Central Kansas (NCK) transportation system
 is considering a fulltime employee to schedule a route which includes Republic County. The Republic
 County share would be \$1,166 per year. Zenger will research the feasibility of this service for Republic
 County.
- To upgrade the graders, Zenger proposed trading an older grader for a newer model with less hours, as opposed to buying a new grader. Estimated savings is \$50,000. The commissioners requested quotes for both new and used graders before making any decisions.
- As approved by the commissioners, a new truck has been ordered. Delivery is estimated to be three to four months.

Peggy Frint, Register of Deeds, requested permission to purchase a computer and a network attached storage device to store Republic County documents. The deeds office is scanning all record books for improved research and preservation of these historical documents. Commissioners granted permission to purchase a system after bids are obtained.

At 12:00 p.m., Commissioner Bergstrom made a motion to adjourn. Commissioner Holl seconded. Commissioner Splichal made it unanimous.

Commissioners toured the law library to survey water damage to the wall and floor. Several book shelf bases were damaged. At 9:35 a.m., County Appraiser Barry Porter requested an executive session with the board to discuss non-elected personnel for 15 minutes. Commissioner Splichal joined the session at 9:45 a.m. Commissioner Holl requested an additional 10 minutes, seconded by Commissioner Splichal.

The Board reconvened at 10:00 a.m., taking no action.

The Republic County Commission met in regular session on Monday, November 2, 2015 at 8:30 a.m. Commissioners present were Linda Holl, Marvin Bergstrom and Edwin Splichal. County Clerk Kathleen Marsicek was present to record the minutes of the meeting. Deb Hadachek from the Belleville Telescope monitored part of the meeting.

Pastor Bruce Burfield, First Baptist Church of Belleville, offered Morning Prayer.

Commissioner Bergstrom made a motion to accept the minutes of the October 26, 2015 meeting. Commissioner Splichal seconded. Commissioner Holl made it unanimous.

Commissioner Holl asked the proper procedure for a person to file a complaint regarding an elected official. Clerk Marsicek suggested the person contact the State General Attorney office and file the complaint with the Ethics Board.

Clerk Marsicek announced that health insurance open enrollment is completed for 2016 and that 46% of Republic County employees chose Blue Cross Blue Shield Plan C.

Marsicek noted that 2016 Pay Period dates must be certified to KPERS by December 1, 2015. She also requested a review of employee pay periods and noted that, with time clocks fully implemented, preparation of paychecks is no longer labor intensive. Commissioner Splichal made a motion to make pay periods bimonthly with paychecks issued on the 15th and 30th of each month beginning January 1, 2016.

Deb Hadachek, Republic County Hospital representative, announced the hospital is proposing a special ballot question which would be added to the Primary ballot in August. Hadachek does not have specific details at this time.

Jimmie Blecha, Honorable Mayor of Munden reported:

- The recycling trailer fills quickly and requests dumping the trailer every three weeks
- Questions if Republic County is receiving the money from the recycling center?
- Expressed his support of yearly delinquent tax sales, noting that several properties in Munden appear to be abandoned.
- There are plans for two new houses to be built in Munden, one this fall and one next spring.
- The water tower was painted.
- Numerous reservations for use of the new city hall forced postponing completion of work on two walls until
 next spring.

Dustin Zenger, Road and Bridge Administrator, presented his weekly updates:

 Zenger presented an Award Contract from Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) for Project Number: 79C-4618-01, awarding the contract to Bridges Inc. to construct the bridge over the Republican River located near Republic, Kansas. There were five bids submitted to KDOT.

- Zenger attended a Central Transportation District (CTD) meeting in Salina to gather more information about the medical mobility bussing program. CTD will be hiring a fulltime mobility manager to schedule pickup and delivery of persons needing transport to Salina for medical treatment. The drawback is the need transport the people to and from Concordia to use the bus. The estimated cost to belong to the CTD mobility program is \$1,100 for the first year.
 - Commissioner Holl questioned enough use of this service to offset cost and noted that Republic County transportation personnel would need to be on call daily for trips to Concordia. Currently, there are two part-time drivers budgeted for local transportation only. Consensus of the Board is to opt out of the CTD mobile program at this time.
 - Commissioner Holl further questioned if opting out of the CTD mobile program would jeapordize purchase of a new bus scheduled for delivery next spring. Zenger assured the commissioner that the bus for local use is still on schedule.
- Commissioner Holl requested that Zenger evaluate the options of picking up the recycle trailer from Narka every three weeks or adding an additional trailer for the overflow of cardboard and plastic.
- Commissioner Splichal revisited the need to close the driveway at the Medical Arts building and requested that some of the larger pieces of concrete be removed even though barricades are in place.
- Commissioner Splichal asked Zenger to research the recycling of old paint. Several citizens have asked if the county can recycle or dispose of old paint.

Several department heads have suggested that the Courthouse close all day on Christmas Eve to accommodate employees travelling for Christmas. Consensus of the Board is to remain open until 11:30 a.m., however, only one person need be in each office. All other employees may use a half day of vacation.

Judge Starla Nelson asked for follow up information regarding the damage to the law library from the water leak. Commissioner Holl informed Judge Nelson that painting will be scheduled and then new carpet will be ordered when painting is done.

Kay Shoemaker and Mike Hadachek for Republic County Development (RCD) presented loan papers to be signed by loan applicant Deanne Morris. Morris received two loans; one from E-Community funds for \$45,000 and one from Republic County\$33,400 for a total of \$78,400.

Shoemaker announced there would be an RCD meeting on November 4 to review a loan application.

- Jesse inquired about the repair of Bridge 16-V.9. This bridge is on the only access to Jeardoe's residence and has needed repairs for some time. Zenger stated plans are to start working on Bridge 16-V.9 in the next couple of weeks. A shoofly must be built around the bridge and power lines moved before construction can begin.
- 3. Road closure of 290 Road between Hickory and Granite.
 - Tony Strnad owns the land on the east side of 290 Road and Cheryl Strnad Runft (Tony's mother) owns the land on the west side of the 290 Road. Tony requested that the road be closed so he can increase farm acreage by farming over the road.
 - O Jerry Strnad and David Strnad stated that they use 290 Road to access fields located on King Road because the bridge is out on King Road between 280 Road and 290 Road. Large farm equipment and semi-tractor/trailers require wide intersections. Currently Jerry & David use the intersection at 290 Road and Granite which is wider than the intersection at 290 Road and Hickory. In addition to the narrow intersection, use of Hickory Road requires taking equipment over a bridge and along several overhanging trees.
 - Zenger asked if the alternate route would work if the intersection is widened, additional culverts installed and the overhanging trees trimmed back. Jerry and David agreed it could become passable.
